C. STUDY REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

Eligibility

The District Ministerial Studies Board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open to local ministers and licensed ministers pursuing elder or deacon ordination. Refer to the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* (latest edition) for specific requirements for each course of study. (*Manual*, pars. 527).

How to Enroll in the Course of Study

Persons wishing to enroll in the Course of Study (COS) should visit the WaPac District website "Called to Ministry Checklist."

Transcripts must be sent to the district office, Board of Ministry registrar, Sharon Kester (sharon@wapacnaz.org) so they may be evaluated as to placement in the Course of Study.

Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts university or Nazarene Bible College and, if possible, Nazarene Theological Seminary. The modules for the Course of Study are also available on-line through Northwest Nazarene University, Nazarene Bible College and Washington Pacific Kaleidoscope, Spanish and Samoan CLT classes. Other educational options need to be reviewed by the Board of Ministry to ensure credit. If an applicant is not established in a pastorate and is reasonably unencumbered, it will do both him or her a great service if the board of his or her local church will insist that the candidate be trained for the ministry in the church's educational institutions.

We understand that in the midst of ministry, education can demand a great deal of time and energy. We would emphasize that a call to minister is a call to become a lifelong learner.

Requirements of Modular Study

- A. Each candidate must become familiar with the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* before enrolling, in order to better understand the process and details of the entire program. We are recommending that each church purchase a *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* and make this available to prospective students. We also recommend that each pastor become familiar with ministry internship so they will be able to mentor students in their own church. These books may be obtained from the Nazarene Publishing House.
- B. Paragraph 530.3 states that all applicants desiring to renew a district license "shall have completed at least two courses in a validated course of study." It makes clear that if the student has not done so "the license may be renewed by the district assembly only upon submission of a written explanation for this failure. Such explanation shall be satisfactory to the District Board of Ministry and approved by the general superintendent presiding." All modules should be in process by **December 31**, in order to apply on the current assembly year.
- C. College, seminary, and Bible College students are reminded to request the registrar to send notification of completed work so that accurate records of student progress can be made.
- D. College and seminary students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with the requirements of the course of study. The final transcript at graduation will be evaluated by the District Board of Ministry.

Mentor / Student Relationship

Supervised field education is a key component of ministerial development. In most cases your local pastor will serve the mentor role. In situations where a district licensed minister is serving as pastor, a mentor will be selected by the District Board of Ministry

Ordination: A Privilege, Not a Right

While the Church of the Nazarene requires that certain educational preparation and certain ministry requirements be fulfilled before a person can be ordained, it is understood that completion of these requirements does not automatically qualify a candidate for ordination. The Board of Ministry will want to examine all spiritual, theological, personal and professional issues pertaining to a candidates fitness for ministry.

Opening Service

Sunday Evening, April 23, 2017

6:00 pm

The service was opened with the song, "Sing Sing Sing" and a reading From 1 Corinthians. District Superintendent, Jerry Kester welcomed us to the work of assembly and opened with prayer expressing desire that we would engage in the work that brings glory to the name of God. Dan Lang returned to the platform and led us in song with "My Heart is Yours" and "Ever Be."

Debra Voelker came and introduced our missionary speaker, Monica Boseff. Monica shared with humor and impact as she told of her calling to her current ministry with those who have come out of human trafficking. She challenged the assembly to take the authority we have been given by Almighty God to be the hands and feet of Christ in our world. If we have the authority of God, what do we need to fear?

Dan Lang led us in two more songs of worship as we sang together, "Holy, Holy, Holy" and "No Longer Slaves."

Seattle City Project Video and presentation by Paul Johnson. The district has commissioned Paul (and others) to think strategically on how the Church of the Nazarene might better serve and reach the city of Seattle with the message of Jesus Christ. The plan is to do so by treating it as a mission field. Teams of missionaries will be sent to seek out relationships and foster community through missional discipleship. Paul asked us to pray for the ministry to the city of Seattle and to pray for God to raise up the right people to be missionaries to the city of Seattle.

Rev. Kester introduced our jurisdictional General Superintendent, Dr. JK Warrick to the assembly and then prayed for the first offering. The offertory was led by Hugo and Rina Castillo and a team of liturgical dancers led the congregation in singing "Beautiful Name."

Rev. Bill Bowers, host pastor, welcomed delegates and guests to the Mountain View Church of the Nazarene and thanked the assembly for gathering together to do the work of the church in Washington Pacific District. Rev. Jerry Kester took some time to introduce the new pastors on the district. (Nelly Borek – Kelso Vida Abundante, Colin Duffy – Lakewood New Hope, Meamoni Faualo – Fife Living Water Samoan, Aaron Gay – Everett First, Samuel Hong – Spanaway Anointing Korean, Brandon Marten – Vancouver Simple Life, Jason Matters – Ridgefield, Steve Minnis – Stevenson The Bridge, Mike Morgan – Woodland, Sherwin Rulloda – Bremerton, Jon Wren - Snoqualmie) as well as give opportunity for pastors to introduce new staff members.

A vote was taken to accept the Board of Ministry Report (D1-D3) by a show of hands. The vote was unanimous to accept the report.

Dr. Warrick introduced Rev. Jerry Kester for his report to the district assembly. Rev. Kester emphasized that the way that we will complete our mission of establishing and resourcing healthy churches only by doing it together as he shared insights from his report (C1-C4). The assembly responded to his report with a round of applause and a standing ovation.

Dr. Warrick asked Sharon to come to the platform and Sharon thanked the assembly. Debra Voelker and Ben Norris presented gifts to Sharon and Jerry on behalf of the district.

