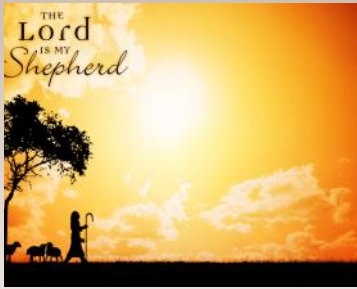

"From Your Interim Pastor"

Greetings as we begin a new year and a new relationship with one another. I am Rev. Dr. Stacy Evans, an officially retired member of the West Ohio Conference (ordained Elder). I am coming to be with you for six months while our District Superintendent, his colleagues, and our Bishop find an appropriate person to be your long-term appointed pastor. I have a forty-five year career as an appointed pastor, 36 as an active member of the annual conference and years as serving several churches in retirement. I am a native of Washington County and grew up on the family farm. I have pastored rural churches, small-town churches, small city and big city churches. I come to you with goodwill and the intention to help you make the transition that will occur on July 1, 2019. I am committed to The United Methodist Church whatever the outcome of the Special General Conference that happens in St. Louis, Missouri, late next month.

My family consists of my wife Cheryl (an ordained Deacon serving Bennington Chapel UMC in Licking County), our four adult children and their families. We have three biological grandchildren and two step-grandchildren. Two of our children live in Illinois (Chicago and Macomb) and two live in the Columbus area. In the midst of my coming to you, my son who lives in Chicago and his family are moving to Sao Paulo, Brazil, as a career diplomat with the United States Department of State. We have a lively family but we all get together only at Thanksgiving and Christmas. Please pray for us because of the changes that we are experiencing.



I want to get to know all of you! I am a "people person," genuinely interested in all the people I have served in my capacity as pastor. I prefer that you refer to me as Pastor rather than Reverend. Reverend is an honorary title given when a person is ordained. Pastor (which comes from the root word "shepherd") is a reference to what I seek to do among you. I see myself as the shepherd who has been chosen to be a good steward of the programs and preschool of Christ United Methodist Church for a period of six months. I hope that we will get to know and trust one another as we move forward. I consider it a privilege to be appointed your interim pastor. In the last 20 years or so I have been called "Pastor Stacy" by members of congregations that I have served. I hope that this is satisfactory.

Looking to the immediate future, I hope that we can have a number of studies going on during Lent. Easter is a bit later than in most years, April 21, so that Lent begins the first Wednesday of March. It will be an exciting, dynamic Christian year, a part of which I will share with you.

"Safety Ministry Team"

The Safety Ministry Team is excited to start off the new year with a program in conjunction with Basil Fire Department to help you dispose of unused, expired, or medications you are no longer are taking/prescribed. Far too often, opioid addiction begins right at home with misuse of prescription medicine. You can help prevent addiction in your communities by using several methods to safely dispose of them.

The Safety Ministry Team will be at the Connection Center every Sunday before and after church to hand out a Drug Disposal Kit and additional information on how you can safely dispose of any medications. Please start 2019 by cleaning out your medicine cabinets, night stands, kitchen cabinets and anywhere else you might be storing meds. This will help in keeping your home safe for you and your other family members.



Another project the Safety Ministry Team is going to kick off in January or February is a CPR class given by Kasey Farmer. There will be a sign up sheet for interested individuals at the Connection Center as well. Kasey has graciously agreed to volunteer his time to

teach this class at no cost unless you need a CPR Card – then the cost will be \$5.00. You just never know when you might be in the right place to help someone by saving a life through CPR.

Administrative Council Report

There were 18 faithful servants that attended our November 26 Council meeting. Since I am relinquishing the position of Ad Council Chairperson as of the end of 2018, I want to express my appreciation for all of the support and dedication of Council members and others who participated in the administration of our Church. The last two years have given me the opportunity to fully appreciate all of the contributions that our Church makes to our members, frequent attenders, and to the Baltimore community. These contributions are far too numerous to list here but certainly have made a difference in the spiritual lives of many. Please continue to support the Ad Council in the coming year under the competent leadership of Dave Brookover.

Actions that the Ad Council has taken during our November 26, 2018 meeting are summarized below. Please contact me at tjames@indenv.com or via my cell phone which is (812) 305-0734 if you have any questions of comments on these actions. Copies of our meeting minutes are available in the Church Office or can be provided upon request.

