#### One Second in Time Annual Prayer Bowl—By M. Patterson

DECEMBER 31, 2013, nearing 5:30 p.m., the religious community began gathering at Fairview Baptist Church for what has become a New Year's Eve tradition, The Annual Prayer Bowl.

This service began 33 years ago, as a vision of Senior Pastor J. A. Reed, Jr. The Prayer Bowl was originally held on New Year's Day as an offset to sports bowls but was moved to New Year's Eve. Over the years the lineup of preachers may change but one thing is constant—the Fairview family and many of the community know that on December 31, they have a place to go where they can share with other Christians and await the time of hearing the man of God proclaim, "Happy New Year. We've made it over."

Each preacher in the 2013 lineup took his place, hour after hour. The theme was *"Preaching the Gospel* of Spring to Break Up the Winter of Sin." The last hour came and we were running ahead of schedule. The preacher that was up to bring in the New Year was new to Oklahoma and to the Prayer Bowl. Rev. J. Weldon Gilbert, Pastor of St. John's Baptist Church, Lawton, stood in for veteran Bowler Rev. Teron Gaddis. He fulfilled his assignment and did it well. When he ended his message on, "Let's Make Some Noise," most all in the house were on their feet. He preached the people crazy.

One thing that happened this year that has seldom, if ever, happened is that the last messager ended before midnight. We were still in 2013! Assistant Pastor D. E. Walter conducted the period of commitment. When Host and Senior Pastor Reed approached the pulpit, he announced that it was a few minutes shy of midnight. I began looking at my phone, tracking satellite time, hoping to see the time change to 12:00 midnight, to see the new year actually come in..... It was 11:58, 11:59.....and then, 12:01. I never saw what happened to 12:00 midnight!

As I looked to my fellow worshipper to say, "we made it," Pastor Reed announced to the congregation, "We made it over!" The whole house began shouting with voices, hands and hearts lifted to God in praise.

One minute, one second in time, our lives were made anew. As I reflected on the evening, I realized that one second had moved us from one minute to the next, one hour to the next, one year to a new year! God had given us another chance, another moment.

And so, Rev. Gilbert was brought forth and the waiting congregation received their blessing to go forth to begin a new year: "Now unto him who is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy, To the only wise God our Savior, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and forever. Amen."



#### IT HAPPENS AFTER PRAYER — "PRAYER MAKES THE DIFFERENCE" - By M. PATTERSON

For years you may have heard it spoken: "Prayer changes things." In his greetings to the congregation during the Annual Super Prayer Meeting held at Fairview on Wednesday night, January 8, Senior Pastor Reed enlightened us to the actuality that "Prayer changes people; people affects change."

During the month of January, the church's emphasis is on prayer. The Pastor began the year January 5 and January 12, preaching on "It Happens After Prayer—Part I" and It Happens After Prayer—Part II," respectively. Wednesday Bible Study and Sunday morning study groups is from the book, "It Happens After Prayer," by Rev. Dr. H. B. Charles, Jr., Pastor of Jacksonville, Florida.

Two major events were held this month:



The Super Prayer Meeting and The Prayer Seminar. The theme was "Prayer Makes the Difference!" Sister Patricia Reed, Prayer Coordinator, although not able to be in attendance, planned and directed both events. Pastor Reed dedicated Wednesday night's Super Prayer Meeting to Sister Reed.

Seasons of prayer were offered, followed by the evening message. Rev. Semaj Vanzant, Sr., and The Christ Experience Church joined with Fairview for the Super Prayer Meeting. Rev. Vanzant preached from Daniel 6:10-17; 22-23, "I'm Going to Talk to God."

Saturday's Prayer Seminar on January 11 continued the special emphasis. Speakers on the theme, Sister Taressa Gaines and Rev. Damascus Williams, shared their personal experiences on prayer and how it has made a difference in their lives. Rev. Williams spoke additionally on being "Imprisoned But Not Immobilized" from Jeremiah 33:3.

wholesome foods, which included fresh fruits, vegetables, meats and staples to supplement their monthly grocery needs.



