Fascinating Facts of our Faith

THE MIRACLE OF THE SUN

Miracle of the Sun, October 13, 1917 -

The Blessed Virgin has appeared numerous times to chosen people on earth. Some of the best known apparitions are Guadalupe, Mexico, 1531 Quito, Ecuador 1610; LaSalette, France 1846; Lourdes, Frances 1858; Fatima, Portugal 1917; and Akita, Japan 1973. Miracles always accompanied these apparitions during or after. But only at Fatima, was there a miracle of such magnitude that it places that apparition in a category by itself.

The great miracle was promised by the Blessed Virgin in answer to a request by the 3 shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos age 11, Francisco Marto age 9 and his sister Jacinta age 7. The children asked for a sign to prove she was appearing, as even their families and others did not want to believe. The apparitions, each month for six months, were only visible to the children. The Blessed Virgin told the children, "In October I will ...perform a miracle all shall see, so that they will believe." And What A Miracle It Was!! The best estimate of the number on hand to witness the miracle was, 50,000 to 70,000 people. Many walked from towns and villages several miles distant, caring food for their journey. Rain drenched the pilgrims as they patiently waited. Suddenly the sky opened up, almost a miracle in itself, as a prelude to the miracle that was to come. Suddenly the sun began to move, it danced in the sky, spun like a wheel of fire. Yet, all could gaze upon it without endangering their eyes. It took on different colors and as it spun the various rays of color were visible on the ground and on the people. Many dropped to their knees in fear as it appeared the sun was plummeting out of control to the earth. The length of time was estimated to be about 7 or 8 minutes. When the sun returned to its fixed place in the Universe, the people noticed their clothing was completely dry. Yet, no one was harmed by the heat, perhaps a miracle within a miracle. Of the many messages given by Lucia (Sister Lucia) Dec'd 2005, all of which are important. I beg your indulgence, as I include three most fitting this occasion of the anniversary of the Great Miracle.

"NO ONE HAS PAID ANY ATTENTION"

"Father, the Most Holy Virgin is very sad because no one has paid any attention to Her message, neither the good nor the bad. The good continue on their way but without giving any importance to Her Message. The bad, not seeing the punishment of God actually falling upon them, continue their life of sin without even caring about the message. But believe me, Father, God will chastise the world and this will be a terrible manner. The punishment from Heavens is imminent".

RUSSIA THE SCOURGE OF GOD

"Tell them, Father, that many times the Most Holy Virgin told my cousins Francisco and Jacinta, as well as myself that many nations will disappear from the face of the earth. She said that Russia will be the instrument of chastisement chosen by Heaven to punish the whole world if we do not beforehand obtain the conversion of that poor nation."

THE LAST REMEDIES

"...She said to my cousins as well as to myself that God is giving two last remedies to the world. These are the Holy Rosary and Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These are the last two remedies which signify that there will be no others."

FATHER WE SHOULD NOT WAIT

"Father, we should not wait for an appeal to the world to come from Rome on the part of the Holy Father, to do penance. Nor should we wait for the call to penance to come from our bishops in our diocese, nor from the religious congregations. No!...Now, it is necessary for each one of us to begin to reform himself spiritually. Each person must not only save his own soul but also all the souls that God has placed on our path..."