The following resolutions were made and approved by the Council:

1. **A motion was unanimously approved to accept numerous changes to the Safe Sanctuary Policy.** The changes were summarized by Cheryl Fey and were in response to new directives from the West Ohio Conference. The revised Policy can be obtained from the Church Office upon request.
2. **A second motion was unanimously approved to task the Safety Committee with the responsibility of administering the new Safe Sanctuary Policy.**
3. **A third motion was unanimously approved to rent the existing parsonage to Pastor Alice on a month to month basis until June 2019 at a rate to be determined by the Trustees.** Since Pastor Alice has accepted a new appointment at the Lancaster First United Methodist Church and our interim pastor will not need the parsonage, her request will afford her the time to find other housing.

Other items on the agenda included the following

1. Jim Thompson offered the following update to the "Dinner Church" outreach:
 - a. Several surveys regarding preferences to the best day and time for the "Dinner Church" service were solicited from persons attending the November Turkey Supper and the October Fall Festival. The results of the surveys clearly indicated that the preferred day and time for the "Dinner Church" would be Sunday Evenings.
 - b. The overall objective of the "Dinner Church" would be to create a family atmosphere, meet people where they are with focus on Jesus, evangelism, Gospel teaching, testimonials, prayer, and fellowship.
 - c. The target start date for the new service would be May 2019.
 - d. Planning meetings will continue as of January 13 in the Parlor at 4:30 pm.
2. With regard to the trustees, Richard Blackstone was pleased with the number of volunteers that assisted in removing the sanctuary pews on November 25 in preparation for installation of the new carpet. He also hoped for the same response for replacing the pews on November 29.
3. **Chairperson Jerry McCreery shared that under the terms of our mortgage for the Family Life Center, the present interest rate is subject to change as of September 2019.** All budget requests are due as of December 3 to be finalized during a special Finance Committee meeting on December 10. Jerry also noted that all obligations through the end of October were met except for meeting the full apportionment amounts.
4. From a Worship Committee standpoint, Cheryl Fey announced the Hanging of the Green is scheduled for Dec. 2 during our worship service. The Christmas Eve services will be 6:00 pm (Family Service) and 8:30 pm for the Candlelight Service.
5. Our Youth Director, Greg Dolce, shared that 42 persons attended the recent bon fire in Thornville and that a Youth Camp Retreat scheduled for February 1 through February 3 at Camp Akita near Lancaster.
6. As chairperson of the SPRC, Rob Sayre shared that there will be a reception for Pastor Alice after the service on December 23 to celebrate her 8.5 years of serving our Church.
7. Mary Johnson expressed a concern that persons shown in the "First Reading" of potential members to be dropped from membership rolls on the documents submitted to the Charge Conference in November were properly notified prior to being added to the list. As a member of group responsible for developing the list, Dottie Harman indicated that she believed that all listed persons were contacted via mail but would have to confirm that the letters had been sent.

Prayers were offered for our Church, our adults, our youth, Patti James (health concerns), Dale Landis (upcoming surgery) Debbie Alderdice (upcoming surgery), Zale & Susan Maxwell (recovering from surgery), Worth Harman (health concerns), and many others.

Next meeting is scheduled for Monday January 28, 2019 at 7:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall. The meeting was adjourned by unanimous vote at 8:35 pm.

2018 Re-Cap

The Good Timers had another very busy year in 2018!

15 Fundraisers, which included:

- 3 Euchre Parties
- 1 Home Made Noodles
- 11 Catered events, the smallest was 26 guests and the largest was 262 dinners
- 1 Craft Show Lunchroom
- 1 Turkey Supper
- 9 Private Events

There were a total of:

165 volunteers served, 1,568 guests and 140 pies and cakes were donated.

In addition to paying for their meals, our guest organizations paid \$597.50 building rental fees.

After the meal expenses were paid, 100% of the profit - \$12,577.14 went to the church.



We gave:

10% to the church for operating expenses - \$1,223.54
90% of the profit was applied to the mortgage principle which totaled to \$11,353.60.

Since we organized in January 2011, we have served over 11,000 guests and raised over \$95,000 for the church.

We thank everyone who supports the Good Timers Fundraising Team and are looking forward to the new year. The Fairfield County Antique Tractor Club Annual Banquet is returning January 19. We also have dinners booked for April and May. If you would like to help with this ministry, let one of us know.