According to the instructions provided for in the *Manual of the Church of the Nazarene*, Dr. Warrick called for a vote to re-elect Rev. Jerry Kester to another 4-year term as District Superintendent to the Washington Pacific Church of the Nazarene. A ballot was distributed and instructions given for a yes or no vote. Prayer preceded the vote.

Representatives from the Mt. Baker (E1-E4) Capitol (video, E53-E61) zones were invited to give their reports.

Dr. Warrick drew attention to the Report of the Nominating Committee (D4-D5) and sample ballots for Northwest Nazarene University Trustees, The District Advisory Board, The SDMI chair and council as well as the NMI council. (D6-D7). *Vote was taken for the adoption of the report of the Nominating Committee by a show of hands. The motion passed.*

The ballots for SDMI Chair, SDMI council, NMI council, District Advisory Board, and Northwest Nazarene University Trustees, were distributed with the instructions to take a few moments to look through the bios listed in the delegate packets before voting. Two

Tony's report was received by the assembly with applause.

Dr. Warrick called for the results of the ballot to re-elect Rev. Jerry Kester as the Superintendent of the Washington Pacific District be read.

District Secretary Rev. Ben Norris read the results as follows:

The result of the vote were: Total Votes cast- 329. Needed to re-elect – 219. **Yes votes-** 327, **No votes-** 1, **Void ballots** – 1. Another ovation was given to Rev. Kester in response to the announcement of his re-election.

Ben Norris made announcements regarding the ordination service. Morning session was dismissed by Rev. Jerry Kester and the assembly was adjourned at 12:00pm.

The service was opened with greetings from Rev. Jerry Kester.

The Mountain View worship team opened with the classic song "Tis' So Sweet To Trust in Jesus" then in a rousing version of "The Only Name (Yours Will Be)." Rev. Kester returned to the platform to introduce and charge the individuals receiving their first district license: Nelly F. Borek, Janet L Daniels, Scott A Fox, Wiliam Isaac Gartung, Frieda A Goode, Christopher R Hatch, Ryan S. Hill, Johanna R Kirk, Kryamer J. Lorig, Sineva M. (Ortira) Lu, Robert L. McGraw, Bobbie N. McMasters, Asiasi Maifiti, Michael R. Morgan, Gary R. Munson, Randy A. Porter, Andrew J. Strutz, Michael A. Velilla, Peter H. White.

Dr. Warrick and Rev. Kester recognized the retiring ministers from the Wa-Pac District: Rev. Gordon A. Sr. and Mary Jane Beell, Rev. Dr. Robert and Connie Dunn, Rev. Richard and Evie Huling, Rev. Dixie and Jim Nash.

Dr. Warrick came to the podium to share a statement of purpose for the act of ordination and the power and significance of this ritual. He reminded us that this is a sacred, but not always a solemn ritual, for it is cause for celebration. He then shared an opening prayer of invocation.

The worship team then led the congregation in reciting and then singing the Apostle's Creed.

To the singing of "By Faith," the candidates for ordination were welcomed to the front row of the assembly, led by Rev. Dr. Ben Norris.

Rev. Dr. Ben Norris presented the ordinands to the gathered assembly: R. Susan Coffin, Asha L. Fuller, Geoffrey S. Harmon, Frederick A. Humber, Karen E. Humber, Dean E. Jenkins, Jayme M. Lenker, Steven J. Minnis, Amanda C. Montgomery, Mark R. Mounts, Nichole M. Rech, David Rocha-Gomez.

Dr. J.K. Warrick then received the ordinands and affirmed their efforts and work to get to this place in their ministry journey. The ordinands were then asked a series of questions

of examination, after which they responded audibly, affirming their journey with Christ and their calling to the ministry of gospel of Jesus Christ. Dr. Warrick then offered a blessing of God's presence upon the lives of those who are being ordained. Rev. Jeff Austin then read Manual Paragraphs 502.1-502.6 outlining the duties and qualifications of the minister in the Church of the Nazarene. In reply to the reading, the Elders Choir led the congregation in the well-known hymn "How Firm of Foundation." Following the Elder's Choir, Rev. Gary Miles read Hebrews 12:1-3 and 2 Timothy 4:1-5. As a response to the scripture the worship team led the assembly in the song "Never Once."

Dr. Warrick then delivered a sermon focusing on the character of the God we serve as described by Paul in 2 Timothy 4. The God we serve is a God of peace in the midst of trials, challenges and difficult days. We serve a God of peace who gives us assurance of our call. Furthermore, God is the God who equips us in preparation for ministry (God gives us big dreams) but also provides the means to accomplish that to which God calls. Dr. Warrick then encouraged the ordinands and the gathered community to be responsive to the dreams God places in our hearts and to trust that God will provide when we step forward into those dreams. He joked to the new ordinands to "not let us old guys kill your dreams!"

Dr. Warrick then took time to lead us through the process of the ordination ritual, praying and commissioning each of the new ordination candidates. The hands of the currently ordained elders were laid upon each candidate and each were prayed for and blessed as they were ordained with elders orders and had credentials recognized in the Church of the Nazarene.

Following the ordination ritual, Dr. Warrick presented each of the ordinands with their certificate of ordination encouraging them to look at it often and remember the call of God and the commissioning of the church.

NNU President, Joel Pearsall, came to the platform and made a presentation of Scott Stearman's sculpture, *The Calling*, to each of the ordinands, hoping it will serve as a reminder of the significant ritual of ordination and, more importantly, the call that led them to ministry in Christ's church. Rev. Fred Fullerton then presented to the ordinands a dictionary of theology to serve as a tool for ministry in the years to come. Following the presentation, the ordinands were invited to make their way to the reception. Those who had gathered were invited to join them once the service was dismissed.

