2021 Leadership Commissioning


“I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church” -Roman 16: 1

Paul ends his weighty letter to the Romans with a long list of “thanks yous” and greetings. Whatever work he has done in the name of Jesus Christ, he has done with the help of countless others. Phoebe. Prisca and Aquila. Epaenetus. Mary. Andronicus and Junia. Ampliatus. Urbanus. Stachys. Apelles. Aristobulus. Herodion. And the list continues. In all, Paul devotes 16 verses of the last chapter of arguably his most important letter to remembering names. And why? Why after having explicated matters of faith and justification, sin, and salvation, would a serious theologian of Paul’s stature do this? The answer is simple, really. Paul understood that he could never have accomplished the work he has, completed the mission journeys, established new congregations, preached, and disciplined so many first Christians had it not been for the help of so many good people.

We will announce the scholarship winner, and unveil a commissioned piece of artwork for the church by artist Mark Mullino.


Virtual Ash Wednesday Service



WHEN IS IT SAFE FOR ME TO RETURN TO CHURCH?

When determining whether to attend an in-person worship service, we understand it is a personal decision that each of us must make based on our comfort level. We understand that while everyone may not have the same level of comfort in returning to the building, some are comfortable and ready. Therefore, we will continue offering online services while we add in-person services.

Steve Sutton has provided the following guidance which we believe may be helpful to you in making your decision.

It is suggested to evaluate your health-status by:

- Communicating with your Primary Care Physician's office regarding your medical history and risk factors for high-risk illness associated with contracting COVID-19.
- Is it safe for you to risk herding and exposure to COVID-19 in public specific with your medical history?
- Do you have any of the following known high-risks for hospitalization associated with COVID-19?