Bring natural desires under control in the areas of healthy lifestyle, companionship and sexual discipline, work ethics and job performance, parenting, giving, avoiding reckless speaking, etc.

Set some goals. Establish a reading plan for the Bible or other spiritual materials. Work inside of God's will; cooperate with Him. Take care of your emotional health; consider journaling to express your emotions in a healthy way. Time is important



and should be used wisely. Make lists to prioritize and accomplish your goals.

Jesus was a disciplined person, so we should strive to be more like Him through daily Bible reading and prayer.

After the President's message, Sis Walter led the ladies in a powerful period of rededication to the song "Draw Me Nearer."

### The Pastor Speaks — "Living in the Power of the Spirit"

Our church theme for 2014 is "Living in the Power of the Spirit." The scriptural reference is Luke 24:49. All of our Bible study for this year will be centered around the person and work of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. He is first mentioned in the Bible in Genesis 1:2: "And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters."

Dr. Herschel H. Hobbs, long-time pastor of First Baptist Church, Oklahoma City, and former President of the Southern Baptist Convention, in his book *Fundamentals of Our Faith*, has pointed out that the Holy Spirit is the most neglected member of the Trinity. He says, "There are six reasons for this neglect.

(1) The doctrine of the Holy Spirit is difficult to understand. *"But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God."* 

*.... Neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned"* (I Corinthians 2:14).

(2) The Holy Spirit is placed third in the Trinity (Father, first; Son, second; Holy Spirit, third). That's why we unknowingly relegate Him to a place of unimportance. "....the Holy Spirit is the most neglected member of the Trinity."

(3)There is also a tendency to refer to the Holy Spirit as 'it'! To speak of a person as 'it' makes of him a nonentity.

(4)Emotional excesses of some tend to defame the Holy Spirit.

(5)There is a fear of sin against the Holy Spirit. For this reason, people avoid Him.

(6)The use in the King James Version of Holy Ghost is unfortunate. In A.D. 1611 ghost meant spirit; today it means the spirit of a dead person."

Dr. R. A. Torrey, in his book *The Holy Spirit*, said, "Anyone who does not know the Holy Sprit as a person has not attained unto a complete and well-rounded Christian experience."

It is imperative that the Fairview Family understand that the Holy Spirit is a person and that we know Him as a person. This year we will look at some reasons for believing that the Holy Spirit is a person. When the Holy Spirit deals with us, it is a personal power, not an impersonal influence or power.

God grant that this study will lead us into committing ourselves to follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit!

#### Fairview Baptist Church CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP SCHOOL Largest in Church's History - HUGE SUCCESS!

THE CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP SCHOOL (CLS) held at Fairview the week of October 9-12, 2013, was deemed as the largest in the church's history, according to 51-year veteran pastor, Dr. John A. Reed, Jr. The theme for the school was "Solidarity with the Savior through His Work," Matthew 5:15, John 10:32, Titus 2:14, and Hebrews 13:20-21. The school was approved and certified by the Sunday School Publishing Board (SSPB) of the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc. (NBC, USA, Inc.) and was opened to anyone interested in furthering their Christian Education or earning course credit toward certification through SSPB.

Classes were held nightly, Wednesday through Friday from 6-8 pm, and Saturday from 9am-12pm in Fairview's Donald Burns Educational Center and Fellowship Hall. The courses offered were taught by a very knowledgeable staff: *Introduction to the* New Testament/Rev. Lee Benson, Survey of Psalms/Sis Erma Coburn, Introduction to the Old Testament/Rev. Al Walter, New Members' Orientation / Bennie Surratt, Creative Ways of Teaching/ Sandra Holloway, *Eschatology*/Rev. Orlando Black, Becoming an Effective Deacon/Bob Simmons, Methods of Evangelism / Rev. Kenneth Sherrill and Rev. Cleo McGlory, Introduction to Discipleship/Carolyn Peters, Marriage and Family (The Church Ministry to Singles)/Rev. and Mrs. Derrick Walter, and *Ministry to the Bereaved*/ Rev. L. M. Woodberry. Delores Watley, Rev. and Mrs. Dedrick Marsh, Rev. Tim Jones, and Rev. Damascus Williams taught the Children and Youth Classes.

