

In March, 1993, I went on my Walk to Emmaus (a 72-hour retreat with God that I highly recommend to everyone!), and someone that I hadn't met prior to that weekend asked me, "Have you ever considered the ordained ministry?" I did not hesitate as I honestly and emphatically said, "No!" I assumed I would be a Sunday school teacher and Vacation Bible School Teacher, and maybe a lay leader, but the thought of being a pastor had NEVER entered my mind... However, in that moment, God spoke through another person to plant the seed of his calling in my heart... and, oh, how that seed began to germinate and grow!

Over the years, many people have told me that they wished they (like I) knew how God was calling them. Perhaps you've felt that way. If so, I want to encourage you the way I've encouraged them—pray and seek God. Ask God to open your heart so you may grow closer to him, and your eyes and ears so you may see and hear how God is calling you to serve and be part of the Body of Christ—BECAUSE GOD IS CALLING YOU!

Each and every one of us, by nature of our baptism in Christ, is called by God. If you have been baptized, then it's not a matter of *whether* God is calling you but *how* God is calling you. That is what Paul is talking about in his letter to the church in Ephesus. Paul was not writing just to the leaders in the church, but to EVERYONE IN THE CHURCH. In Eph. 4:1-13 (TNIV; emphasis added), Paul wrote:

¹ As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to **live a life worthy of the calling you have received.**

² Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love.

³ Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

⁴ There is **one body** and one Spirit just as you were called to one hope when you were called;

⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism;

⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

⁷ **But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it.**

⁸ This is why it says: "When he ascended on high, he took many captives & **gave gifts to his people.**"

... ¹¹ So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers,

¹² **to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up**

¹³ **until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.**

If you've been baptized in Christ, you are part of the body of Christ, and God is not only calling you to do your part in building up the body of Christ, but he's given you the gifts and abilities to do so. You, however, may not have realized it. Just like God spoke through someone to help me begin to realize how God was calling me, I pray God will speak to you through these words, "How is God calling you?"

How is God calling you to serve him and others in this world? What gifts and talents has God given you that he expects and needs you to use to help others and build up the body of Christ? Christ purposely gives us different gifts and abilities so he can do many different things through us, and he needs us to do our part. In many churches today, 20% of the people do all the work. It's no wonder so many

people get tired and burned out; that's not the way God intended or planned. God intended for every single one of us to do our part.

Worship in the Park was a great example of many people helping and doing their part to pull it all together. Thanks to all who helped make the worship and picnic in the park so special! God blessed many others through you!

Indeed, I don't believe there is any greater blessing or joy in this world than to be who God has called us to be. **How is God calling you? What are you doing to live out God's calling on your life to help build up the body of Christ?**

The body of Christ, as the universal church, and the body of Christ at Christ UMC need you to be who God is calling you to be—because without you, our ministry is limited and hampered. We need you! Christ needs you! The world needs you! **Will you answer God's call?**

Every year at Christ UMC, we ask and encourage people to pray about how God is calling them to serve in the coming year, and then, to let us know by filling out a "Service and Mission" form. Unfortunately, only a few usually do. Will this year be different? Will you please (1) pray about how God is calling you to build up the body of Christ, (2) fill out the form (available in worship, at the Connection Center, and on our website: <http://www.christum-baltimore.com/resources/service--mission-at-christ-umc.html>) and then (3) return it to the church office as soon as possible? This year, we have vital openings in our music ministries (see below).

Would you please pray about whether God is calling you so we can continue these important ministries?

God is calling you to use the gifts he's given you to build up the body of Christ and help others find eternal life in Christ! **God is calling YOU and counting on YOU!**

Administrative Council Report

Before I get in to the details of Ad Council activities from our last meeting on July 24, I would like express my appreciation for the dedicated participation of all members of the Council and other interested members of our church in the Ad Council meetings. Since the Ad Council is the legislative branch of our church, the larger participation results in more discussion related to the decisions made that ultimately affect the entire membership.

Some of the actions that the Ad Council has taken during our July 24 meeting are summarized below. Please let me know if you have any questions or comments on those actions. Copies of our meeting minutes are available in the Church Office or can be emailed upon request.

The following resolutions were made and approved by the Council:

Regarding the repairs to the Fellowship Hall, a motion was made and unanimously approved to authorize the expenditure of up to \$19,000 to complete the mold remediation and installation of the a new heating and air conditioning system for the Fellowship Hall. Funds for this project will be made from the "Improvement Account".

A resolution was and unanimously approved to appropriate \$2,000 to replace all commodes in the main church.

