31 By faith the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace.

- 2. Offspring: Boaz (son), Obed (grandson), Jesse (great grandson), David (great, great grandson)
- 3. Nationality: Canaanite (Pagan culture)
- 4. Religion: Worshiper of the moon god
- 5. Occupation: Harlot
- 6. Scriptural Setting: Her story is told in Joshua chapters 2 & 6

INTERESTING FACTS:

- 1. She is known for:
 - a. Being a prostitute in Canaan. Likely involved in a perverse religious cult.
 - b. Exercising faith and saving the spies sent in to the promised land by Joshua.
 - c. Hanging a scarlet cord from her window.
 - d. Being in the linage of Jesus
- 2. She is one of only three women mentioned by name in lineage of Jesus
- 3. She was saved by a scarlet cord symbolizing the blood of Jesus.

NOTABLE EVENTS IN HER LIFE:

- 1. Joshua 2:1-2 Receives the two men sent by Joshua to spy out the land.
- 2. Joshua 2:3-6 She chooses sides and hides the spies from her king.
- 3. Joshua 6:17-25 Rahab is spared by the conquering Israelites
- 4. Joshua 6:25 Rahab finds a home in Israel and marries Salmon.

NOTABLE NEW TESTAMENT REFERENCES:

- 1. Matthew 1:5 And Salmon begat Booz of Rachab; and Booz begat Obed of Ruth; and Obed begat Jesse;
- 2. Hebrews 11:31 By faith the harlot Rahab did not perish with those who did not believe, when she had received the spies with peace.
- 3. James 2:25-26 Likewise also was not Rahab the harlot justified by works, when she had received the messengers, and had sent them out another way? For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also.

- 4. How does Rahab's story show us the tough choices faith will lead us to make?
- 5. Who were Rahab's descendants? (Matt 1:5)
- 6. What does it say about God's grace to see a former prostitute in the blood line of Jesus? Is that grace still at work today? Do you struggle to believe that in your own life.
