It's such a silly thing. Compared to all the truer matters of life and death, this can't possibly rank among a matter of any great consequence. David Letterman retired from the Late Show May 20th and I was so ridiculously sad that it embarrassed me. I told a good friend and he said, "Dan, seriously, you need to get a life." Yes. Probably.

I realize now that the ending of his show was a symbol of something else. David Letterman began his late night reign February 1, 1982. I was just a 24-year old then, not even a year into seminary. My adult career hadn't even yet begun. But through all the 33 years of his late night run, I finished

seminary, was ordained, took my first church, celebrated a first child, and then a second, moved here, moved there, celebrated Jenny's later-in-life graduation from college and the beginning of her teaching career, faced cancer in our family, fought cancer, sat at a hospital bed just a few blocks from the Ed Sullivan theatre and said goodbye to a son who had cancer, watched my young daughter grow up and leave home, graduate from college and come home with a guy she'd met. During all those years I passed from young adulthood, to middle age, to something a little north of that. I mean to say that David Letterman has been the constant comedic backdrop through all my adult life.

Obviously I don't know David Letterman. I only know the public persona. And I certainly don't hold him up as any paragon of virtue. His indiscretions are well publicized. But I resonated with his irreverent style of humor. Letterman never took serious people seriously, and there's a particular grace and wisdom in that, even if the serious people in life don't know that fun is being poked at them.

When he announced last fall that he was retiring in May, I planned to write him a letter. I wanted to tell him about the time our son was mute following brain surgery and the only thing he responded to was a David Letterman top ten list. Ten things you probably don't know about Mr. Peanut. His mother is half cashew. His first name is Keith. Silly stuff like that. But Zach laughed at it all, and that's how we knew he was still there with us.

I could tell you other stories like that—about how his humor played a healing role in my life. Not because he tried to be healing, but because laughter is the glue that holds all of life together. In this life there's plenty to contend with. It's through laughter that we learn to see beauty and experience hope, despite all the things with which we contend.

They'll have a new, younger, host next fall. I suspect I'll like him, too. But Letterman's retirement reminds me that time marches on. Nothing lasts forever. Faces change. Faces need to change. Institutions restructure. They have to change to remain vital. And the only way we learn to live well and long within this world of constant change is by learning to pray our goodbyes with thankfulness for what has been, and hope for what is yet to come. **–Dan**
