# 139th ANNUAL SESSION, NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION, USA, INC.

The 139th Annual Session of the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc. was held September 2-6, 2019, in New Orleans, Louisiana. The Convention typically draws 20,000 or more delegates from the USA and from countries around the world.

It was a real joy for me and other delegates to meet for a God-centered convention worship experience anchored in expository preaching, singing, prayer, and fellowship.

On Monday evening, a musical was held at the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center. The theme was "Singing Praises with Thankful Hearts unto our Great God" (Psalm 92:1 and Psalm 95:3). A grand time was enjoyed by all.

The Convention officially opened on Tuesday, September 2, at 9:00 a.m. A spirit-filled devotional period was held, and prayers for the convention, the church and the nation were offered by several dynamic preachers. The Convention President, Rev. Dr. Jerry Young, welcomed conventioneers. Many dignitaries were in attendance including Governor John Bel Edwards and Mayor LaToya Cantrell, the first Black female mayor in the 300-year history of the city.

One of the highlights of the Convention was Rev. Al Sharpton, Founder of the National Action Network, and keynote speaker for the President's Educational Banquet. Rev. Sharpton delivered a powerful message! He reminded us that we are at a critical time in this country. Various social, religious, political, and governmental problems are dominating the American consciousness. He also reminded us that we must keep our eyes, not on the things seen, but on the things unseen, for the things seen are temporary, but the things unseen are everlasting. (2 Corinthians 4:18). Black Americans must be more proactive in addressing the current affairs in our community, such as crime, education, and unemployment, etc. He stated that we run the risk of losing the power to define our own reality, relegating ourselves to an agenda-less future and increasingly being absorbed by partisan politics and continued manipulation by special interests.

As the delegate from our Missionary Society Ministry, I attended the Woman's Auxiliary Annual Session. Dr. Cynthia Smith, President of the Woman's Auxiliary, delivered a compelling annual address. Her subject was "God's Plan – Our Season" with emphasis on the scripture found in Jeremiah 29:11. In her message, she reminded us that it's okay to make plans, but it is better when you consult the master planner. So, we must let go of our plan and embrace God's plan. It is our Season to exchange our ideas for His plan.

The Woman's Auxiliary supports Home and Foreign Mission. They make yearly contributions to and participate in the North America Baptist Women's Union and the Baptist World Alliance that support women in need in Third World Countries and around the world. The Women