With respect to the designated funds that were inadvertently accessed in the past for operating expenses, a previous commitment to replenish those funds once proceeds from the sale of the former parsonage were available was discussed. After vigorous debate, it was decided to reimburse those funds. The following resolution was introduced. **A motion was made, seconded and approved by hand vote with two opposing votes to replenish those designated funds in the total amount of \$23,749 from the "Improvement Account". The Improvement Account will be replenished from the Operating Account in the amount of \$500 per month when the balance in the Operating Account exceeds \$45,000. The payments will be distributed as follows:**

- **Bell choir:** \$ 6,749
- **Sending Love Over There:** \$12,000
- **Rebekah Circle:** \$ 4,000
- **Funeral Meals:** \$ 1,000

Other items discussed at the Council meeting are summarized as follows:

Richard Blackstone (Trustee Chairperson) advised that the sale of the former parsonage netted approximately **\$156,000** which will be placed in an "Improvement Account" that can be utilized to fund necessary repairs and improvements to our facility. He also indicated that four families loaned approximately \$80,000 (interest free) for the new parsonage renovation that made this transition possible. Three of the families prefer to remain anonymous while the fourth family (Steve Harmon) chose to donate his loan of \$20,000 to the church as a memorial for Jack Van Dine. A letter of thanks will be sent to all families that loaned funds for the new parsonage renovation and suitable recognition of the generous gift from Steve Harmon will be made in the near future.

With regard to nominations, Pastor Alice noted a change in the 2017 Lay Leadership Team roster. Dana Hoisington will replace Diane Friesner as the chairperson for the Blood Drive.

Pastor Alice also noted that the attendance for the Summer Services has not resulted in an increase in the number of attendees normally attending both of the separate services.

Denise Vandermark and Dottie Harmon noted approximately 90 persons attended the string quartet concert on July 23 as part of the Lancaster Festival activities.

Prayers were asked for Dick & Jean Weidner (health concerns), Mike Donnally (recently passed), Michael Burns (Mission trip to Dominican Republic), Baby Jack Schooler (recent trip to emergency room), Glenna Hoisington (upcoming surgery), Brian Simpson (ongoing health concerns), Helen Hodsden (aging health concerns), and Andy Fey (back Surgery).

The next meeting is scheduled for Monday September 25th at 7:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.

The Baltimore Food Pantry has had an exciting summer. We have increased the square footage of the pantry to better serve families and to better store the reserve supplies and thus take advantage of bulk purchases. If you haven't been to see us lately please arrange for a visit. Better yet we are always looking for volunteers. Just see Tim or Sue Cooper and they can help you.



As for the needs for this month - as we enter the colder months and the needs of our families increase - please be diligent in your giving and intentional in your desire to help this ministry grow. I am going to list the staples that we provide each family every month so you can decide what to give and you can take advantage of the specials at the grocery stores (like 10 items for \$10).

We give: canned vegetables, canned fruit, pasta, pasta sauce, noodles, canned pasta (spaghetti, ravioli, etc.),

macaroni and cheese, rice or rice mixes (rice-a-roni), cake mix, jello, pudding, corn bread mix, boxed potatoes, stuffing and lots of soup and chunky soup. We also provide personal hygiene items such as soap, shampoo, and toilet paper along with dish washing detergent. Don't forget cereal and saltine crackers.

If you want to narrow down that list, we can concentrate this month on tomato, chicken noodle and vegetable soup. Chunky soup is always appreciated because it is a bit pricey, but can be used as a main meal item over rice or noodles.

We thank you for your continued support of this vital ministry. May God's blessings rain down on all of you.

Good Neighbors in the Village

Dear Partners in Service,

School has begun and that means the After School Program sponsored by Good Neighbors in the Village and hosted at Faith Lutheran Church is underway. And it means that you will see monthly nudges in this space offering you the chance to get involved in a program that is changing lives. During 2016-17, 24 adults and 16 high school students helped provide a supportive, interesting, and helpful learning (and play) environment to some 35 Liberty Union students who may otherwise have gone home to an empty house. Quite a few of those volunteers will return, but more are needed as we become better equipped to meet the academic challenges of our students and respond to their curiosity and interests. In particular, we need volunteers who can help our students explore their interest in music and singing. We need nature lovers, gardeners, bird watchers, woodworkers, scientists, mechanics, artists, crafters, etc. If you have a hobby that fascinates you, chances are that it might inspire one of "our" kids, especially if it can be introduced to them in a hands-on way. Volunteers don't have to commit to being at the After School Program every day. You can come once and do a project. Or you can come once a week, or once a month, or everyday for a week. The Summer Lunch Program experienced lower attendance this year than last, causing us to question whether our model for getting food to children and families in need is the right one for our community. We have formed a working group to try to better understand the local need and consider options for 2018. Does our program need to look beyond delivering calories to examining ways in which we can help build the capacity of families to stretch food dollars and simultaneously get better nutrition? All that said, we appreciate the efforts of kitchen leads, cooks, servers, cleaner uppers, door and restroom monitors, craft wizards, bakers, and all those who contributed time and talent toward this Summer's Lunch Program, or who provided items for the take-home bags.