The assembly was adjourned until 8:30 am the following morning.

Morning Business Session: Tuesday, April 25th 8:30 am

The morning session began with worship as lead by the Olympia Mountain View worship team who led us in the Hymn "Holy, Holy, Holy" and "Everlasting God."

Dr. Warrick led the assembly in a devotional from Romans 12:1-2; reminding the assembly of the transforming power of the gospel to deliver us from sin and to establish us in holiness. We are established as we are wholly surrendered to the purpose of God, are fully transformed, and faithfully demonstrate that the will of God is acceptable and good and perfect; no matter the circumstance. He closed by asking the gathered assembly if we are fully surrendered, being transformed and do we bear witness to the truth that the will of God is good, acceptable and perfect? He then led us in prayer.

The Metro North Zone (E11-E16) brought a video report from their zone about where they see God working in and through their local church bodies.

Chuck Judd brought a report from the Metro South Zone (E22-E27) highlighting the ways in which God is at work in the various places throughout the Zone. Then each of the pastors from each church shared.

A video was shared by Paul Johnson highlighting what is happening with the Seattle City Project as churches in the Seattle area attempt to connect to their communities with the love of Christ.

NMI President, Debra Voelker, brought her report before the assembly (C5-C7). The assembly received her report enthusiastically with applause and a standing ovation for her leadership in keeping the global mission of God before the district.

Jerry Kester spoke highly of Debra's leadership and called for a 'yes' or 'no' vote and the ballots to be distributed to the delegates to the assembly. The vote was taken and ballots collected for counting by the board of tellers.

Jerry Kester asked Jan Green to come to the platform to recognize her 18 years of service to Washington Pacific Church of the Nazarene as the office administrative assistant. He expressed appreciation and gratitude to her willingness to learn new tasks and her tireless efforts on behalf of the district. He presented a plaque to her recognizing her 18 years of service to the WaPac Church of the Nazarene. Jerry then noted that the District Advisory board desired to pay her for the month of May as well as pay her moving expenses as she relocates to Oklahoma and begins her new job at Southern Nazarene University. He then prayed a prayer of blessing and thanksgiving for her ministry.

Jan expressed her thanks to the district for their support and expressed her love for Jerry and Sharon. The assembly responded with enthusiastic applause and a standing ovation.

The Olympic Peninsula (E47-E52) zone presented a video report of God's work in their churches zones in the past year. The Snohomish Zone (E5-E10) followed by reading one another's reports of God's transforming grace.

Rev. Kester introduced a Church Planting Video highlighting the efforts of the WaPac district to embed church planting into our DNA. Brandon Marten then came to the platform to share the district vision of reaching 1% of the population of Western Washington through the ministry/missionary/planting ministry of the Church of the Nazarene. He emphasized that what we need (what God needs) is not more resources, but more willing people.

Ev Tustin came to the platform to speak to the partnership with the Willow Creek Global Leadership Summit to be held at Kent Hillside Church August 10-11, 2017. Those interested were invited to contact Tony Johnson for more information or to register.

Dr. Warrick drew our attention to the treasurer's report from Steve Walden (C14-C20). *Motion made to accept the treasurer's report. Second. Motion carried.*

Steve Walden also spoke to the report of the finance committee to the assembly (D12-D17). Noted that the Seattle Project was added as a line item to the budget. Line 812 (previous year's surplus) was added to reflect the addition of the Seattle City Project and balance the budget. *A Motion was made to accept. Seconded (Before the vote, Dr. Warrick drew attention to the Ministerial Support section D16). Motion Carried.*

Dr. Warrick drew attention to the report from the District Advisory Board (D10) and asked Rev. Kester to comment on any items of particular significance, none was given.

Dr. Warrick asked that the report be received by a 'yeah' or 'nay' vote. The assembly affirmed receipt of report.

The Education Committee report was received by a 'yes' or 'no' vote. Report was received.

Approval of the property's board report received by a yes or no vote. Report was received.

Dr. Warrick called for the results of the vote for the re-election of Debra Voelker as NMI President. The vote was read as follows: *Total votes cast 311, 310 yes, 1 ballot invalid.* Rev. Kester then prayed for Debra Voelker.

Dr. Warrick then called for the results of the ballots taken the previous day (SDMI Chair/Council, SDMI council – D6 and District Advisory board and Northwest Nazarene University Trustees- D7) were read as follows: First Ballot (D6) Read as follows: Total Ballots Cast: 331, 1 ballot invalid/spoiled. SDMI District Chair: Joe Crosby (140), **James Matthews (184)** SDMI Members at large voted as a "Yes" or "No" ballot for the group (Justin Barksdale, Pat Crane, Jeff Borden, Shaun Mattson: **Yes (324)**, No (0)). NMI District Council voted as a "yes" or "no" ballot for the council in its entirety (Jean Calman, Karen Duranceau, Rene Hays, Crystal Howell-Burke, Fred Humber, Tom Lafrenz, Susan Lewis, Debbie Lund, Marian J. Smith, Dennis Spinnie, Shelly Wagner, Cindy Whiteman): **Yes (329)**, No (1).

Elected were: SDMI Chair – James Matthews, a ‘yes’ for the District Council, and a ‘yes’ for the NMI council.

