So just how do those trainers get these giant animals to do such things? The answer is remarkably simple: positive encouragement. In essence, they praise and affirm good results!

Though I've never swam with a giant whale, I do believe that there is an important lesson for all of us to consider. When was the last time you saw someone in our church family do something outstanding and worth praising? When was the last time you paid someone a compliment for something that helped us succeed in our mission of making new disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world?

Too often, a little of our human nature creeps in and looks for things we don't like and would rather criticize. Instead, try looking from a more positive perspective. Catch someone doing something well and thank them for it! Encouragement can be just as contagious as criticism, and it is so much better to spread good news than bad.

Does this seem too good to be true? It seems that the Apostle Paul had some pretty glowing things to say

to each of you.

In the months preceding my coming to be with you here at Christ Church, I must tell you how grateful I am to see the encouragement you bring to one another and brought also to me and my wife, Tricia. Each month, joy filled my soul reading of our life together in the pages of the monthly newsletter. You have worked faithfully and diligently in the months of transition with Rev. Imagine a short, but powerful service with warm welcomes, hospitality, a meal, conversation, worship and communion! Welcome to the new **Sunday Supper** – a special service where everyone will "Belong. Be Loved. Be Fed."

We know that when people gather at God's Table (a sacred and time-honored tradition), doubters and disciples share in a tradition that's been practiced for over 2000 years. We want everyone to experience and share the love of Jesus, as we live our lives like him!

The goal of Sunday Supper is to offer a simple worship experience for those preferring a different type of devotion and connection to God. One of our board members requested that I emphasize the collaborative nature of Good Neighbors in the Village. This group, now fully 6 years old, does not belong to any one church in our community. While our official address is 700 S. Main St. (Christ United Methodist Church), where we have office space, Good Neighbors has always been a partnership among multiple churches as evidenced by its participants. We have our own tax-exempt number, our own board, and our own by-laws, policies and procedures. Just in case you were unclear about any of that.

While the Baltimore Stars (chair volleyball team) started their season of league play in April, the After School Program is entering the final stretch of its third year. Both of these Good Neighbors efforts, in addition to Wednesday lunch, serve vulnerable populations in the community in keeping with our focus and mission. Both programs have come to be respected and relied on to fill needs that were not being met before Good Neighbors heard the call and followed. Like all of our programs, these are run by volunteers and powered by the Holy Spirit, with funding that seems to arrive without much begging on our part.

Right now we are gearing up for a trial summer effort that will replace the "feeding site" model of the Summer Lunch Program we have pursued for the last six years or so. We plan to use a "food box" approach. Volunteers will shop for quality food (fruits, vegetables, whole grains, meat, some dairy) and allow enrolled families to fill their box with items their families will eat. When families come for their food, we will have other volunteers available to help them think through what meals they can prepare that will be economical, healthful and satisfying, and to answer food preparation

for our efforts.

Isn't it interesting that when Jesus left his followers here on earth He said it was a good thing for Him to go. Why? Because he could send the Holy Spirit (see the list of some of His characteristics in the above scripture) to dwell within each of us at the same time, while He, in human form, could only be with a limited number of people at a time! The Greek word for Holy Spirit is "Encourager." He wanted us to be strengthened, encouraged, helped; so He sent us the Holy Spirit. He knew how important it is for His people to be lifted up vs. put down so we don't give up in our walk of faith.

I'm so grateful for the Holy Spirit in my life, for His edification. I think it is also great when we encourage one another.

"We send textbooks, other reference books, and leisure reading (paperback and hardcover novels, picture books, etc.) that are less than 15 years old and in great condition (no cover damage, compromised bindings, etc.). Picture/ reading books for primary aged children are greatly desired. We send French books (not instructional French books) of all categories and ages. School supplies (like pens, paper, rulers, etc.) are also desired.

We do not send Spanish or any other foreign language books. As we are interested in sending books that are culturally relevant to an African learner, please do not donate books about American History/ Government/ holidays/culture/self-help. We no longer ship academic journals, used encylopedia sets or National Geographic magazines."

Sunday, June 9 everyone is invited to wear red in celebration of our Pentecost celebration.

Churches that employ liturgical colors generally use red on Pentecost as a symbol of power and fire of the Spirit. For Christians, Pentecost is a holiday on which we commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit. Before

the events of the first Pentecost, which came a few weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningful called "the church". Thus, from a historical point of view, Pentecost is the day on which the church was started. This is also true from a spiritual perspective, since the Spirit brings the church into existence and enlivens. Thus, Pentecost is the church's birthday!

Mortgage Reduction Challenge

Jerry McCreery, Chair of Finance made the following announcement Sunday, March 17: The late Dale and Joan Landis will give a gift of \$100,000 to be applied to the Family Life Center mortgage principal. This gift is contingent on matching funds from church members. The church will receive this gift if we match it dollar to dollar. The maximum gift is \$100,000. If we fall short of the \$100,000 and match a portion, the gift will match our donations. We can donate more than the \$100,000 gift, but donations over \$100,000 will not be matched.

The challenge to match the gift dollars will run through December 31, 2019. During this time the church will continue to make the monthly mortgage payment. Our matching dollars will be above and beyond our 2019 pledges and regular giving. Check or cash donations can be put in the Sunday collection plate and must be **designated** to the **mortgage principal** either on the giving envelope or check. Donations will be tracked and communicated during the challenge.

At the end of each month, all designated Mortgage Reduction Challenge donations will be forwarded to the mortgage company and applied to the mortgage principal. As of April 21 we have a total of \$7,930.00. Look for the " Challenge Thermometer" out in the Narthex area!
