# From My Open Door

Another school year is upon us. I've had a great summer- workcamp, boating, workcamp, grilling, workcamp, worshipping, workcamp... And I've had some down time- with my family, travelling, stained glass.... I've had time to work through a few projectsgutter cleaning, deck staining, garage organizing... All in all I've had a great summer!

For many, summer isn't much different than the rest of the year. Work continues. Parenting continues, responsibilities continue. And it's ever so easy to get discouraged, distracted and detoured from the responsibilities that God has placed upon us, even as we carry out many of them.

# FAMILY LIFE MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

September is likely the busiest month of the year for many of us. Kids go back to school; our summer schedules come to an abrupt end; and we see the beginning of a new season all around us. At Providence, it's become our policy to let folks catch their breath from September before kicking off a new season in October. FAMILY

Look for the following future events starting in October:

- <u>PPC Men's Retreat</u>: While Providence has sponsored women's retreats for years, we've finally organized a little men's getaway, this year! From Friday, October 21 through Sunday, October 23 we'll gather at a large home on the Outer Banks for a time of rest, relaxation and reflection. Over the course of our time together, we'll have three conversations based on a wonderful book called "*The Man Code*." We'll also enjoy an abundance of free time designed to allow us to simply take it easy!
- <u>Mission Matters Youth Group</u>: This group of middle & high school students will meet at 12:30 on the first Sunday of each month to focus on mission. The first meeting will be on October 2.
- <u>PPC Couple's Retreat</u>: For many PPC couples, this retreat may be the first time (in a long time) that we've been able to focus on our marriage and our faith. On the weekend of March 10, 2017, PPC couples have the opportunity to *officially* spend some time together. The retreat will take place at the Hampton Inn & Suites in Corolla, NC (about 90 minutes from the church). We'll gather on Friday evening after dinner for a time of fellowship. On Saturday morning, we'll have a discussion about how and why we initially got together. On Saturday afternoon, we'll talk a bit about the role that God should be playing in our relationships. On Sunday morning, we'll have a time of worship. During the rest of the weekend, couples are on their own to enjoy meals, have some undisturbed conversations, take a long walk, rest, relax or casually read a book.

If you have been thinking about singing in the choir, or trying your hand at ringing bells, but are "on the fence," allow me to share below some of the benefits of belonging to a church music ensemble. This is from one of Michael Kemp's sessions at the Virginia Wesleyan Sacred Music Conference which I attended this summer. Great food for thought!

Singing in the choir. . .

- 1. Is an easy way to make new friends and feel part of a group.
- 2. Is therapeutic; rehearsals become a time when singers can put aside, for a while at least, the other pressures and concerns of the day.
- 3. Provides musical memories that can take you momentarily out of difficult situations by calling to mind beautiful music and text.
- 4. Gives members a sense of pride and self-worth.
- 5. Instills beneficial posture and breathing techniques.
- 6. Helps develop better habits of good enunciation.
- 7. Reminds choir members that there are no short cuts to excellence.
- 8. Teaches historical perspective through music and texts written during various periods of history.
- 9. Reminds us of the positive impact a dedicated group can make beyond that which is possible for an individual.
- 10. Conveys that leadership, demeanor and good attitude make a significant contribution to the success of a group.
- 11. Serves as a ministry of the church by adding beauty and aesthetic depth to worship.
- 12. Provides an anchor for regular church participation in a time when secular attractions and pressures pull many away from church participation.

These benefits are real! Ask any choir member to tell you why they sing in choir, and you will perhaps hear even more reasons. See you in church! *Valetta*

# ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

#### .....

Patty L. Landrum had been a Presbyterian all her life. Her parents were instrumental in starting Coleman Place Presbyterian Church in Norfolk over 75 years ago and she attended there until it closed a few years back. She was led to attend Providence Presbyterian as she lived in Fairfield and it was convenient for her. She enjoyed her time here and became a member. As she told me, she enjoyed the fellowship she experienced and the pastor. Patty became known as the "Butterfly Lady" because of the gorgeous butterfly pins she would wear on the back of her shoulder. She was a sweet southern lady, always with a big smile. Little did we know what was to follow.

Providence Presbyterian Church has been truly blessed with the gift from The Patty L. Landrum Family Trust. It is obvious Patty took time to consider how she wanted her money to be used and felt the church would be the best source to ensure her wishes were honored.

To ensure all the members of the church understand the "Designated Label" attached to the funds being received from her estate, the following is the precise language used in the trust documents:

- 1. Eighty Percent (80%) shall be used to fund a College Educational Scholarship named the Butterfly Scholarship in memory of Patty L. Landrum. The terms of the scholarship shall be determined by the Church in its sole discretion.
- 2. Two and One-half Percent (2.5%) shall be used for the upkeep of the courtyard at the Church.
- 3. Five Percent (5%) shall be used for the mission Support for Families of Students attending Fairfield Elementary School.
- 4. Two and One-half Percent (2.5%) shall be used for the music programs at the Church.
- 5. Seven and One-half Percent (7.5%) shall be used for senior citizens who are in need as determined in the sole discretion of the Church.
- 6. Two and One-half Percent (2.5%) shall be used as part of the Church's discretionary fund.

As was stated from the pulpit, the estate money (with the exception of #6 above) is not available for day-to-day, week-to-week and month-to-month operations of the church. The weekly tithes and offerings keep the doors open and the church functioning.

In next month's newsletter, we will explain the function of the newly established Endowment Sub-Committee and how one may request funds from one or more of the Designated categories above.