Second Ballot (D7) Read as Follows: Total ballots cast: 331, **District Advisory Board:** Elder - Craig Laughlin (134), Larry Rounsley (111), **David Rodes (215), Dave Ness (164).** Layperson: **Dick Halverson (159), Randy Freeby (156),** Scott Cantrell (130), Neal Weaver (147).

Elected were Ministers- David Rodes and Dave Ness. Laypersons- Dick Halverson, Randy Freeby.

NNU Trustees: Elder - **Bill Bowers (229),** Craig Laughlin (97). Layperson – Telfer Griffith (134), **Jenna Kearns (161), Karen Ball (161),** Joseph Lanham (151).

Elected were Elder- Bill Bowers. Laypersons- Jenna Kearns and Karen Ball.

The assembly then had the opportunity to hear from Rev. Simon Jothi who was the missionary speaker at last year’s assembly. He joined us via Skype. Debra asked him to update us on how things have been going for him over the past year. Technical difficulties hindered hearing his update. Deborah asked that Rev. Ben Norris come and pray for Rev. Jothi and his ministry in Southern Asia.

Monica Boseff was invited to the platform to share again. Rev. Kester reminded the assembly that we would be taking an offering in a few minutes for Monica. Monica spoke of always giving the girls in her ministry the best, not the castoffs. What we receive, we also give. She also encouraged the assembly to not simply pray for the victims, but pray that the traffickers might come to know the transforming power of Christ as well. She ended with an emphatic call for prayer for all the victims of trafficking who are shouting for rescue...will we answer?

Dr. Warrick received the offering for Monica and Open Door Ministries inviting the assembly to give generously. He then prayed for the offering, for Monica and for the Open Door Ministry in Romania.

Darrell Leber was invited to the platform to share about the Jesus Film project. Darrell highlighted the excitement over the 20th anniversary of the Jesus Film Harvest partners.

Rev. Kester invited NNU President Joel Pearsall to the platform to give the Northwest Nazarene University report. President Pearsall shared some recent achievements of NNU students and shared a video about the culture at NNU and the *Century Two* Campaign. President Pearsall invited Dr. Fred Fullerton to the platform to share as well.

Dr. Warrick announced that there are proposed changes to the bylaws of the University, and that any changes to the bylaws must be ratified by the district assembly. The President of Northwest Nazarene University, Joel Pearsall, presented the changes adopted by the board of trustees to the assembly. President Pearsall informed the assembly that any changes to the NNU bylaws adopted by the board of trustees must also be ratified by 2/3 (5 of 7) of the District Assemblies in the districts that make up the Northwest Educational Region.

President Pearsall then walked the assembly through the changes that were passed by the NNU board of Trustees at their 2017 Spring Meeting. There were minor changes dealing with the mechanics of the board of trustees (means of notification of meetings and distribution of meeting documents) but the major change was in the makeup of the board. Instead of electing the total board by the assemblies of the 7 districts in the region, the proposed change would replace 5 of the Assembly-elected delegates, with 5 ‘at large’ positions that would be elected by the board of trustees. Additionally, the Board of Trustees would have the discretion to elect one of the 5 “At Large” positions from outside the Northwest Educational region. (This is intended as summary, the full changes can be referenced in the minutes of the NNU Board of Trustees’ spring 2017 minutes).

Motion made to ratify the proposed amendments to the University bylaws as passed by the NNU board of trustees. Second. A vote was taken by a show of hands. The motion carried.

Rev. Jerry Kester then adjourned the meeting for lunch and invited the assembly to reconvene at 1:30.

Tuesday Afternoon Business Session: April 25th at 1:30pm.

Chaplain Mike Boisture was presented an awarded from the Puyallup PD and thanked for his service, as he has to step out to handle an incident for the Police Department.

Tim Westerberg came to the podium and directed the attention of the assembly to the memorial roll (D21) of those we who have passed away this past year and a prayer of remembrance was spoken giving thanks to God for the lives of those who have passed.

Megan Wighamam was invited to the podium to give the report of the NYI president (C8). Megan presented very exciting statistics about camp attendance and NYI ministry over the past year.

Debra Voelker came to the podium to present missions awards to the churches that met (and many who exceeded) their goals of 5.5% towards WEF. She and Rev. Kester read the names as pastors came forward to receive their certificates and receive a thank you from Dr. Warrick.

Margaret Scott was invited to the podium to give a report from the Nazarene Compassionate Alliance Northwest.

David Sanchez was invited to the podium to give a report of Hispanic Ministries in the Washington Pacific District. He directed the assembly to his report (C12) for all the details of his report. A video was shown to highlight the Wa-Pac Hispanic ministries.

Taulima and the Samoan Ministers were invited to the podium to give update on the happenings in the Wa-Pac Samoan congregations.

Jerry invited Samuel and Esther Hong to the podium to recognize and thank him for his willingness to come as a missionary from Korea. Chris Wighamam and David Rodes were invited up as well and David was asked to pray for this work and these individuals.

Dr. Warrick yielded the chair to DS Jerry Kester and thanked the assembly for the honor of being with WaPac the past two years. Jerry thanked Dr. Warrick and prayed for he and Patty.

Video reports were brought from the Mt Saint Helens (E62-E71) and the Gorge (E79-E85) zones.

Debra Voelker welcomed Rob North of Africa Nazarene University to the podium to share a "Missionary Moment." His report outlined the mission, ministry and growth of ANU since its beginning in '94 with 64 students to over 4,000 students currently!

Rev. Kester invited Luann McBride & Becky Miller to the podium to share the chaplain's report. Luann invited several chaplains to share a story of God's work from the past year.

