New Educational Assistance for Marylanders

In 2015, President Barack Obama proposed making community colleges across the country tuition-free. Rhode Island, Tennessee, Oregon, and New York jumped on the band wagon. Last week, a bill was signed into law offering the same to thousands of Marylanders. The scholarships will be worth as much as \$5,000 to low- and middle-income students starting community college within two years of high school graduation. The bill also allots monies to help older students who are close to finishing degrees. The program will go into effect in 2019. More information will be released to the public as details are finalized.
