

# The Legacy Home



The money that I would get from selling the coconuts was what I would use for buying food. There was once a couple that took me in and showed me care, but it didn't last long. I stole money from them, I was disrespectful, I cursed at them and was not very good. Because of this they got rid of me. They brought me to CSWD. I have no idea who my parents are. The CSWD a government agency for children was

not capable of taking care of me. They had no facility where they could put me. They heard about The Legacy Home and brought me here. I am staying here in The Legacy Home now. They are taking care of me. They are also disciplining me, spanking my rear if I do wrong. They also hug me. I even received my first Christmas gift this last December 2016. I got slippers, new clothes, and toys. I never had these things before. Thank you everyone. Angelo



**(TRANSLATED)** How are you all doing? I am Gian Ayke, 7 years old. My story starts when my mother sent me with her sister to take me to my father. When we were in Bicol I found out that my Aunt was going back to where my Mother lives in Manila. So, I escaped from the house. I had been in the streets since that time. A government agency caught me. They looked for a place to put me since no one could locate any of my family. They heard about The Legacy Home. I am a child that is very disrespectful and disobedient. But when I came here to The Legacy Home, they began correcting me every time I do wrong. They are teaching me what pleases God. I also have experienced here, what it means to love one another and how

to respect others. My life here is changing little by little, and because of that I'm happy. I also received gifts like toys, clothes, and some other stuff last Christmas. Thank you, Jesus. Gian



**(TRANSLATED)** Hi my name is Pendatune Avao, 13 years old. This is the story of my life. My mother left my father and I because they were constantly quarreling. Then my Father died due to a motorcycle accident. It left me alone with no one to take care of me. I started going with my friends on the streets. I learned how to beg and steal money. Because I didn't have a home, I slept anywhere on the streets that I could find. I can still remember the times that the police would chase me because I was sleeping on the streets and there was a curfew in effect. They could easily catch me because I have problems with my eye sight. The last time they caught me they took me to DSWD. They in turn took me to The Legacy Home. I now have a

new life here in The Legacy Home. I ate delicious cake and I am always full. They are giving me an education and I can now write letters. I'm thankful that they are taking care of me. Especially when I am sick. I love you Jesus. Thank you for the home, parents, and family. I am thankful that I have eye glasses for my eyes. Pendatun

I would like to thank you today for being there when we need you. Not just because I ask, but because you say yes to Jesus when he begins to speak to your heart. On any given month, it costs a total of about \$7500 to operate The Legacy Home. At the end of November our account balance had gotten down to a little over \$1000. This was not even enough to cover our normal December money wire for our living expenses. Not to mention Christmas gifts for all the children as well as a small bonus for our Legacy staff in the Philippines. So, I put together a letter letting all of you know what kind of predicament we were facing. I prayed over the letter then sent it out. Once again our needs were met! We were able to pay our bills and buy Christmas gifts for the children and our staff. First as always, I give God the glory, second; thank you so much for being there when you were called upon. God is so good and his people are amazing.

I am in the US now. I have come back for the next few months to raise funding and to share of what amazing things that God is doing through The Legacy Home. I will be visiting all the churches that will let me in, so I hope that I will be in your church soon. Ask your pastor if he has scheduled with me yet.
