2019 Mission Trip Was Awesome!

Monday, the 24th of June, our youth group journeyed to Springfield, Missouri to partner with a Disciples of Christ based mission organization called Disciples Summer Mission (DSM). DSM is an organization founded in 2011 to help Disciples churches come together and participate in mission work together with other Disciples churches. This year there were around 15 or so churches from 4 different states participating with us. Of all those churches we were put into a group of three, us and two other churches, to do our assigned work for the week. The other two churches were FCC Rowlett and FCC Granbury. With these two churches, we were tasked with helping three different organizations (1 per day).

For our first day, we were blessed to work for the Diaper Bank of the Ozarks. The Diaper Bank is a wonderful organization that distributes diapers to needy families and to nonprofits that help families and children. We saran-wrapped packs of diapers so that they could be distributed to local nonprofits that require them.

On day two, we worked for the Drew Lewis Foundation. The Drew Lewis Foundation focuses on asset-based



urban development to realize a community's full potential. We helped with their community garden and helped with landscaping of the properties they own.

The third day was truly a blessing for all that were involved. On this day, we partnered with a community called Eden Village. Eden Village is a living community filled with tiny homes for people who have experienced homelessness. They are not transition homes for the homeless; they are permanent homes if chosen by the person living there. The only requirement for a person to live there is that

they must have been on the streets for at least a year in total time. When it comes to the house and living there, it is not just a "handout" or free place to stay: it's paid for by the resident of the home. While living in Eden Village, an agreement is made between the Gathering Tree (the main office) and the renter of the tiny home. A percentage of income from the resident is used for rent and bills. This community was definitely something that wowed the youth and they learned a lot from their time there. We worked on leveling ground, staining fences, planting trees and flowers, mowing, and picking up rocks from properties.


We also had a ton of fun! Everyday at around 5:00pm we would worship with the other churches and sing our hearts out. Worship was always a blast because we got to worship with other Disciples youth and learn some catchy new songs. Another fun thing was our evening activities. DSM planned two of our three evening activities, which were Tuesday and Thursday night. On Tuesday, we went to Alamo Drafthouse, which is a movie theater that serves meals. There they divided us into big groups and we watched Harry Potter. Wednesday night was night that all of the adults from FCC Granbury, Garland, and Rowlett all came up with together for our free night. We started out our evening at Lambert's Café, the Home of the Throwed Roll (yes, they threw rolls at us). The food was delicious and the company was wonderful. Then, we ended our night at the Bass Pro Shop and Andy's Custard for dessert. Thursday, we ended our time at DSM in Springfield with a minor league baseball game: the Springfield Cardinals vs. the Northwestern Arkansas Naturals.

Overall, the mission trip was huge success and loads of fun. We learned a lot and did a huge amount of good work for the communities in Springfield, Missouri. These youth are so awesome and they truly represented Christ well on this trip through their words and deeds. Please encourage them to keep up the work of Jesus and please ask them about how the mission trip went. They all have fantastic stories and wonderful experiences to share.
