### **Open Enrollment**

It's time to review your insurance coverage and make any changes for 2018. **November 1** to **January 12**, **2018** is open enrollment deadline for people on the Affordable Care Act insurance plan. Medicare beneficiaries have from **November 1** to **December 7** to make this decision. Here are a few things to consider as you make *your* choice.

- If you are young and healthy, look into a higher deductible plan. These plans usually have a much lower premium, potentially saving \$100 to \$200 every month.
- Consider a higher premium if you have a chronic illness; especially if it requires frequent procedures and/or lots of medication. Do some math first. Estimate a year's worth of health care visits and prescription costs, then add in the annual costs of the premiums. Calculate that for both the high- and low-deductible plans. You may be surprised which is cheaper.
- Check to see if your medication is covered by your plan. Don't assume every drug you're prescribed is covered. For example, if you take the antidepressant Abilify and it is not covered, the cost can be as much as \$1,000 a month of out-of-pocket expense.
- Don't automatically get vision and dental if you don't wear contacts or glasses, or have dental problems. Instead use your pre-tax health savings plan or your flex spending account. And, you can save a bundle in monthly vision premium by using one of the discount eyewear retailers.

Review your options. Compare high and low deductibles, and make your decision knowing that this is a choice that can be changed next year if your evaluation does not meet up to your expectations. Coverage can start as early as January 1, 2018. Lock your insurance down now before Congress takes it away!
