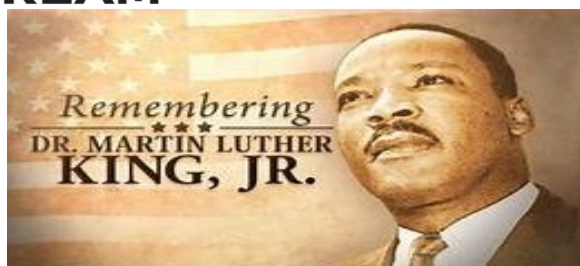

Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs)

The Small Business Administration (SBA) has reopened the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program to all small businesses affected by the coronavirus pandemic.

There are some specific things that may disqualify a business for EIDL eligibility. Applicants will be turned away if they: Are engaged in illegal activities; Derive revenue from sexual depictions or products; Derive more than a third of their annual revenue from gambling activities; Are in the business of lobbying; Are a government entity.

How to Apply for an EIDL

You'll need to [visit the SBA website](https://www.sba.gov) first and note what type of business you're operating. You then need to verify that you aren't disqualified for a loan based on the eligibility criteria above. Applicants must compile and enter basic information about their business, such as operating expenses, revenue, business names, contact information and employee information. You'll then note whether you'd like to receive a grant (when the program was open), along with listing your bank account details. The SBA typically takes 18 to 21 days to process the loan and then two to five days to disburse the funds.

- 5. Help us help you and your family feel safe, be safe, and still be able to function to the best of our ability during this season. Feel free to offer any other suggestion that will help us provide the safest and healthiest ministry worship experience for our members – Afresh!**
- 6. I feel like the children of Israel during the plagues. It was inconvenient, for a specific time, and God would get the glory! We are expecting the same. Thanks for your cooperation and understanding. See you sooner than later.**

Sierra Vista Clergy Response to Racism

We, Pastors and Faith-leaders of Sierra Vista and the surrounding area, want to express our condemnation of racism in all its forms.

The Christian faith is not silent on the subject of racism. In fact, the very first chapters of the Bible are foundational to the Christian understanding of human dignity.

“So God created man in his own image; he created him in the image of God; he created them male and female.” Gen 1:27. With this foundation, we can fully ascribe value to every human being. Theologians call this topic the *imago Dei*, the image of God. This image is like a reflection, a mirror if you will, reflecting God. Every human is made according to the image of God. As a result of this, every human has value, regardless of skin color, social or economic status. That is why Scripture expresses strong condemnation against racism.

The *imago Dei* proved instrumental in the civil rights movement of a previous generation. Historian Richard Wills provides evidence for this in his book, *Martin Luther King, Jr. and the Image of God*, when he says, “Martin Luther King Jr.’s use of *Imago Dei* language existed on the edge of a historical dialogue and quest for human civil rights . . .” Wills says that King’s understanding that humans are created in the Image of God and endowed with intrinsic worth was his “primary appeal for civil rights.”

Martin Luther King, Jr. famously said, ‘There are no gradations in the image of God. Every man from a treble white to a bass black is significant on God’s keyboard, precisely because every man is made in the image of God.’ We have an obligation to not stand silent when we see others abuse other image-bearers. In fact, we are called to do the opposite of silence, we are called to act. We are called to action in proclaiming the dignity of humankind. The sin of partiality or favoritism (James 2:9) is alive in many hearts today. “I give you a new command: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another.” (John 13:34). We are commanded to love, love God, and love our neighbor. Love is more than mere words. It is also action. We who sign this are committed to loving in both word and deed (1 John 1-18).

This sacrificial love was the driving force of Jesus’ life and ministry, and it still is today. Without it, we will never accomplish the work of reconciliation. We simply cannot do it without understanding that His love compels us to love our enemies. There’s an African proverb that we think expresses beautifully just how important this face-to-face kind of friendship is: “When I saw you from afar, I thought you were a monster. When you got closer, I thought you were just an animal. When you got even closer, I saw that you were a human, but when we were face to face I realized that you were my brother.” (Perkins, John M.. *One Blood* (p. 165). Moody Publishers.)

Now, more than ever, is the time to draw close. Join us in drawing close.

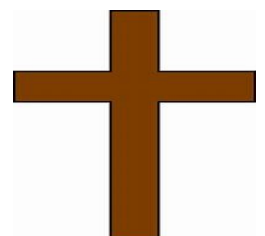
