Trivia Zone

- Between 1942 and 1949, approximately 20,000 African-American men completed recruit training and became known as the Montford Point Marines (MPM). They were the first to serve in the Corps and distinguished themselves as the finest artillery gunners in the Corps. The MPMs were abolished because of integration but are still remembered through the MPM National Association in Quantico, VA.
- Col. Guion S. Bluford. Jr. was a U.S. Air Force pilot with experience as a combat flyer during the Vietnam era. Col. Bluford went on to become one of America's first Black astronauts.
- Ocl. Adele G. Hodges was the first Black female to command Camp Lejeune, NC. She oversaw more than 47,000 Marines and sailors. After two years, she joined the Inspector General's Office at Marine Corps headquarters in Arlington, VA.

Open Enrollment

It's time to review your insurance coverage and make any changes for 2020. The 2020 Open Enrollment Period for health insurance runs from Friday, **November 1** to Sunday, **December 15**. Medicare beneficiaries have from Friday, **November 1** to Saturday, **December 7** to make this decision. Review your options. Compare high and low deductibles, and make your decision knowing that this is a choice that can be changed next year if your evaluation does not meet up to your expectations. Coverage can start as early as January 1, 2020.

Veterans Day is on Monday, **November 11**, and is a holiday held to honor military personnel who have served in the U.S. armed forces as active duty, former or retired personnel.
