The convenience of the Internet coupled with smart phones puts information at our fingertips. A young married woman took advantage of this convenience, searched for "abortion answers" and found us.

She came into our clinic saying she wanted to abort soon while she was in her first trimester. Her husband said it was her decision and he would support her through it.

While reviewing options, we asked her to complete a form where she lists the benefits and risks that she knows of each option. She could not think of any benefits of parenting or adoption. She wrote down "relief" as a benefit for abortion. While she was slightly concerned about some physical problems if she aborted, she was still pretty determined that abortion was the only answer.

She told us she was a Christian but it played no role in her decision to abort. We asked her if her Christian beliefs lined up with her decision to abort and she said that was the problem, they didn't line up.

She was already a mother and knew what joy children bring but this time she wanted out of the pregnancy.

Before the ultrasound she told us she didn't want to see a heartbeat because she wouldn't be able to abort.

After the ultrasound we offered her some of the pictures but she did not want them.

We encouraged her to bring her husband with her when she came for her follow-up appointment but she said he would not come because it makes it too real.

When she left our clinic that day she still planned to abort.


She did not return for her follow-up appointment.