The final business for the day was a video report from the Lake Washington (E17-E21) missional zone and a verbal report from the churches on the Green River Zone (E28-E35).

Rev. Jerry Kester took the opportunity (with the permission of the assembly) to present Monica Boseff with a check for \$30,000 received in an offering for Open Door Ministries in Bucharest.

Rev. Jerry Kester asked for the assembly's permission to allow the minutes to be edited as needed prior to submission. The assembly affirmed permission with a 'yeah' vote.

Motion made to adjourn the business of the assembly. Second. Motion carried.

Washington Pacific District assembly adjourned Tuesday April 25th at 3:45pm.

Closing Service: The 74th Assembly of the Washington Pacific District was closed with a fervent sermon from Rev. Jerry Kester about unity in the body. We are 'one body' not

merely because we all have a part to play (though we do) but because we are made one by the Spirit of God. Only as we operate in that Spirit can we hope to be 'whole' and 'complete' together. We are "better together." The eagle may fly high, but geese fly further because they fly together!

The 74th Annual Session of the Washington Pacific District was adjourned at 5:00 pm.

V. REPORTS

A. DISTRICT OFFICERS

1. District Superintendent

The Body of Christ is one of the Apostle Paul's favorite metaphors to describe the church. In 1 Corinthians 12:12 he says, "Our bodies have many parts, but the many parts make up only one body when they are all put together. So it is with the Body of Christ." At our Minister and Mates' Retreat in October and then again at our Pastor's Day in January, I looked around the room at the 150 pastors who had gathered for retreat and training and was so encouraged by the quality of the leaders on our district. All our "many parts" working together, so that Christ's body is built up, is the way we fulfill our mission of "establishing and resourcing the development of healthy churches." It is through the work of these churches that we can participate with our global Nazarene family to "make Christ-like disciples in the nations."

Local churches on our district come in all different shapes and sizes and represent the primary way we accomplish the mission that God has entrusted to us. Church health, not size, is the most important metric for determining the strength of our district - but healthy things grow. This year our local churches saw 701 people converted, 346 new believers baptized and 490 new members brought into the Church of the Nazarene by profession of faith in Jesus. Statistics tell only part of the story. Without a doubt, attendance patterns have changed and the culture of western Washington can be highly skeptical of the motives of Christians and churches. Sometimes declining statistics reflect a lack of intention and effort, other times they reflect the hardness of the soil where good gospel seed is being faithfully planted. I am grateful to God for the pastors on WaPac who are tilling and planting in all kinds of soil and circumstances. We rejoice with churches where the harvest is coming in and are supportive of situations where it is a time of pruning or preparation. So many of our churches have been in pastoral transition. Last year at assembly, we introduced 11 new pastors and this year, we've added 11 more. We have so many open doors and opportunities in front of us that this is not the time for resignation or discouragement, "Let's not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

There was a time when our church used our natural propensity to compete as a method for church growth. Some might argue that this approach is still a motivating tool inherent in our system - we all want to feel that we are succeeding and winning. While there is little doubt that competition can motivate, Jesus gives us a different example clearly expressed in Philippians 2: "Everyone should look out not only for their own interests, but also for the interests of others. Adopting the same attitude as Christ Jesus..." It is heartening to

see neighboring churches working cooperatively and collaboratively to increase mission effectiveness. When churches use their staff, resources and facilities to initiate enterprise for the sake of the kingdom, without concern for just their “own interests,” something quite beautiful is the result for the body of Christ. This pattern is my prayer for our missional zones and their leaders.

Snoqualmie church was faced with a difficult situation. When Pastor Rick Skeen retired after 18 years, they looked at what they would need. Calculating salary, insurance and the rising cost of housing in the community, severely limited their options. Mike Ford, the leader of the Lake Washington Missional Zone, called to ask if there was anything he could do to help at Snoqualmie. That conversation led to a beautiful collaborative effort where Jon Wren is on staff at Kirkland Life Community AND the pastor at Snoqualmie. The board decided to turn the house next to the church back into a parsonage so that they could contribute more to Jon and Sarah’s income. Churches from around the district were encouraged by Debra Voelker and NMI to come together to support the effort. The “tiny house” is nearly renovated. Pastor Rick Skeen left a legacy of such great relationships in the community that the Assembly of God Church on the Hill donated \$5,000 and volunteers to the parsonage project. It works best when it is not about any one of us, but it is all about the Kingdom. If our journal had more pages, I could write a book about the wonderful way churches are not competing, but cooperating. Missional Zone leaders (page 3) are playing a more significant role than ever. They are at the heart of overcoming isolation that is discouraging and promoting teamwork and vision...so it is with the Body of Christ.

Developing healthy churches and leaders is at the heart of our mission. Over the last 4 years, Dr. Lyle Pointer has given good direction to our vibrant church renewal initiative. As Lyle and Paula move on from their assignment at Mount Vernon, we want to build on the solid foundation that he has established. You will notice that in budgeting for the new year, we’ve combined Vibrant Church Renewal and the Momentum Church Development Network together. We believe that establishing new churches and revitalizing existing ones are two sides of the same coin. So, both church planting and revitalization will be under the Momentum umbrella. Developing healthy churches and leaders is what we’re passionate about. We’ve identified the themes that we believe are important to the health of every church and leader. We will begin to deliver them in the fall. A theme will be taught once a quarter in a two-year cycle allowing someone to join on any theme and begin the conversation. The discussion around each theme will be facilitated by a different pastor on our district who feels passionate about that area. The format will require vulnerability and humility on all our parts as we learn from each other. Leadership development is essential to discipleship and who we are is more important than what we know.

