FINDING YOUR ROOTS

February is Black History month. What better time to begin the journey of finding your roots. You can do research in the comfort of your home through the many genealogical websites available. There are also several associations that can help you.

- There is a fee to use <u>Ancestry.com</u>, a major internet search engine; but there is free access at your public library. Don't expect the librarians to assist you (unless you want books on the subject).
- The African American Historical and Genealogical Society (AAHGS) have chapters in each of the United States. Joining a chapter has a nominal fee attached; but the tips shared can be invaluable. Search online for the chapter nearest you.
- The Washington DC Family History Center is located in Kensington, Maryland. A volunteer staff is available to answer questions about the resources available and give limited research guidance.

Check out any of the above. While you're on the internet look for conferences, conventions, classes and reference articles regarding your ancestral search. Happy hunting!

Every ten years a census is conducted to count every person in the country! The count is used to determine how federal funds (such as Medicare, housing vouchers and educational grants) are distributed to each. In order to achieve this, the Census Bureau is hiring. Apply online at <u>https://2020census.gov/jobs</u> The District will host an in-person job fair for Census positions in the DMV on Monday, **February 3**, at the Fort Stanton Recreation Center located at 1812 Erie Street SE, from 10:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Pre-registration is **required!** Go to <u>https://www.eventbrite.com/e/dc-dmv-and-us-census-bureau-job-workshops-fair-tickets</u>. The salary is over \$21.00 n houd. On a side note, the Census records are also used to trace a family history back in time so future generations can discover the origin of their roots. Just saying.
