FAITH FORMATION

Recently Pope Francis released a new apostolic exhortation entitled "Rejoice and Be Glad." He is encouraging us that holiness is for everyone, including our children. It is definitely worth your time. Pray, read it once, and then read it again and think about how it speaks to you as a parent.

Here are some selected passages I enjoyed: "Do not be afraid of holiness. It will take away none of your energy, vitality or joy. On the contrary, you will become what the Father had in mind when he created you, and you will be faithful to your deepest self. To the extent that each Christian grows in holiness, he or she will bear greater fruit for our world. Do not be afraid to set your sights higher, to allow yourself to be loved and liberated by God. Do not be afraid to let yourself be guided by the Holy Spirit. Holiness does not make you less human, since it is an encounter between your weakness and the power of God's grace. For in the words of León Bloy, when all is said and done, "the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint". (32-34)

There is a lot to think about just in those brief statements! Try finding a way of working Pope Francis' encouraging messages into your conversations with your youth this week. Our young people are hungry for the love and acceptance that God offers so freely. At the same time they face many of the same fears about themselves that you and I face. We need to challenge them to work at becoming a saint just as we need to challenge ourselves, but be sure to look for opportunities to tell them how proud you are of them as you see them growing in holiness.

Could you please remember our confirmation students in your prayers this week? Many are selecting sponsors and confirmation names right now. We are past the halfway point of the program. Some of them are having the "a-ha moment" when they really start to fall in love with their faith. It's a beautiful sight. Jimmy and I are privileged to be part of their journey. Thank you for all you are doing to help them in preparing to receive the sacrament of confirmation!

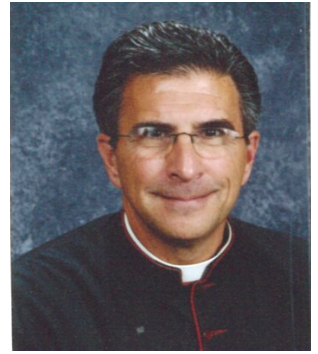
