Have you ever found yourself in a situation that left you desperate to change the circumstances? Such was the case for this young couple...

They couldn't tell her mom, she was so upset the first time this happened. They couldn't financially afford another child. They had no faith beliefs. They wanted an abortion because "neither of them was ready to raise another child". They had already made up their minds. There were no circumstances that would change their mind to have an abortion.

She said she had a little fear of not being able to have other children if she aborted this one but she wanted the abortion anyway. She thought adoption was a good idea but didn't fully trust the adoption process. She said already being a parent was great but it was also stressful at times. She wanted the abortion pill.

We advised her in case the pill didn't completely abort the baby, she would still have to have a surgical procedure. We explained the risks for complications if she had an STD since she was considered high risk from exposure to multiple partners. She agreed to be tested for STD's at our clinic and we offered an ultrasound. The ultrasound revealed a tiny 8-week-old baby with a strong heartbeat. She was still 2 weeks within the time frame that the abortion pill is provided. She left saying she would return for her STD and ultrasound results before she decided what she would do with her baby.

She kept her word.

She returned about a week later and learned that her STD results were all negative and her baby was a healthy baby at this point. We offered her a take home, non-graphic DVD on surgical abortion procedures so she would know exactly what she would be going through if she did not get the abortion pill in the next week or if it didn't work. She took the DVD. She said her mind was still made up to have the abortion.

We talked with the father of the baby and explained that even though he had no legal rights to make the decision about what happens to his baby, he needed to realize that the baby his girlfriend was carrying was half of his DNA and if he really didn't want her to abort he needed to tell her that. He mentioned that he would have regret if she had the abortion. They were encouraged to talk about this in great detail before any decisions were made.

Even after being at our clinic twice, she was still a 10 on our abortion scale. She told us she had called Planned Parenthood in Memphis but only got a recording.

We followed up with her a week later and found out she and her boyfriend decided to keep their baby! What a difference it makes when one is given the opportunity to sort through their own unique situation and be empowered with the information they need to make an informed choice.

This young couple now has a sweet baby they love very much and all are doing well!

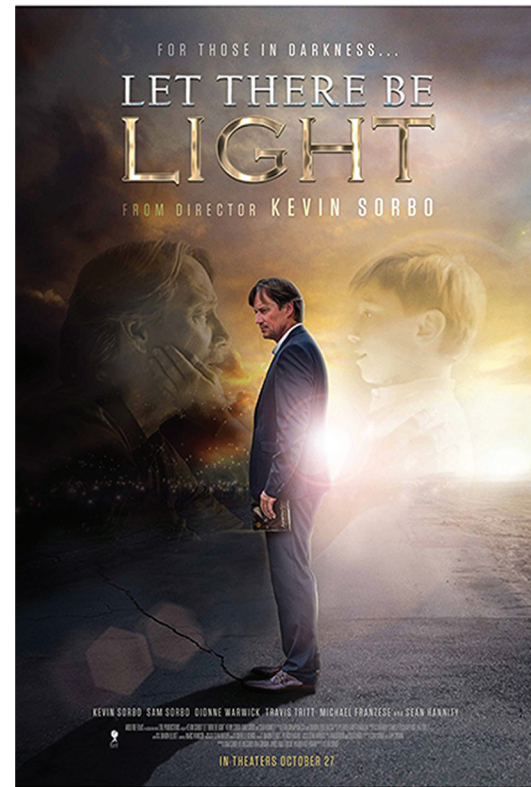
From a Director's Heart

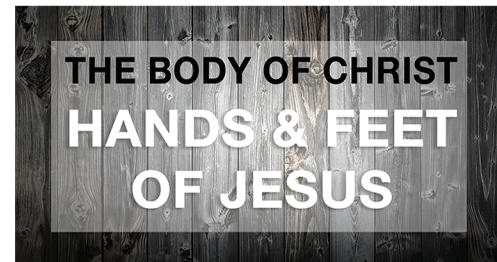

**W**hat in the world is a Costa Rican woman doing living in hillbilly country?!! Only God Knows! I was born to missionary parents, David and Georgina Solt, and lived 17 years in Central America. I am a registered nurse and was married to Doug Emr for 31 years. After serving in pastoral ministries in Pennsylvania our family with four children moved to Ukraine in the former Soviet Union. Doug started a Bible College and founded 8 churches pastored by nationals: 1994 to 2002. At age 54 he died suddenly in July 2002 of cardiac problems. I returned to Pennsylvania to my adult children.

In 2004 I married Pastor John Blackwell after meeting him on a Christian website. We were near Nashville for 10 Years Pastoring Ridgetop Baptist Church. In April 2014 we moved to Martin where John had lived for 40 years and now pastors Mt. Pelia Baptist Church. I tried to find a nursing job but God closed the doors. God led me to Agape House in 2016 where I am a Patient Coordinator. I love this ministry where I can encourage young people in life's challenging problems.

Life is precious to me because I have a special grandson who was born in 2009. My daughter was encourage to abort him by four doctors. Isaiah Miller was born 8 years ago and is bright with a love for life in third grade! He has had 20 surgeries and I have traveled to Pennsylvania to help with his care. Two years later baby girl, Vera Emr, died at 2 weeks from brain anoxia. In 2013 another grandson, Jude, was born at 25 weeks and weighed 1 pound 11 ounces. He spent 6 months in a hospital and now is now a thriving 4 year old. Yes, life is very precious to me! Agape House allows me to use my Spanish, nursing and love for Christ with young people.
