

### **"From Your Interim Pastor"**

First off, I want to tell you what a strong and awesome congregation you are! As I meet you and participate in committees and other gatherings, I sense Christian commitment and joy in serving. The Church of Jesus Christ is about coming alongside people and helping them gain strength, deepen faith, and become closer to our loving and caring God. Many people do not have a clear picture of God as a divine and living Presence in their daily lives. We must take responsibility to carry this message to them.

Do you have a neighbor who is lonely? Offer your friendship. Do you have a neighbor who is chronically ill? Offer to help. Do you have a neighbor who is angry and enjoys intimidating? Even here, offer yourself as a sounding board. I have had all these experiences. In the best scenario your lonely neighbor will accept your friendship, your neighbor who is chronically ill will accept your assistance, and your angry neighbor will accept your giving that person help to see things more positively. If you are not graced with acceptance, pray for that person that God in his mercy will help your neighbor in her/his need.


This is especially important at this time of the year because early this month Lent begins. Lent is forty

days before Easter excluding Sundays. Sundays are for celebrating the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. The rest of the Lenten season is devoted to deepening our prayer lives and studying Bibles and meditating on its words and their meaning. For us as Protestants, Lent is not for giving up something so much as it is for choosing something to help us focus the importance of Jesus in our lives.

Many people have no idea what to choose. I suggest simple things, such as not being critical of a family member for forty days, refraining from overeating, perhaps not over spending beyond a reasonable budget for yourself. You may see my suggestions as the same as giving up something for Lent. What I hope for us is that we lay aside some bad habits and bring into our lives something helpful and positive.

May this Lenten season be a reverent but joyful experience as we prepare for Easter.



- Gayle McCreery, Adult Discipleship, reported we will be having a study class starting after Ash Wednesday and running through Holy Week meeting on Wednesdays at 6:30pm.
- Jerry McCreery, Finance chair, reported we are in need of people to help perform our audit. If you are interested please contact Jerry.
- Outreach chair, Jim Thompson provided the council handouts detailing some of our current missions and information about possible future missions. Also, our **Sunday Dinner** church organization is progressing well and we are currently planning on starting in May. Jim was beyond pleased with the congregation's generous food donations for the school's Backpack for Buddies.
- Dave Wolfe, Trustees, reported that the **steeple** top is going to be taken off about 2 feet below the cross and some panels saved. The rest will be sold. The top portion can then be displayed. We are getting a new copier due to Ricoh's inability to be able to service the current copier and cost of the maintenance plan.

- Worship, Jane Farmer and Carol Craig, let us know that the congregation will be receiving a devotion booklet for the Lenten season. With so many children at junior church, we will be needing additional help. You may let Jane or Carol know if you would like to help.
- Jennifer Lodge, Pre-School, let us know enrollment for church member families and current students started Feb. 5<sup>th</sup> and open enrollment on Feb. 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Youth Director, Greg Dolce', reported that 14 students were going on the Winter Retreat Feb. 15-17. The name of our youth group chosen by the students is BAY (Baltimore Area Youth). Greg is working with the Sunday school teachers on a new curriculum and is trying to get 2 more leaders for each class so that they may rotate.

#### CarePortal brings the needs of hurting children and families in your community to your attention. Child welfare workers uncover the needs. CarePortal makes local churches aware, giving them a realtime opportunity to respond. Nationwide, 1,780 churches are involved. CarePortal helps churches equip themselves to be the church.

CarePortal has helped 35,665 children in

19 states. Child welfare professionals identify the needs of children and share them with local churches enrolled in CarePortal. Every response, whether meeting physical or relational needs, helps children and families.

In Fairfield County, the following churches are in the CarePortal ministry:

Life Church, Lancaster Vineyard, X Church, Pickerington Nazarene, Epithany Lutheran, Victory Hill and Christ UMC. Churches are presented with a family or child situation. The need is presented with the hope churches can respond. Churches are encouraged to pray for the situation.

#### One of the basic premises of CarePortal is that everyone does not grow up the same. That poverty and family crises are like a "house of cards." One little arePo "wind" and things fall apart. As of February, 2019, 50 teenagers (ages 14-18) are in Fairfield County Child Protective Services. Four are

their own. At 18, these kids are given \$500 and released from Protective Services. An interesting note is that getting housing when you're18 can be very difficult. As of February, 2019, 98% of all rentals in Fairfield County are occupied without mentioning rental costs.

There is not a fee for the class, unless you need a CPR card which is \$5.00 although donations to the Basil Fire Department are welcomed. This opportunity is open to the community – if you know someone who might be interested please have them contact Mardi 614-256-0566.

The Safety Ministry Team still has Drug Disposal Kits available at the Connection Center. This is a way to safely

dispose of any medications/prescriptions that are just taking up space in your medicine cabinets, night stands, etc. The Basil Fire Department has graciously donated these for our distribution into the community.

The Safety Ministry Team is now responsible for the back ground screening required by the Safe Sanctuaries Policy for Children/Youth and Vulnerable Adults at CUMC. The policy indicates that a back ground screening should be updated every 5 years. If it is indicated that a back ground screening is needed - you will receive an email from Trusted Employees that includes a link for you to access their website and complete the application and authorization forms.


