What is Effective Ministry? When you can answer to Christ that you are doing your absolute best for Him.

Effective Ministry is activity carried out by Christians to express or spread our faith and love of Jesus Christ.

The Great Commission- In Christianity, is the instruction of the resurrected Jesus Christ to His disciples to spread his teachings to all the nations of the world.

Four Growth Components to Effective Ministry Development

Chemistry, Competence, Character, Consistency

Ministry must have a combination of all 4 components if ministry is to be effective at First African Baptist.

We cannot support just 1, 2, or 3 of these important components, it will not work in Effective Ministry.





Competence


Proverbs 2:6

Character

 The mental and moral qualities distinctive to an individual.

 Possessing Christ-like characteristics and traits while performing spiritual tasks.

 What type of person are you when you govern you?


Consistency

PROPER PRAYER AND PREPARATION

 There is no more accurate indicator of a Christian's spirituality or a church's growth than the vitality of our prayer life.

 Unhealthy churches looks at prayer as: if offered at all, is a formality, an afterthought, a burden.

 You will know your growing as a church when there is more prayer than confrontation, confusion, chaos!

Matthew 26:41

• "Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed *is* willing, but the flesh *is* weak."

- Every ministry with the aid of the Holy Spirit, must *pray* and *prepare* before their spiritual encounters (with visitors, other members, the worship experience, tense conversations, meetings, etc.).
- However, praying without proper preparation is much like faith without works, it becomes dead.

Spiritual Perfection:

Spiritual Perfection:

• Spiritual Perfection- is a theological term given to various teachings within Christianity that describe the process of achieving spiritual maturity or perfection.

- The ultimate goal of this process is union with God characterized by pure love of God and other people as well as personal holiness or sanctification.
- Every ministry has to constantly strive for Spiritual perfection.

Spiritual Perfection:

- The term rendered "perfect" in most English translations is τέλειοι (teleioi), the same word used in the Septuagint meaning:
- Brought to its end,
- Finished
- Lacking nothing
- Necessary to completeness.

The Scale of Spiritual Perfection: Matthew 5:48

- <u>Perfection</u>- Nothing on this side will ever be in a state of spiritual perfection constantly
- <u>Excellent</u>- There is no excuse to not have the spirit of excellence while striving for perfection
- <u>Great-</u> Is only one step above good, therefore strive for spiritual perfection
- <u>Good</u> Is to only be mediocre or average so press higher towards spiritual perfection
- Okay- To be levels below the purpose in which God has called us
- **Poor** Not an option, unacceptable, counterproductive and displeasing in the sight of God.



Am I a Spiritual Leader?

A spiritual person or team of believers' who influences others to accomplish the will of Jesus Christ for their lives.

➤ I work diligently to direct the church organization in a way that makes it more cohesive and coherent using.

 \triangleright (1 Corinthians 1:10)

Numbers 11:13-18 (NKJV)

- ¹³ Where am I to get meat to give to all these people? For they weep all over me, saying, 'Give us meat, that we may eat.'
- ¹⁴ I am not able to bear all these people alone, because the burden is too heavy for me.
- ¹⁵ If You treat me like this, please kill me here and now—if I have found favor in Your sight—and do not let me see my wretchedness
- ¹⁶ So the LORD said to Moses: "<u>Gather to Me seventy men of wisdom of Israel</u>, whom you know to be the <u>leaders of the people</u> and officers over them; bring them to the tabernacle of meeting, that they may stand there with you.
- 17 Then I will come down and talk with you there. I will take of the Spirit that is upon you and will put the same upon them; and they shall bear the burden of the people with you, that you may not bear it yourself alone.
- ¹⁸ Then you shall say to the people, '<u>Consecrate yourselves</u> for tomorrow, and you shall eat meat; for you have wept in the hearing of the LORD, saying, "Who will give us meat to eat? For *it was* well with us in Egypt." Therefore the LORD will give you meat, and you shall eat.

Commitment to Leadership: What all Leaders Must Demonstrate
