

"Panis Angelicus"

César Franck (1822-1890)

Dudley Crosland, tenor; Justin Stanley, violin

"Panis Angelicus" is the second-to-last section of the hymn "Sacris solemniis," which was written by Saint Thomas Aquinas in the 13th century. "Panis Angelicus" is Latin for "Bread of Angels" or "Angelic Bread." Franck's 1872 arrangement is the most famous. Like many of the composer's other works, it was a piece of sacred music used for liturgical purposes. Originally arranged for tenor, organ, harp, and cello, the music was later incorporated into Franck's "Messe à trois voix" (Mass for Three Voices).

Dat panis coelicus figuris terminum (The heavenly bread ends all symbols)
O res mirabilis! Manducat Dominum (O, miraculous thing! The body of the Lord will nourish)
