LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

We convened on Saturday, December 5 at 10:00am. Below is a summary:

- > At the start of the meeting we prayed and read scripture.
- > The minutes from the previous meeting were read.
- > The Following Ministry Reports were given:
 - Sis Bessie announced that the youth would be feeding the hungry on the following Saturday.
 - Min E announced the Senior Luncheon taking place on Saturday the 19th that will allow more seniors to attend due to the completion of our elevator!
- > Administrative Updates included:
 - The introduction of the 2016 Church Calendar. Corrections were to be submitted by December 14th. Any New Calendar Items such as a program, activity, event or fundraiser. Must be presented in writing at least <u>90 days</u> in advance and have Deacon Advisor Approval along with Pastor Approval.
 - The Opportunity For Involvement Booklet was also presented as a method of keeping everyone abreast of our many ministries, when they meet and who the contact person is. This will be a yearly publication available at the start of each year in addition to being handed out to our New Members to aid in them selecting an area of service.
 - Our 1st Leadership Retreat was announced, which will take place the 2nd weekend in January at the St lakovos Retreat Center. The purpose of this retreat is to leave any and all issues behind and press forward into the New Year with transformed hearts and a deeper commitment to serving.
 - In an effort to demonstrate our pillar of Church Unity, we were shown samples of branded clothing that included a light blue dress shirt, a brown jogging suit and a sand polo shirt. Because possibilities are beyond infinite when it comes to branded apparel, our plan is for the leaders to start off purchasing the polo shirt that will have our logo embroidered on it. We will then branch off to design other items in various colors and offer them for purchase to the entire congregation.

 - Pastor emphasized the importance of attending our Leadership Retreat. Changing culture is difficult and resistance is natural, but we can do better by laying aside attitudes in order to reach peak effectiveness. We were encouraged to read 3 John chapter 6.

TEN-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN: "PROSPERING THE VISION"

Our last meeting of 2015 took place on Tuesday, December 1st with a grand feast of holiday goodies contributed by the entire team. We had a guest speaker, Mr. Michael Beal of the National Association of Black Veterans, come to speak to us on the needs of veterans and how our church could help. There are so many groups that need help and it's critically important for us to weigh the pros and cons of each scenario. This will be one of our main charges for 2016. UNITY SUNDAY

The sermon text and title for UNITY Sunday was **"Longing for Peace"** (Psalm 72:1-7, 18-19). This was the second Sunday of Advent, theme of which is PEACE. Of all that was said in the sermon, my driving theme and point was that "peace must be made – it does not grow on trees like fruit." If we are going to have peace, it must be an intentional act and practice. Indeed, Jesus said that we must be "peace makers." This is one of the joyful realities of Advent announced by the angels –

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace, goodwill toward humankind."