The school concluded with Pastor Reed lecturing on *Spiritual Leadership*. In his exposition, he stated, "As your pastor, I am interested in developing a climate wherein leaders can be trained and equipped to lead ministries in our church. It has become clear to me that if we are going to be a successful church, we need trained leaders." - Encourage participation in Bible

Study, Prayer Meeting, and Sunday School

- Be Faithful in your service to the church
- Encourage members of your ministry to nurture and use their individual Spiritual gifts
- Support and show love for your Pastor

The school closed with 152 in attendance; 100 adults received Course Cards, 2 adults received Certificates, 26 youths received Certificates, and 24 staff/instructors. Also, a SPECIAL THANKS to Sis. Willa Nero and her staff for preparing and serving meals each night, and to Peggy Westbrook and Havered Hill for their genuine support. The next Christian Leadership School (CLS) will be held, May 9-10, 2013.

## Felon Voting Rights

#### WHO CAN VOTE

- Convicted felon who has been pardoned
- • Felons who have served their time
- • Person with a Deferred Sentence
- Felon on parole serving a life sentence cannot vote unless pardoned

#### When a person may begin voting again:

Date of Conviction + Years sentenced	3/6/2003 <u>10</u>
Date eligible to vote	3/6/2013
Consecutive Convictions Date of Conviction + Years 1st Sentence + Years 2nd Sentence + Years 3rd Sentence	3/6/2003 4 3 5
Date eligible to vote	3/6/2015

*NOTE*: The Oklahoma State Election Board does not have a process to determine who is a felon. It is your responsibility to know when you are eligible to vote. If you register and vote before your original sentence is expired, you could face imprisonment for more than 5 years, a fine of no more than \$50,000.00 or both imprisonment and a fine. (See voter's registration card Oath 9)

#### Then vs NoW

Do you remember growing up how you always thought anything your parent(s) told you was old fashioned, of no value, just crazy??? After a few bumps along life's road, most of us finally decided that one or two of the things they tried to instill in us were probably pretty good ideas.

Darrell Simpson is no exception to this truth. Stepping back to a time when Darrell was a boy, he shared with me that he was fortunate to grow up in a loving, two-parent home with his other siblings. His father, now a retired drill sergeant, was a disciplined military man, and his mother, a God-fearing woman. But at the time, all that discipline, instruction and praying was just too old fashioned, not necessary, of no value and just crazy!

What was important was to impress his friends, run the streets, do drugs and party. Like most of us, Darrell worked to "fit in" with his "friends." Fitting in took Darrell down some roads that led his parents to say NOT MY SON, as they learned more and more about some of Darrell's "friends" and how he was fitting in. He was baptized as a young man at the Antioch Baptist Church in Muskogee. While he went to church on Sunday, he was skipping out of school and getting in trouble on Monday. For several years, his life was torn between two worlds. He wanted to know what God really wanted with him. Darrell could never get comfortable and content on the wrong road, but he didn't last long on the right road. **But that was then ....** 

Fast forwarding to a point in time when Darrell was confined at the Lexington Correctional Center, By now, God had gotten more of his attention and less of his rebellion. At Lexington, he grew in the Word and built a prayer life. When God gets you, the parts you thought were unnecessary are necessary. He began helping to coordinate church services inside the facility where he was a participant on God's program. Enter the Fairview Baptist Church and Rev. John Reed, Jr. During a visit to the facility in 2010, Pastor Reed made a lasting impression on Darrell telling him he wanted to be his pastor. While Pastor Reed didn't know it, Darrell was looking for a church home. Darrell united with Fairview before his release and followed Pastor Reed to Fairview when he got the opportunity.

**Now**, so many blessings have come to him and with him; a new career and a new wife and family and a new heart. He developed a strong career before his release, walked into a job and was blessed with reliable transportation. Now Darrell along with his lovely wife, Lashell, and their boys are hanging out with a new group; the Fairview family. Life is a process and he is still going through. But, today God has changed his focus and the desires of his heart.
