2014 "By the numbers"

Time and time again we attempt to express our gratitude for the sacrifices that those who support SowingRoots make. While we know that "thanks" doesn't begin to touch the surface of how we feel about all of you - we thought we'd share this brief recap that summarizes the impact you've all had in 2014:

- Gifted **24** grants to adopting parents
- Distributed \$32,250 in grant funds to aid in the adoption process
- Helped join **27** children with their new families
- Children were brought home from 6 countries: China, Ethiopia, Haiti, South Korea, Uganda and the United States
- Partnered with other local organizations to host a Christmas party and help bless 61 foster children in the Puget Sound area
- Provided 15 Christmas gifts to 15 local teen mothers who chose to place their children for adoption and receive mentoring services
- In conjunction with Orphan Outreach, provided gift items to grant Christmas to **1** Orphanage in Honduras the San Jose Orphanage
- Provided sponsorship for the Project 5:1 mentoring program/project that seeks to help get 5 adult mentors in the life of every child
- Strapped on our running shoes, partnered with Run for Christ to bring adoption awareness to the community, and ran a **5k** race

Nathaniel was orphaned as a young boy when both parents were tragically lost to illness in Ethiopia. For three years, he called an Ethiopian orphanage his home.



In 2012, at the age of 11, just one month after his adoption with his brother by the Healy family, Nathaniel was diagnosed with a very rare and high risk type of Leukemia. He moved directly into two years of high dose chemotherapy treatment, which successfully brought the cancer into remission.

Until Summer 2014.

Nathaniel's Leukemia returned with a vengeance -- and his treatment plan is a much-needed bone marrow transplant. Bone marrow transplants require a minimum of four months of inpatient treatment in Seattle.

Over these four months, Nathaniel needs his family to be present with him. However, being there for their son means the Healy's will face loss of income, increased insurance costs and other mounting expenses. Throughout the four month course of treatment, the cost to Nathaniel's family for his mother to be there full-time is \$200 *a day*.

On Sunday, Nov. 16th SowingRoots, along with the University Place community, rallied behind Nathaniel and his family and hosted a dinner & auction. The evening's motto was "Give Nathaniel a day" – a day with a parent or family member by his side throughout treatment knowing that many costs lay ahead.

The turnout of love and support that evening was incredible and enough funds were raised to grant Nathaniel nearly 140 days of his family by his side! Thank you to all who attended, donated and continue to pray for the long journey that lays ahead for Nathaniel and his family.

Grant updates

Third quarter 2014

We received 20 grant applications for our October 1st review. SowingRoots awarded 8 families with grants for a total of \$13,250. These 8 families represent 8 children from China and the U.S. We're excited to report that all adoptions outside the U.S. were for special needs children, a group that has historically been neglected even more so than others.

Thank you to our generous sponsors - without your support our vision to connect orphans with forever families would not be possible. Our grant applications have grown by over 200% this year alone! With an estimated 153 million orphans worldwide, the opportunity to meaningfully impact orphans seems daunting.
