MOMENT'S REFLECTION

Ask me to describe **Ash Wednesday**, and I'd say simply, its something new, something old. Relatively new to us Protestants. Something ancient to the Church.

"Return to me with your heart" -Joel 2:12



Ask any Roman Catholic. Members of the Catholic church grew up hearing the words on Ash Wednesday as they received a sign of the cross in ashes on their foreheads: "For dust you are and to dust you will return." (Genesis 3:19).

Protestants of my generation likely didn't grow up attending such services.

Yet, in recent years, we Protestants have increasingly turned to the rituals of the Ash Wednesday service as one way to increase spiritual awareness, and as devotional preparation for Easter Sunday (April 21).

Daniel Dunlap, liturgy expert from Houston Graduate School of Theology explains: "There is a trend ... toward more sacramental forms and it is not surprising to see the recovery of imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday." Church history teaches, the rite was generally abandoned by Protestants after the Reformation (circa 1600's). It was thought to be too ritualistically high church, too pretentious. On Ash Wednesday, we reclaim some of the Church's ancient tradition.



To make the typically somber, spiritual introspective, service more palatable, we begin the night with a meal of pre-Lenten levity. With a touch of Mardi Gras-ian festiveness, we prepare for the long, arduous, penitential 40-day season of Lenten sacrifice, by gathering in the Fellowship Hall for a **Pancake Supper**.

Though the pancakes of **Fat Tuesday** are typically celebrated the day before Lent, we join the two in one great evening. At Fat Tuesday Pancake Supper (aka, Shrove Tuesday), we indulge in a meal of good food before going to the Sanctuary to receive an invitation to penitential sacrifice. You might think of this way: The pancakes of Fat Tuesday are like having desert before sitting down to a bowl of spiritual broccoli. We enjoy ourselves a little before engaging the harder, more disciplined work of Lent.

Sunday School Lessons

CYF/Chi Rho

For Sunday School lessons for CYF/Chi Rho we are learning are going over Christian Action: Social Issues. We will be learning what the Bible, Theologians, and others have to say about our Christian responsibility in approaching social issues. As followers of Jesus Christ we all need to understand the importance of helping those that are in need and those who are oppressed. Social justice was very important to Jesus. Through actions such as healing, feeding, and preaching against the powers that be Jesus fought for justice and it was integral to his ministry. As followers of Jesus, we need to emulate his actions or, better yet, pick up our cross and follow him. We expect to cover a multitude of topics such as immigration, race, poverty, gender dynamics, and other issues in today's society. We have almost finished discussing immigration and will finish discussion in the coming weeks. After this discussion we will move to discussing race.
