

Getting Started What is something that you have had to say "sorry" for?	What does Colossians 2:13-14 say about our debt; about our condition because of that debt; and about what Jesus did with our debt?
Going Deeper—Read Matthew 6:12 We can't fully grasp the depth of what God has done for us and the depths of Gods love for us, until we grasp the lethality and abosulte evil of sin, and that we are "sinners."