So far, since I’ve been district superintendent, we’ve started 11 new churches, including four new ones this year. I have deeply appreciated Brandon Marten’s passion and encouragement for establishing new churches. He volunteered his time for an entire year touring the district with the message that, “Planting a new church is not as difficult as some may think.” Not only that, but God may be calling some of you to plant healthy new churches. Sometimes, people God is calling to lead a new work don’t believe they have the right education or training. We believe when God is speaking, the question of preparation is just a matter of detail. There are multiple ways to overcome this obstacle that don’t require moving cross country. The call of God is the primary concern. Pastor Shawn DeOrnellis, working with the Federal Way Church, planted The Trinity Church in the Kloshe Illahee community. They began as an outreach of the Federal Way church and as of January are now a Parent Affiliate Congregation. In September, Vancouver Real Life Church, with the help of the entire Columbia River Zone, parented Brandon and Bekah as they launched Simple Life Church of the Nazarene. At the same time, Kelso Abundant Life Church and Pastor Nelly Borek got involved and planted a new Hispanic congregation, Vida Abundante which also launched in September. Through a friendship established by Taulima Oge, our Samoan Ministry Director, an entire congregation joined us. Pastor Meamoni Faulalo and Living Water Samoan became our newest Church of the Nazarene. Next in line and getting ready to launch, is Anointing Korean Church of the Nazarene being parented by the Bethel

congregation. This one is unique because Pastor Samuel and Esther Hong have come from South Korea as missionaries to the US and are planting a church in Spanaway. They are being supported by Nazarenes in Korea. Korean Nazarenes reaching across the Pacific with the love of Christ for people in western Washington.

In many large US cities, churches have relocated from near downtown to the suburbs. This has not been the case for the Church of the Nazarene in western Washington. We still own our property in the city. With all the distraction and complexity, urban ministry has always had its unique challenges. In a city like Seattle where the population is as diverse and as secular as anywhere in the country, the complexities are multiplied. This is not a cause for discouragement, but is a reason to seek and depend on Holy Spirit wisdom. Last summer, with the blessing of the District Advisory Board, we invited Pastor Paul Johnson and his family to relocate to Seattle to dream about more effective ways to coordinate what we are already doing in the city. The *Seattle City Project* has been up and running for 10 months. It has been encouraging to see the pastors in the city gather weekly and develop deep and trusting relationships. They are asking how we can best use the resources that God has provided for the future development of the church in the city. All kinds of connection and collaboration are happening with likeminded Christians who share our passion to recognize Jesus as Lord of the city. Now is the time for all of us to pray that God would open wide opportunities for church revitalization and planting. I hear God-sized dreams when I listen to Pastor Paul talk about what is possible in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Because we so desperately need the presence of the Lord in our lives and ministries, we set aside a week in November to Revive, Refresh, Restore. I am so grateful for the ministry and life of Dr. Jim Diehl who shared so openly and honestly with us in each service. He reminded us that sometimes life gets hard, but God is always good. It all began at Vancouver Hillcrest on a Sunday evening and ended up in Marysville on the following Sunday evening. Worship each night was led by a team from the host church. It was a wonderfully warm time and there were prayers for healing and renewal at every stop. Just over 1,300 people attended one of the 6 services. I was privileged to spend the week as Dr. Diehl's chauffeur - what a gift.

In the summer of 2016, SDMI and NYI teamed together to provide us with an outstanding youth and children's camping programs. Over 750 youth, children and adult sponsors spent an amazing week at Miracle Ranch or Island Lake. These experiences build lifetime friendships and you will often hear someone respond that it was at a summer camp where they first decided to be a follower of Jesus. We are so grateful to our good friends at Crista for their partnership in this ministry. Island Lake and Miracle Ranch are wonderful places to play, and grow. I am so grateful for the good leadership that has been given to WaPac by our SDMI Chair, Tony Johnson, and his board and NYI President Megan Wigham, and her council. Wonderful summer camps are just one of the areas where these leaders have added depth and value to WaPac.

Since early in the 1990's, we've owned 22 acres of land on the north side of Bellingham, just off the Guide Meridian. For almost three decades we've been paying taxes on this property, hoping one day to have a church there. During the time we've owned it, 40% of it has been declared wetlands and as a result, excluded from development. During my first year as district superintendent, I visited the property with a realtor who told me the land was worthless - zoned light industrial and unlikely to be purchased by anyone with all the wetland issues. Lyle Pointer and I walked the property, at least the parts that weren't underwater, and asked the Lord to help us recover what we'd lost. We promised that if we could find a buyer, we would put the money to work with a kingdom purpose. We found a more optimistic realtor who discovered plans for the property, which had been drawn in 2003, were still vested and the accompanying special-use permits still valid. They had been sitting at the city waiting for us for a decade. The special-use permit requires a church building to be permanently part of the development. As I write this report, all the public hearings are over, feasibility studies are completed, and plans approved by the Bellingham Planning and Zoning. We are just a few weeks from closing the sale of the property. As part of the agreement, the developer will build 260 apartments, 10% of them low-income, and a church

building that we will lease for \$1.00 a year for 100 years. During the construction phase, we will be praying for a lead pastor who will develop a core team. Our hope is that one of our core team will be the first resident in each of the 6 apartment buildings that are part of the Waldron Woods Community. Young people interested in ministry often express their desire for a more parish style of missional involvement – well here you go! There are many details that remain to be decided, but the prayer Lyle and I prayed 5 years ago is being answered in wonderful ways.

