"God Is Doing a New Thing!"

Happy New Year! I've never been a big fan of New Year's resolutions—not because I have anything against them, but because they don't usually last. They represent commitments we usually don't keep—to God, ourselves, or others. What I am a fan of, though, is that the New Year reminds us of God's commitments (which he always keeps) and how he makes all things NEW (Rev. 21:5)!

In Isaiah 43, God reminded the Israelites that he created and loved them, called them by name to be his children, was always with them and would not let life challenges overtake them, and that he saved them from their slavery in Egypt. Then, God said the most amazing thing: ¹⁸ "But forget all that—it is nothing compared

¹⁰ "But forget all that—it is nothing compared to what I am going to do.
¹⁹ For I am about to do something new.
See, I have already begun! Do you not see it?
I will make a pathway through the wilderness.
I will create rivers in the dry wasteland.
²⁰ The wild animals in the fields will thank me, the jackals and owls, too, for giving them water in the desert. Yes, I will make rivers in the dry wasteland so my chosen people can be refreshed.
²¹ I have made Israel for myself, and they will someday honor me before the whole world. (Isaiah 43:18-21, NLT)

God was about to do something so amazing, he said to forget about all the past things he'd done for them—this would be much greater! God was going to set them free from their slavery in Babylon and provide a new pathway and rivers of refreshment in the wilderness (desert) on their way back to him and their home in Jerusalem. I believe this promise also foreshadowed how God would send Jesus, the Messiah, to set them free from their slavery to sin—and bring them back to him and their eternal home with him.

We just celebrated Christmas and how God came as Jesus to be "God with us." Because of this, God's promises hold true for us, too. Because God loves and created us, because God has saved us from our sins through Jesus, God is always ready to do something new in our lives.

Life can wear us down, but God wants to renew us! If we let things in this world distract us from worshiping God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength, God wants to provide rivers of living water to refresh and restore us. Sometimes, we like the Israelites, need time apart to be refreshed by focusing on and being with God. Sometimes we, like the Israelites, need to go through a wilderness to help us refocus and reclaim the plans God has for us—and to catch a new glimpse of God's vision. This is my prayer for all of us while I am on renewal leave.

For you see, God not only wants to make us new, but also, to do a new thing through us! God made us and Christ UMC for himself, and he wants to keep re-making us to become more like him and to be his witness to the world! When we honor God with our hearts and lives, God keeps his promises and will make us new and do a new thing through us! I can't wait to see what God is about to do!

- 2. A second resolution adopted a change in the worship schedule stating January 2018. The new worship schedule is outlined below:



The advertised start time is 10 a.m., but in reality the fun starts at 9:30. A hot meal follows at 11:00 a.m. every Wednesday.

The GNIV-sponsored After School Program hosted at Faith Lutheran Church (just north of Liberty Union Elementary School) is serving a vital role in the lives of a number of district families. If we had more adult volunteers, we could be more effective with the kids already attending, and possibly enroll a few more. From 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. each day school is in session, this program needs people interested in building friendships with kids – having conversations, listening to them read, playing games. We also need volunteers to share their particular skills or passions in a participatory way. For instance, we'd love to have people come who can guide our kids through some yoga and deep breathing exercises, or show them how to crochet or knit. I arrive early just to fellowship with everyone at 5:30 am. I drink no water...that took some getting used to!
