Coming Together for Transformation is a Comprehensive Campaign of King Avenue United Methodist Church

In December of 1889, a group of individuals came together on Henry street and formed a Sunday school on the second story of a bakery. Perhaps on that cold December day God the potter threw a lump of clay on the spinning wheel of life and began to form what today is known as King Avenue Church. Over 130 years later King Avenue continues to be shaped and transformed.

To nourish this transformation, the leadership of KAUMC, in consultation with numerous committees, architects, and funding professionals, has concluded that essential capital repairs and maintenance is

needed. These improvements will ensure KAUMC is able to serve more effectively our diverse and growing congregation and community, ensuring that KAUMC remains a vibrant hub that welcomes all people, and is a witness to the reconciling love of God.

The Coming Together for Transformation Comprehensive Campaign will facilitate the creation of new avenues of ministry and expand our missional footprint. **The total proposed goal of this campaign is \$2,000,000** over three years and includes initial funding for the staff required to launch and oversee expanded ministerial services.


Did you know?

The last significant changes to KAUMC occurred more than 12 years ago with the installation of the John-Paul Buzard Opus 36 Organ and the restoration of the bell tower.
