REPORT FOR WEST OHIO ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2018

Attending: Pastor Alice Wolfe, Gayle McCreery (Deaconess), Cheryl Fey (Lay Rep)

Conducted by: Bishop Gregory Palmer Dates: June 3-6 Location: Lakeside, Ohio

Theme for the Conference: Be Not Afraid....There is Enough!

Motto for Lay Representatives: We are Laity Strong!

The opening worship service on Sunday was the Memorial Service with candles lit for those pastors who have died during the previous year (including our former pastor Michael Donnally). The guest preacher was Dr. Zan Holmes Jr. who delivered a powerful sermon. As always the worship services, preaching and singing were very moving with over 3,000 in attendance!

Monday morning featured Clergy Session for Pastor Alice and a Laity Workshop for me. Key message from Laity Workshop: "If we just serve others and not build relationships, allowing God to work through us, then we are being judgmental; we have the ability to see that the Kingdom of God has enough of what it needs to make a lasting difference."

"Light the Way" is a 5-year campaign to raise \$5 million for starting new churches and revitalizing those in areas of potential growth. There were several testimonials given of the success of "Light the Way" funding for new churches and revitalization. Over \$2 million had been raised before conference and we added over \$100,000.00 with offerings from churches brought forward during a worship service. Our church gave a check of \$50.00. You may still contribute by going to westohioumc.org or give a check through our church.

The United Methodist Church is very active in social justice issues and four different topics were introduced through videos and personal testimonies: racism, sexism, gun violence and immigration. These accounts were sometimes shocking, always eye-opening. We stand for Biblical morals and the love of Jesus in caring for all peoples. Be not afraid...there is enough love to go around!

The Commissioning and Ordination Service is always a highlight of the conference. There were 13 Lay Ministers, 6 Local Licensed Pastors who had completed the 5-year Course of Study, 6 commissioned Deacons, 14 commissioned Elders, 3 Ordained Deacons in Full Connection and 14 Ordained Elders in Full Connection. The banners carried in for those ordained were a beautiful sight of pageantry.

We voted on six different Recommendations, all of which passed. Four dealt with finance, health benefits and vacation for pastors; Recommendation #5 called for human rights to be used as criteria for not investing in companies that do business involving the occupation of Palestine; Recommendation #6 called for support of churches within West Ohio Conference who wish to provide sanctuary for immigrants seeking protection, following all legal channels. These recommendations are in the Book of Reports found in the church office and online at (<u>https://www.westohioumc.org/sites/default/files/conference/documents/pdf/page/2018-book-reportsfinal.pdf</u> There was also a re-vote on a Constitutional Amendment (<u>https://www.westohioumc.org/conference/constitutional-amendment-revote</u>) due to an editorial error when it was voted on at General Conference 2016.

Thank you for allowing me to represent you at this very important "business part" of our church. You may be aware that there will be "troubled times ahead" for the church at large, especially around the topic of homosexuality issues, but this 2018 conference exhibited a call to unity in the preaching that was given by both Dr. Zan Holmes and Bishop Gregory Palmer. There is a special session of General Conference Feb. 23-26, 2019. Please keep our denomination in prayer, for God is good and He has a plan for us!

Good Neighbors of the Village

Great food, and some to take home, too: We are off and running with a restyled summer lunch program — now being held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Tuesdays at Johnson Park shelter house and Thursdays at the Basil Park shelter house. With two weeks under our belt, we've had from 8 good neighbors in the village serve others, and help support one to 26 kids in attendance each time, and we know

we are just scratching the surface of need. Especially on the west end of town we need YOUR help in promoting the program. We want kids to show up at 10 a.m. to participate in food preparation and planned activities, both inside and outside the shelter house. Our idea is to make meal prep participatory so that we can learn from one another and explore the wonderful world of whole foods. Every meal attempts to expose participants to things we feel certain they will enjoy - kids helped us plan the menus and at least one thing that might be new to them. We are so grateful for the enthusiastic support we have received from the Baltimore Food Pantry for contributing many of the raw materials, from the Village of Baltimore for providing a cost-free place and cheerleading, and from new volunteers and parents/grandparents of participants for their assistance. It's not too late to be involved or to sign up your children or grandchildren. Just leave a message with Darcy at 740-862-4343, Katie Williamson at 740-407-7543, or with Holly at the number below. Children of all ages are welcome though kids who have not completed kindergarten need to be accompanied by a related supervising adult. A permission slip is required for all participants under the age of 18. If you love creating yummy meals from whole foods, consider joining this effort.

Builders needed, training provided: Our ramp builders and home helps teams have been exceptionally busy this year - so busy that we are putting out a call for experienced carpenters and/or willing apprentices. We have received our fifth ramp referral and also are working on a couple of other requests for help that don't involve ramps but resolve home access or care concerns for some of our neighbors, allowing them to continue living independently. Youth leaders: Here is an opportunity for your youth to do local mission work and to expand upon skills they may be learning through work camps or school instruction. To learn more or get hooked up with our team, call Holly at the number below.

Wonderful Wednesdays: I don't say enough about the impact of Wednesday's chair volleyball matches and the hot lunch that follows, nor about the commitment of the people who make it happen. This year-round midweek activity for seniors (and others) began in response to one person's request to start a chair volleyball team in Baltimore because it's 1.) fun, and 2.) something that people of all ages and abilities can do. Lunch was added in response to another person's request as volunteers from Christ UMC and Faith Lutheran stepped up to make that happen. Soon, the so-called beneficiaries of this program demanded that they be allowed to contribute to its maintenance



through voluntary donations. Their contributions assure funding for the Wednesday lunch program and also help fuel efforts like the summer lunch for kids. So the seniors are served, help another through their interaction and

merry-making. If you are looking for something to do on Wednesday mornings, try out chair volleyball. Play starts around 9:45 a.m. at the Christ UM Church Family Life Center; lunch is served at 11. Getting ready for Year 3: In the waning days of the second year of the Good Neighbors' After School Program for Liberty Union, kids built a giant Kerplunk game with Jim Thompson; used their math skills to fill a planting box that is now happily growing tomatoes, pumpkins, herbs and other vegetables; and planted tomatoes and beans in the Community Garden with Deb Fisher. With school starting on Aug. 15, kids should get to harvest their late spring efforts. On May 18, the ASP hosted an open house for teachers and participated in a multi-church bonfire/wiener roast. It was a good year. We are grateful for the adult volunteers, including numerous high school chorus students who contributed hours to helping our kids with homework. We extend a special thank you to Susan Tucker for her commitment over the last two years to cooking with After School kids and setting us up with basic cooking equipment. She is turning her volunteer attention to some other efforts, but we are grateful she made our program a priority and helped get us started on the right foot. When ASP starts again on the first day of school, we will be serving kids from 1st through 4th grades. And we will need volunteers. The next After School Program board meeting will be held at 4:30 p.m. July 25 at Faith Lutheran Church.
