

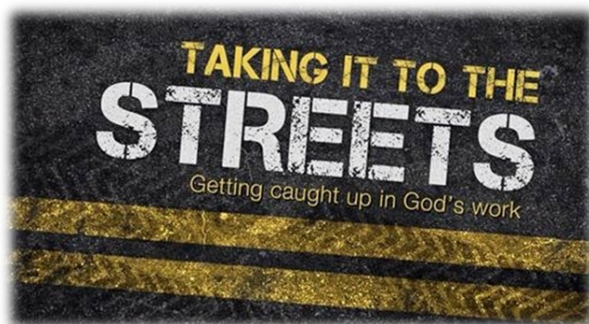
PROSPERING THE VISION; OUR MID-POINT

STAKEHOLDERS SUMMIT

We kicked off our Stakeholders Summit with our Financial update given by Finance Chairperson, Deacon Willie Jude, who asked the question - **How do you preserve the best of the old & embrace the best of the new?** With much thought and prayer. Progress on our restroom renovations are coming along smoothly and will be completed soon. We are also looking to update our phone & Internet to match our needs. Currently we are operating at 6 gigs which is extremely slow for the size of our edifice.

So we are looking to up our speed as well as consolidate our phone lines for the millennium. As far as our outstanding commitments; Hales plumbing has been paid 11k, of the 13k total installation cost and while the new organ was not a part of our 2017 budget, we were able to get a 3.4% loan! Praise God!

Was supposed to be 10 but ended up being 22% will be off in 3years

Nmsb we now owe 183k used to be 700k, drops by 4K every year

Our goal is to get this debt under 100 by the end of this year.

Our funeral policy with step by step guidelines and published fees for members and non members was introduced and is available on our website. Our wedding policy is being finalized and will be published soon.

Pastor Williams discussed the importance of our vision, and encouraged everyone to get on board and be involved. A few government officials have confirmed their attendance at our town hall June 17. Cleaning campaign a new attitude to take on. Working together we will become the epicenter of this community.

Evang Jackson prayed us out and we went to work doing spring cleaning around our church for a few hours.

What can I say, except, "WOW!" The energy, excitement, effectiveness of carrying out God's command of being witnesses for Jesus Christ as we, the church on the corner of Sherman and North Ave. transform this community through the working power of the Holy Spirit!!!"

Our first Saturday, April the 15th, approx. 45 strong took "IT" to the streets, North, South, East, and West. In our hands we had survey sheets asking our neighbors, "What do you think should be done to improve our communities? Do you think the church can do more, if so, what? and Will you join us for our Town Hall Meeting on Saturday, June 17th, from 9:30am - 12noon?"

Several responses to the survey were:

- 1) increased police patrol/bike patrol during the evening hours
- 2) the residents on 44th and 45th street would like to see speed bumps installed to slow down moving traffic due to children playing on the block
- 3) there are several drug houses that need immediate attention
- 4) in the park area, there should be closer attention paid to individuals engaged in criminal activities
- 5) we would appreciate if the church folks would just come out from time to time to let us know that they are still around
- 6) also in the park is a bullying issue with the bigger kids & the smaller ones
- 7) numerous requests for a massive clean-up in the area

These are just a few. The team Captains and Co-Captains are compiling the information. Some issues we are already in the process of addressing. Some of the others we are going to contact outside agencies to seek their co-operation to help.

We also left very important door hangers at residents where no contact was made with the church information and a special invitation to invite our neighbors to attend worship service and other church activities.

What was really impressive were the CBCGM Walkers who engaged with people at the bus stops, walking to work and to the store, standing around, etc. We took advantage of this opportunity to pray with numerous people and give encouraging words of hope in our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. There was no fear nor apprehension in spreading the good news.

I want to personally invite any CBCGM member that has not or may be considering to come out, to come on out and join forces with these awesome Captains, Rev. Tim, Rev. Mike, Deacon Melvin, Bro. Jesse, Sis. Imani, Co-Captains Willie Jude, Zoli, Wallace Phillips, Claude Williams, Patrick Greer, & Big Mac, who are on point in executing this Kingdom assignment.

They are either Valedictorians, Salutatorians, National Honor Society, Honor Society, 'A' Honor Roll (3.5 and above), 'B' Honor Roll (3.0 - 3.5), Principal's and Superintendent's Honor Roll students and/or top student in a particular subject area.

Community Service Awards: Recognize youth who go outside of home & church to help others.

Church Participation Recognition: These awards are for all youth members of CBCGM.

Scholastic Awards: These awards recognize those students who have been honored as Good Student, Student of the Week/Month, Citizenship Award, etc.

Perfect Attendance Awards: Recognizes attendance at school without any absences, excused or unexcused.

FIRST SUNDAY SERMON

On April 2, 2017 I preached a sermon titled, “A FAVORABLE ASSESSMENT” (1 Thessalonians Chapter 1). This sermon is the first in a series on Paul and Pastoral Ministry that will explore the challenges of pastoral ministry through Paul’s letters and apostolic experience.

INTRODUCTION. Human beings must engage in some form of work! While Genesis 3 states that labor is a result of The Fall, it also recognizes that some kind occupation is necessary for human life to function with meaning and purpose. There is no place for idleness or laziness in the biblical worldview - labor is a necessary and essential part of life. All honest work is honorable, even if we don’t like the job itself.

FIRST MOVE. 1 Thessalonians is considered Paul’s first letter.