This year, we will ordain 12 of our district licensed ministers. Our district secretary, Dr. Ben Norris and the Board of Ministry, have been working diligently over the past few years to refine and improve our process. As a Minister in Development (MID) takes steps from an initial local license, to the granting and renewal of a district license, they are encouraged by the talented team of leaders who meet with them annually to encourage their progress toward ordination. We currently have 53 MID in the preparation, 19 of them receiving a district license for the first time and 34 whose licenses will be renewed at this year's Assembly. We are so grateful for the leadership of Pastor Craig Laughlin, Dr. Rusty Brian, Pastor Brad Edgbert and Secretary Dr. Margaret Scott who have given leadership to the board of ministry.

Once you've done something four years in a row it is a tradition – right? This year, as we traditionally do, we supported our mission around the world by providing 100% of our part of the World Evangelism Fund. This has been accomplished by generous and often sacrificial giving by our local churches. I have such deep appreciation for our NMI president, Debra Voelker, who shares with me a vision for supporting the mission work of the church in our local communities and all around the globe. All the details are in Debra's report, but WaPac is leading in generosity because that is who we are and that is what we do.

Nazarene Compassion Alliance – Northwest, the dream of returned missionaries Margaret and John Scott, is now in its third year of operation. Joining with Northwest district, this ministry is now working on both sides of the cascades. Since last assembly, NCA/NW has received 501c3 status giving it the opportunity to partner with other community resources to connect Washington Nazarenes with those in need of assistance. Currently, two members of the alliance, Sarah Emerson and Taulima Oge, have been trained to lend paralegal aid to immigrants and refugees. NCA/NW Executive Director, Dr. Margaret Scott and board chair, Sheryl Ice, have given countless hours to lay a solid foundation to connect, train and strengthen local churches to meet the needs of people in our communities. We are just getting started and compassionate ministry for the General Church has already labeled NCA/NW a good role model for other districts in USA/Canada. Giving assistance and accountability to my office as district superintendent, is work of the District Advisory Board. This group elected by the Assembly meets regularly 5 times a year to give overall leadership to the district. When faced with complex decisions, I am so thankful for the wisdom and years of experience that is present on this board. Giving leadership to the district this year are lay members Heidi Anderson, Randy Freeby, Debbie Kuykendall, Debe Loeber and Steve Walden. Pastors making up the clergy side of the board are Dave Ness, Ben Norris, David Rodes, Ev Tustin and Tim Westerberg. These are people that I have grown to trust and admire for the thoughtful and godly wisdom they regularly provide.

It is our desire that our ministries would reflect the diversity that is present in our communities. Helping us make this intention a reality, are directors of groups whose heart language is something other than English. Taulima Oge directs our ministry to Samoans and Jose David Sanchez directs our work with Hispanics. Both leaders are involved in coordinating, training and developing these churches and ministries. In addition to these, we have churches where the predominate language is Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean and Tagalog. Visiting one of our churches like Kent Hillside, that is developing a multi-cultural approach to ministry, you will find even more diversity of people and languages. As we increase our effective ministry to immigrants and refugees, we hope to expand the number of language groups impacted by the Church of the Nazarene in western Washington.

It's a great blessing to be part of the district leadership this year as I tell you about what we worked on the last couple of months and how God helped us along the way. It is a great challenge for me to lead the Hispanic Ministries and, at the same time, I am greatly honored by your trust in me and in what God can do through me for the benefit of our Hispanic neighbors and community of faith.

We are going to work in 5 focus areas, based on the 3 Core Values of our beloved church: (1) We are a Christian People, (2) We are a Holiness People and (3) We are a Missional People.

SPIRITUAL: We started last year with pastoral prayer meetings in different locations across the district. January – Puyallup; February – Renton; March – Monroe; April - Highland Park; June - Kent; July - Normandy Park; August – Tacoma; September – Bellevue; October – Renton; November – Monroe

4. District NMI President

Mission is at the heart of the message of the Bible. Starting with “In the beginning” and continuing through to “The grace of the Lord Jesus be with God’s people. Amen”, God’s concern for the entire world and the whole of creation is reflected. Although the actual word “mission” occurs rarely in the Bible, the gospel is the story of a God with a missionary heart, a Father who desires that all come to repentance, a Shepherd who seeks and saves the one lost sheep. God’s plan is that people from every tongue, tribe, and nation would bring Him glory. Dr. Nina Gunter says “If you take missions out of the Bible, you have nothing left but the covers.” Isaiah 54:2 New International Version (NIV) “Enlarge the place of your tent, stretch your tent curtains wide, do not hold back; lengthen your cords, strengthen your stakes.”

Or as the Message reads: “Clear lots of ground for your tents! Make your tents large. Spread out! Think big! Use plenty of rope, drive the tent pegs deep.”

Our missionary God is calling us to be a missionary people, to enlarge our tent stakes to take the church where it is not yet and to do everything we can to ensure that people everywhere who don’t know Christ have the opportunity to do so. The modern church tends to compartmentalize missions as something we do over there, but the reality of where we live today, suggests those lines are blurred. There is no ‘over there’ or ‘over here’ when it comes to missions. It is all missions when we are actively engaged in taking the church where it is not yet, to a people who have not yet heard the message that can bring them into the saving realm of God’s grace and salvation. That is missions. That is the heart of God. That is what we read from Genesis to Revelations. And that is what He is calling us to do.

It is estimated that of the 7.1 billion people alive in the world today, 2.91 billion of them live in unreached people groups with little or no access to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. According to Joshua Project, there are approximately 16,500 unique people groups in the world. Of those, about 6,900 of them are considered unreached by the Christian church. The vast majority (95%) of these unreached groups exist in what we call the 10/40 window where less than 10% of missionary work is done. Clearly we have work to do.

