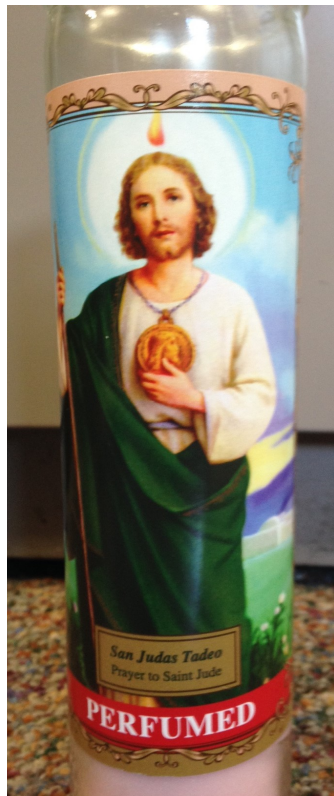

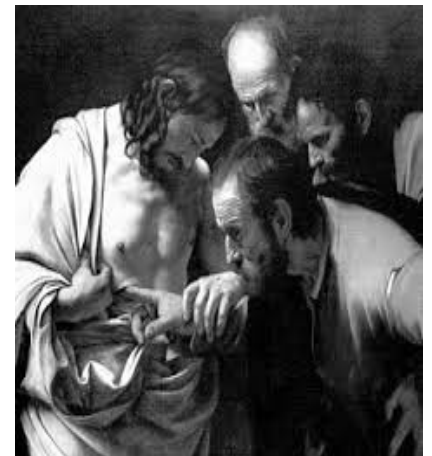

From Msgr. Frank Chiodo

Friends,

This month marks the 50th anniversary of Pope Paul VI's encyclical on the value of human life, *Humanae Vitae*. It is an important teaching—and a prophetic one.

The teaching promotes and proclaims the value of human life, from womb to tomb—and highlights the importance of recognizing the role we play in cooperating with God in being co-creators with Him in bringing new life into the world.

If we look at the past decades since the promulgation of the letter from the pope, much of what the pope predicted has come to pass.

The pope cautions that if the teaching with regard to regulation of births is ignored, widespread use of contraception would lead to “conjugal infidelity and the general lowering of morality”. Just note the rates of divorce, abortions, family breakdowns, abuse within the family, venereal diseases, and out of wedlock births. All have increased astronomically over the past 50 years.

The Archbishop of Philadelphia, Archbishop Chaput, puts it this way in an article he wrote: “The birth control pill has not been the only factor in the unraveling of morality. But it has played a major role. The cultural revolution since 1968 has been driven in part by transformed attitudes towards sex. Pope Paul was right. Respect for women has diminished to the point that women are seen too often as mere instruments of selfish enjoyment, and no longer as man's respected and beloved companion. The pope suggests that contraception has released males—to a historically unprecedented degree—from responsibility for their sexual aggression. Many feminists have attacked the Catholic Church for her alleged disregard of women, but the Church in *Humanae Vitae* identified and rejected sexual exploitation of women years before the message entered the cultural mainstream. Again Pope Paul was right.”

“Pope Paul warned that contraception would mislead humans into thinking that they had unlimited dominion over their bodies, turning the human being into the object of his or her own intrusive power. In vitro fertilization, cloning, genetic manipulation and embryo experimentation are all descendants of contraceptive technology.

So what are we going to do about it? In the words of Archbishop Chaput of Philadelphia: “If the pope was right about so many of the consequences deriving from contraception, it is because he was right about contraception itself. In seeking to become whole again as persons and as a people of faith, we need to open our hearts to the teaching of the Church. Jesus said the truth would make us free. *Humanae Vitae* is filled with truth. It is therefore the key to our freedom.
