Ideas for Random Acts of Kindness to make a SPLASH:

- Send a note of encouragement to someone.
- Deliver fresh-baked cookies to a neighbor or coworker.
- Offer to baby-sit for free.
- Pay for someone's coffee or fast food meal behind you in line or in the drive-through.
- Give another driver your parking spot.
- Give a treat to the postman or delivery person.
- Bring flowers to someone.
- Leave a big tip for a waiter or waitress.
- Pay for someone's movie that is behind you in line
- Slip some cash to someone who you know is struggling financially.
- Pay for someone's meal or dessert at a restaurant.
- Leave a potted plant or flowers on someone's doorstep.
- Cook a meal for a neighbor or co-worker.
- Drive through an apartment complex on a Saturday, find someone moving out or in, and offer to help.
- Mow your neighbor's front lawn when they are out or help with yard work.
- ♦ Help someone struggling with their shopping.
- If you get exceptional service, ask the waiter to bring the manager over, and tell them both how wonderful the person was!
- Leave your unused or left-over gift cards for the next person in line.
- Leave quarters in the vending machine for the next person.