- ◆ Not sure of the order (not dates given) but scholars are certain that 1 Thessalonians is first and Romans is the last of the so-called uncontested letters.
- ◆ In the Greco-Roman letter form, the first section is called the **salutation**. This is where we find the sender & addressee.
 - ◇ 1 Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace.
 - ◇ The senders are Paul, Silvanus (Silas) and Timothy. They are all the co-authors.
 - ◇ It is unfortunate that Paul was not able to send co-authored letters with his first co-laborer and evangelism partner, Barnabas.
 - ◇ Sometimes there can be tension when people labor together. Differences of opinion are normal but that should not necessitate fissure and fracture in team relations.
 - ◇ They send this correspondence to “the church of the Thessalonians [who are] *in* God the father and the Lord Jesus Christ.” What does it mean to be in God the father and the Lord Jesus Christ?
 - ◆ This simple phrase “in God and Jesus Christ” means that you have a **new relationship** with the divine on account of what Christ accomplished on the cross. Before you believed the gospel and were baptized, you were outside of God’s will and redemptive plan.
 - ◆ Ephesians puts it this way: “In those days you were living apart from Christ. You were excluded from citizenship among the people of Israel, and you did not know the covenant promises God had made to them. You lived in this world *without* God and *without* hope.” (Eph. 2:12)
 - ◆ It also represents a change of spiritual status - You are a part of God’s family.
 - ◇ Ephesians 2:19 comes to our aid again: “Therefore you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens of the saints and members of God’s household...”

Paul ends the salutation on another significant note. The Christ event has introduced a new era - an era of Grace & Peace.

- ◆ Peace was one of the promises of Rome - the *pax Romana* (“peace of Rome”). But political regimes peace always hides levels of inconsistency.
 - ◇ Peace for some and not for others
 - ◇ Peace promoted and sustained by violence
 - ◇ I become frightened when I hear politicians talk about “law and order”
 - ◇ Real peace cannot come from the outside in, it must come from the inside out
 - ◇ MLK noted that peace is not just the absence of violence but also the presence of good will (toward all)
 - ◇ God promises us that we can have peace in the midst of trouble
- ◆ Humankind was under the wrath of the law but are now under the dispensation of Grace. Grace is defined as “unmerited favor of God”. We did not do anything to deserve it. All we have to do is receive it through a relationship with God through Christ. This is why it pays to be “in God the father and the Lord Jesus Christ.”

SECOND MOVE. The second element of the Greco-Roman letter form is known as the Thanksgiving Paragraph. It is here that Paul and his co-authors make space to establish rapport with the addressees. This section is used for the sender to say something nice about the addressees; something to be thankful for. It can be tough if one has difficulty finding at least one thing to be thankful for in regards to someone else. There was only one Christian community for which Paul could not find one reason to be thankful to God; that was the Galatians. The letter to the Galatians is absent a thanksgiving paragraph, for to desert Christ for anything else is to be without thankfulness. This is not the case with the churches of Thessalonica; Paul has very much for which to be thankful.

- ◆ He says with profound sincerity and confident assurance: “We always give thanks to God for all of you...”
 - It is a blessing to feel so favorably disposed to someone or a group of people in this way. The very thought of them brings a sense of joy and thanksgiving. I often feel this way when I think of my parents. It gives me a profound sense of joy and thanksgiving when I think about how they raised my siblings and me and the sacrifices they made for the sake of their family.
- ◆ Paul & his co-authors are thankful for “all of [them]” & goes on to say - “and mention you in our prayers, constantly...”
- ◆ Why is Paul so thankful for them and remembers them before God and Father? **Why does he give them such a favorable assessment?** Is it the financial support they have provided for him? Have they leveraged some political influence to get him out of a particular bind when he was in trouble? No, it was the way they responded to the gospel message and bore witness to that faith with appropriate evidence. **He is thankful for their “work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.”**
 1. We know that having faith does not replace our doing good works. Works do not save us, but they are expected as evidence of our faith. The issue is not “works or faith” but “works of faith,” since “faith without works is dead” (James 2:20, 26). If “faith without works” is useless, then surely “faith with works” is useful!
 2. We must practice works of faith to be blessed. Our Savior expects us to become coworkers with him in the salvation of all humankind. Paul writes again in Ephesians, “For we are [God’s] workmanship, created *in Christ* Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them” (Ephesians 2:10).
 3. God wants us to stop doing bad works and begin doing good works—to quit practicing selfishness and start practicing godly love, and engage in works of faith. It is time to discern that, not only did Christ die to make it possible for us to have eternal life, but also to give us the opportunity to “live for righteousness” - that is, practicing that which produces fruit.
 4. A labor of love is an act that is voluntarily undertaken and performed without consideration of any benefit or reward. It is done because it is right to do. This is the essence of ministry!
 5. Finally, the Thessalonians were favorably assessed due to their steadfastness of hope in the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - ◆ Steadfast means, resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering.
 - ◆ The Thessalonians displayed *steadfast loyalty* to Christ:
 - ◆ faithful, committed, devoted, dedicated, dependable, reliable, steady, true, constant, staunch, solid, trusty, firm, determined, resolute, relentless, implacable, single-minded, unchanging, unwavering, unhesitating, unfaltering, unswerving, unyielding, unflinching, uncompromising
 - ◆ As 1 Corinthians 15:57-58 tells us, “But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. **58** Therefore, my beloved,[n] **be steadfast**, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.
 - ◆ This is the example that Jesus displayed for us to follow. He was faithful.
 - ◆ Subjective genitive - we are saved by “Faith in Christ”
 - ◆ Objective genitive - we are saved by the “Faithfulness of Christ”. It is his faithfulness to God’s plan that saves us!

Let’s follow the example of Christ so that we too can receive a favorable assessment of our “work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.”
