She was well into her years of raising children when she realized she might be pregnant again. It wasn't in her plans to have another baby. She thought she was nearing the finish line of raising children. However, pregnancy symptoms led her to get online, find our clinic & make an appointment.

She didn't know if she wanted to have an abortion or parent her baby. When asked what decision she was facing, she told us, "I don't know yet." Nobody knew about the pregnancy, not even the birth father. If she aborted then no one would have to know but abortion went against her beliefs. She told us, "You shouldn't get rid of a baby God put in you". But she was torn. Christian beliefs, financial stress, her reputation, and an older child finding out she had aborted... what should she do?

She was open to learning more about the abortion procedures. We discussed information on the abortion pill and surgical abortions, so she would be empowered to make an informed choice. During our discussion, she became concerned with how she might feel after the abortion. We discussed the option of adoption. This choice would not be going against her Christian beliefs and she wouldn't have to face what she was worried about in raising another child. She said it was a good option because the baby would get to live but she feared she couldn't let go once she carried her baby throughout the pregnancy.

The ultrasound revealed a tiny heartbeat and her baby was clearly seen moving around.

We armed her with truth about all of her options along with booklets to help her learn more. She even allowed us to pray with her. She cried throughout her appointment and we could see she was struggling with her decision.

When she returned the next week for her ultrasound & STD results, she had discussed her pregnancy "secret" with her mother and her oldest child. After telling her oldest about her pregnancy, they discussed the options and that sweet child accompanied her to her next appointment with us.

We discussed the booklets given to her at her first appointment and asked if she had made a final decision yet. She said she had decided to keep her baby because "babies and life are God's greatest gift and abortion goes against all I believe in". We encouraged her to have a daily time with the Lord and she accepted a Bible we offered her.

The "odds" were stacked against her that first day when she came to our clinic, but we knew God could overcome them all. She is walking by faith in Him that she made the right decision. We know she did. To God be the glory!


Do you have any advice for individuals or organizations thinking of partnering with Agape House?



At the age of just 17 years old, during my last semester of my junior year, I began to

have suspicions I was pregnant. What began as extreme fatigue suddenly turned into vomiting at all times of the day. After one negative pregnancy test, I knew just where to go for clear answers.

During middle school, staff from the education team would come to our Wellness class to inform and teach us about sex and all the other things that come along with it. I remember how they told us about their free S.T.D. and pregnancy testing, and being in a financially unstable situation, I wasn't able to pay \$20 for a pregnancy test. So, I went to the medical clinic and knew the second I walked in the door that I was in good hands.

The environment was very calm and the staff immediately treated me so kindly as if I were family. Once I was checked in and I had filled out some paper work, I was taken to a room to discuss what my visit was for. I was then given a plastic cup and sent to the bathroom. Less than 10 minutes later, my biggest fear was confirmed: I was pregnant. My ultimate feelings were regret, shame, and as if I had let everyone down. I couldn't help but think, "How could this happen?" Although I knew good and well how it happened.

I was given a moment to take in what I had just been told. The staff then made sure I knew that everything was going to be okay and they would help me every way they could. They discussed my options with me. This is where I realized abortion was not sitting well with me.

They gave me an ultrasound where I was able to see my little bean and hear his rapid little heart-beat. I wanted to take care of this baby. Throughout my pregnancy they helped me prepare for parenthood and helped me get an idea of what to expect.

I know that pregnancy is a very scary thing, and it is even scarier for people who feel like they have no one to confide in. With this medical clinic, being judged and put down are things you will NEVER have to worry about. The clinic helped me in tremendous ways during my pregnancy. They never once made me feel ashamed for being a young parent and always made me feel welcomed and loved. By the end of my journey I felt as if they were my own family. The staff and volunteers helped me in unimaginable ways, and never will I be able to thank them for helping me become the parent I am today.

> Our educational program serves as a point of prevention. We want to reach these students before they need the medical clinic. In 2017, our educational program reached over 3500 students in 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 11th grades.

So, how do we do it? We have an education team that presents information that will empower and encourage students to make sound decisions and avoid the risks of sexual activity before marriage. At the beginning of the week each student is given a workbook. Students are then assigned homework which must be signed by their parent or guardians in order to be complete. This is a tool that is used to begin a crucial conversation between students and their parents or guardians about relationships, sexual activity, and boundaries. To motivate student participation the students who complete a week's worth of assignments are given a snack! We recently surveyed students and found that an average of over 70% said they were motivated by the snack reward to complete their assignments. It may be just the trigger that's needed to start a meaningful conversation.

To keep the students engaged we offer a review on their last day of class. While the snack reward is only given to students who earn it by completing the assigned work, the candy bag is given to every student. The candy carries a specific saying that reinforces what they have learned in class.

This school year we will be in 2 states, 6 counties, 10 school districts, and 29 schools.
