Having been told she could never get pregnant due to a medical issue, she was angry to now be pregnant. She didn't want to have children and she did not think she could afford them. Besides, her relationship with the father of her baby was still new and her heart was set on a new career and traveling. She just could not believe she was really pregnant.

Her boyfriend seemed excited about the pregnancy and doted over her during the ultrasound. She did not want him to know she was considering abortion because he would not be in agreement with her at all. She confided to us that if she aborted, she would just tell him she miscarried.

We talked with her about her relationship with him and becoming a mother but it was hard due to her anger. She was more focused on what she wanted in life. She did not have any spiritual beliefs and refused prayer when we offered to pray with her.

You know, in any situation, love always covers a multitude of sin.

As angry as she was, she still came back to us for three different appointments. The last time she came to our clinic she was by herself. She begrudgingly told us she planned on parenting. She said she felt forced to have the baby because during the ultrasound she saw for herself that it was a "real baby".

We reached out in love to her again and did what we could to show her she and her baby have value.

Upon follow-up by phone, we learned that she had an OB appointment and was taking prenatal vitamins. She realized and owned the truth that her baby is more than a clump of cells.

Even in the midst of her anger, she continued to say good things about her visit with us, calling us caring and understanding. Only God can change an angry heart in a seemingly impossible situation. Yes, love covers a multitude of sin.
