Sign up and watch the video online via smartphone, tablet or television.
- ♥ DC libraries, in partnership with Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, has a Books from Birth program which mails a free book every month to children from birth until the age of five. Parents must register online at https://www.dclibrary.org/booksfrombirth. While at the website, review the other programs the library offers to help literacy in the community. No Internet access?
