FALL SUNDAY SCHOOL SERIES SPECIAL, BEGINNING OCTOBER 27



I'm pleased to announce that Rev. Dr. Doug Skinner, newest member of our congregation, will present a 4-week combined Sunday School series beginning October 27 and running to November 17. Doug is the finest Bible scholar I know. I'm pleased to have him as my brother-in-law. I'm equally pleased for how eloquently, and thoughtfully, he presents and practices the Christian faith. Please join Dr. Doug in the sanctuary, 10:15 a.m., beginning Sunday, October 27. I promise you will be both affirmed and challenged in your Christian faith.

“What it Means to be a Disciple of Christ” - Big “D” Disciples and little “d” disciples

Alexander Campbell thought that we should be called “Disciples” because it was the original and primary name in the New Testament for the followers of Jesus Christ, and because he said that it was the one that was most descriptive of what it means to actually be a follower of Jesus Christ. The name of our church on the sign out front is meant to send us to the pages of the New Testament to understand who it is that we are and what it is that we are supposed to be about, and this is what we'll be doing for the next four Sunday mornings.

Session 1, October 27 – We Call Ourselves Disciples (Acts 11:26)

One of the first things to sort out after the merger of Barton Stone's “Christians” and Alexander Campbell's “Disciples” in 1832 was what the new church would be called. The contours of this debate reveal much about how we have understood what it means when we confess Jesus to be the Christ, the Son of the Living God, and our Lord and Savior.

Session 2, November 3 – Make Disciples (Matthew 28:18-20)

In 1837 a woman from Lunenburg, Virginia, wrote a letter to Alexander Campbell asking him to explain his understanding of how a person becomes a Christian. His answer is a helpful summary, not just of what it means to be a Christian, but of what the work of the church is in calling people to faith.

Session 3, November 10 -The Cost of Discipleship (Luke 9:23-27; 14:57-62; 14:25-35)

There is more to being a Christian than just finding peace because our sins are forgiven, and having hope because we believe that we are going to heaven when we die. Jesus was very clear about what was involved in following Him. His church has not always been as clear. There is more to being a Christian than going to church, reading the Bible, and avoiding serious sins.

Session 4, November 17 – The Means of Discipleship (Acts 2:37-42)

No book in the Bible has been more decisive for the life and faith of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) than has been the book of Acts, and few verses in the book of Acts have been more defining for our church's understanding of its work than has been Acts 2:42. If a disciple is someone who “believes in his heart that Jesus of Nazareth is the Messiah, the Son of God; repents of his sins, and obeys him in all things according to his measure of knowledge of his will,” then the work of the church is to actively nurture that discipleship, and Acts 2:42 names the four things that the early church did to do this.

Fish Fry Fundraiser October 20th

This event will be in celebration of the Ark Dedication ceremony also on October 20th after Coffee Fellowship. Funds raised will go toward the purchase of a new type of rubber mulch product for the Ark playground. Meal tickets will be \$5.00

per person or \$20.00 for a family over four members. Children can play on the Ark and adults can bring their lawn chairs to sit and visit while they eat. Tables will also be set up in the Fellowship Hall for those members who prefer to eat inside. Come and enjoy great food with friends and family. We are looking forward to seeing you there!

Our church's goal is to raise \$5300 to purchase premium, non-toxic rubber mulch to provide a child-safe playground cover for the Ark. Many of you have already written checks for playground mulch. Thank you!

As of this writing, the church has collected roughly \$500. A private donor has volunteered to contribute another \$1000. That means we still need roughly \$3800 to raise the necessary monies to purchase and install the new mulch.

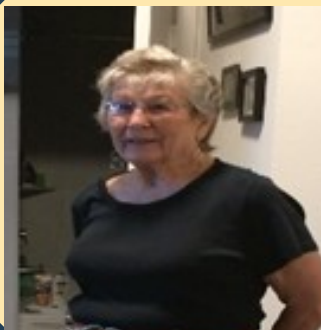

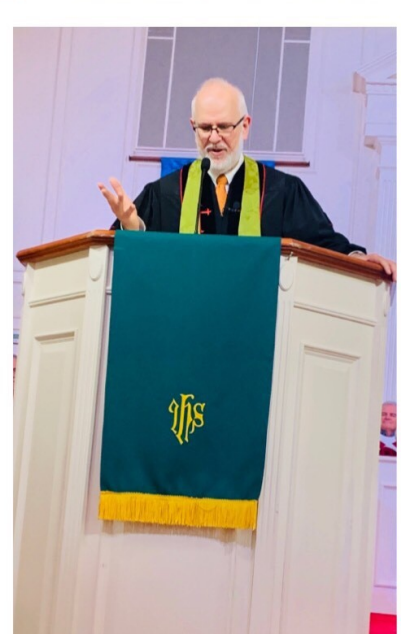
Consecration Sunday Potluck
