Administrative Council Report

Actions that the Ad Council has taken during our January 22, 2018 meeting are summarized below. Please let me know if you have any questions of comments on those actions. Copies of our meeting minutes are available in the Church Office or can be emailed upon request.

The following resolutions were made and approved by the Council:

- The 2018 budget was submitted for review. The subsequent discussion yielded several questions which were sufficiently addressed by members of the Finance Committee (Jerry McCreery & Darla Reedy). A motion to accept the budget as presented was unanimously approved. Copies of budget can be provided upon request from the Church treasurer (Darla Reedy).
- 2. As part of our outreach ministry, Jim Thompson asked that our Church support the ministry of Rev. Kofi Amoateng and his wife in the impoverished African nation of Ghana. Rev. Amoatneg was educated at the Asbury Seminary in Wilmore, KY and is actively engaged in establishing Methodist congregations in his native country. Developing a relationship with Rev. Amoateng and his congregations would involve a contractual commitment on the part of our Church which includes financial support. A motion to pursue the details of establishing a working relationship with Rev. Amoateng and his congregations was unanimously approved.

Other items on the agenda included the following

- Tom James offered a compliment to the "Good Timers" for serving the Fairfield County Antique Tractor Club banquet. Many of the 140 Club members that attended complimented the service and the quality of the food. The only negative comment was made with regard to the structural integrity of the chairs. Tom James suggested that some more substantial chairs be made available for persons in need of better support.
- 2. Finally, the committee headed by Dwayne Miller, has met with Josh Short (Police Officer) to discuss the Emergency Action Plan. Many good suggestions were made and will be presented to the Council at our next meeting in February.

Keep in mind that Administrative Council meetings are open to all who wish to attend. Please feel free to share any joys or concerns with me.

Prayers were offered for Trudy Keck, Ann Wolfe's mother, Karen Matthews, the Helen Hodsden family, and others.

The next meeting is scheduled for Monday February 26, 2018 at 7:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.

British Prime Minister Theresa May recently appointed a Minister for Loneliness. Research has uncovered that social isolation causes health problems that cost the government. So the U.K. has decided to see what it can do to reduce the epidemic of loneliness.

Isolation rarely produces good fruit. It not only hurts the health of individuals but also shortchanges communities and it stunts the effectiveness of the Body of Christ.

Punching holes in walls of isolation that result from age, physical condition, or circumstance is really what Good Neighbors in the Village is all about. That's why we build ramps. It's why GNIV started Wednesday chair volleyball and senior lunch. It's why we began an After School Program and go caroling at Christmas, and have a Bible study at Walnut Creek Apartments.

Fortunately, we have many partners in this work of nurturing connections, facilitating friendships, and offering opportunities for engagement and two-way caring and support. Our local churches, community organizations, and youth, sports and school groups all help build a sense of belonging and shared purpose. These are antidotes to isolation.

GNIV's current needs in this ongoing work come down primarily to volunteers, so if you're looking for a way to be meaningfully involved in the community, we can help!

We have a critical need for regular adult volunteers who could spend two hours twice a week with students at the After School Program. It's a fun gig, and the more adults we have, the merrier we all are. We're also on the lookout for a person able to teach some yoga and deep breathing exercises to our students. 




