#1 Test by Temptation & Failure

1 Peter 1:6-7 (KJV 1900)

6 Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations:

7 That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:

I. OUR FAITH IS TESTED IN TIMES OF:
Every temptation is a test of our faith.
Maybe you have heard it said that opportunity only knocks once, but temptation knocks continually. It never stops trying to find a way into our lives.

James 1:12–15 (KJV 1900) 12 Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him. 13 Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man: 14 But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. 15 Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.
We are tested when we are by our own lust:
Temptation is a trap set by the devil, and it is designed to get you to to God.

Because Satan is a liar (John 8:44), the bait he uses often appears like something you need or desire, even something sweet, innocent or harmless. However, when you yield to temptation, you will always find the bitter fruit of sin.

The devil never gives you what he says he will. He may promise liberty and ecstasy, but he delivers bondage, guilt and shame. God, on the other hand, is faithful and always keeps His Word.

a. Three areas of temptation:

The temptations we face fall into three areas: the _

- i. The **lust of the flesh** has to do with our bodily appetites.

 Drunkenness, drug addiction, gluttony, adultery, fornication and homosexuality are some of the sins of the flesh.
- ii. The **lust of the eyes** is an excessive desire for things of the world. Covetousness, greed, idolatry, the love of money and financial dishonesty result from the lust of the eyes.
- iii. The **pride of life** is the desire for glory or fame. Someone who struggles with the pride of life is tempted by worldly honors, fame, reputation and position.

b. Jesus overcame all three:

Luke 4:1-13 (KJV 1900)

- 1 And Jesus being full of the Holy Ghost returned from Jordan, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness,
- **2** Being forty days tempted of the devil. And in those days he did eat nothing: and when they were ended, he afterward hungered.
- **3** And the devil said unto him, If thou be the Son of God, command this stone that it be made bread.
- **4** And Jesus answered him, saying, It is written, That man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.
- **5** And the devil, taking him up into an high mountain, shewed unto him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.
- **6** And the devil said unto him, All this power will I give thee, and the glory of them: for that is delivered unto me; and to whomsoever I will I give it.
- 7 If thou therefore wilt worship me, all shall be thine.

II. OUR FAITH IS TESTED IN TIMES OF:			
Failure may be one of the toughest tests a Christian will take. It deeply affects our faith and creates a feeling of between us and God in a way that no other test does.			
Luke 22:31–34 (KJV 1900) 31 And the Lord said, Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: 32 But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren. 33 And he said unto him, Lord, I am ready to go with thee, both into prison, and to death. 34 And he said, I tell thee, Peter, the cock shall not crow this day, before that thou shalt thrice deny that thou knowest me.

Failure is! People of genuine faith will always get back up.			
Psalm 37:23–24 (KJV 1900) 23 The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD: And he delighteth in his way. 24 Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down: For the LORD upholdeth him with his hand.			
Proverbs 24:16 (KJV 1900) 16 For a just man falleth seven times, and riseth up again: But the wicked shall fall into mischief.			
Micah 7:8 (KJV 1900) 8 Rejoice not against me, O mine enemy: When I fall, I shall arise; When I sit in darkness, the LORD shall be a light unto me.			
Too many people are living for God with a mindset.			
When we fail our faith is immediately put to the test. Do we believe that God's mercy is great and guaranteed? Or, do we believe that God's mercy is only available when we perform well enough or pray hard enough to deserve it.			
When we fail: • We feel of His attention. • We feel from being part of His family. • We feel for our weakness and inconsistency. • We feel too to ask or even speak to Him.			

Failure leads to feelings of guilt, shame and condemnation. In times of failure our feelings are affected deeply by these feelings of guilt, shame and condemnation. Yet, in these moments we have an opportunity to exercise ______. It is faith in its purest form – faith unmingled

- It takes an act of faith to pray after we have failed.
- It takes an act of faith to counter act feelings of shame with confessions of hope.
- It takes an act of faith declare that His blood is sufficient to wash you from your sins.
- It takes an act of faith to say what God says about our sin.