But God has also brought missions to our very doorsteps. We have people living in our own backyard who have never encountered our living God. The flags that line our sanctuary today represent us – the WaPac District. Each of the 55 flags represents someone on our district who was born on foreign soil. This is who we are and it’s representative of our neighborhoods. Our tent continues to grow and God is still calling us to spread out our tent stakes further and further each day.

Last year, Kent, Washington was listed as the 18th most diverse city in America, this year it moved up to 10th place. Clearly, the Kent Hillside Church of the Nazarene has an opportunity to enlarge its tent stakes to embrace immigrants and refugees living in its city. Partnering with World Relief, Kent Hillside began an 8-week sewing class for Afghan women. Many of these women are pre-literate in their native language and speak very little English.

They were rarely allowed to attend school beyond basic elementary education, if they were fortunate to receive any education at all. The sewing class created a loving, safe environment where the women not only learned how to use an electric sewing machine to make home goods but also learned English and built a community that helped alleviate the isolation and depression they often felt since arriving in the U.S. Another session of sewing classes will begin soon and only God knows what difference will be made in the lives of the women, the church and the world.

This past summer, the WaPac district and Vancouver Hillcrest Church enlarged our tent stakes by reaching out and helping those in need. We took two teams to Kamiah, Idaho to help the Robinett family rebuild their lives and their home after losing everything they owned during the devastating Idaho wildfires in 2015. Because of the generous giving to missions by the people on this district as well as the Vancouver Hillcrest Church the Robinett family is enjoying their new home but more importantly, they experienced the blessings that come when the church moves outside of its four walls.

We are also enlarging our tent stakes by embracing and supporting one of our own sister churches. The WaPac District, along with the Kirkland Life Community, Seattle Aurora, and Kelso churches have partnered with the Snoqualmie church to provide resources, funding, and work teams to help remodel their parsonage as they begin the restart of their church with a new pastor.

We have expanded our tent by feeding the hungry....at least 250,000 meals were served this past year by our Nazarene churches from one end of our district to people in their communities, giving a cup of cold water in the name of Christ.

Our tent is growing as we spread out to encompass those in need. We are together doing the mission God has called us to do.

Acts 1:8 says we are to be "witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." It perfectly describes our mission field. It is everywhere, from the street we live on to the far corners of the world. Nazarenes have always taken the call to "go" very seriously. We seek to share the good news of Jesus wherever we are. We believe God has called us to go "**GLOCAL**," which is a term that combines both global and local missions in one.

There are so many churches on our district that are doing this well, and Vancouver Fourth Plain is a great example. This past year they impacted their community by participating in Babies In Need, making and distributing Homeless Kits, and helping teachers and families at their local elementary school. They partnered with Nazarene around the world to send bandages to Papua New Guinea, contributed to the Alabaster Fund, Crisis Care Kits, and gave \$20,018 to the World Evangelism Fund. Vancouver Fourth Plain acted globally to carry out the Great Commission.

WaPac NMI has joined with Nazarene Compassionate Alliance Northwest to promote and encourage our churches to reach into their communities in response to the human needs around us. We understand there is nothing more biblical than aligning with God's mission by preaching the gospel and reaching lost people for Jesus Christ.

For the fourth year in a row WaPac District has paid our World Evangelism Fund in whole, giving a total of \$989,265 (102.05%) Amen!

We gave \$27,053 to Alabaster, \$174,816 to bless and care for our missionaries, \$124,862 to Nazarene Compassionate Ministries

We started 5 new churches and help strengthen our existing churches.

And we took teams to Honduras, El Salvador, Malawi, Arizona, Idaho, Denmark, Romania and Mexico.

Our denomination is not stagnant. Indeed, it truly is enlarging its tent.

- Around the world, we welcomed in 139,560 new Nazarenes this year. The fastest growing regions in membership were South America (4.85 percent) and Africa (4.23 percent). Our global membership increased by 1.24 percent.
- We started 629 new churches.
- We entered three new world areas - **Curacao, Singapore and Mongolia**.
- We added 160 new missionaries.

- And collectively we gave **\$38.15 million to the World Evangelism Fund**

When God called the Israelites to enlarge the place of their tent, He was calling them to have His Vision. He told them that a barren woman has no need for a bigger tent. We don't want to be barren! We want a bigger tent!

Many years later Jesus told his disciples to "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation (Mk 16:15). He wanted them to see the world and other people from God's point of view and to have God's vision, which is rooted in His love. For God so loved the world He sent His Son. He sent Jesus to be the Savior of the world. David Livingstone said "God had only one Son and He made Him a missionary."

The more we grow in our faith and become like Jesus, the more the heart of Jesus should be evident in our own lives. What greater evidence is there of a Christ-like heart than passion for God's mission? Just as Jesus served us through His life, death, and resurrection we serve our neighbors out of love, doing good to those around us, showing the love of Christ, and sharing the good news of salvation. That is how we know we are not barren and can "clear lots of ground for our tents! Make our tents large. Spread out! Think big! Use plenty of rope, drive the tent pegs deep" This is when the church is being the church.

God has called His people out of every nation, tribe, and tongue to manifest the diversity and extent of His grace. This universality and diversity of the church serves to remind us that while our methods and strategies will vary, the timeless call of God to His people to bring His saving message to a lost and dying world does not vary.

"God is a God of missions. He wills missions. He commands missions. He demands missions. He made missions possible through His Son. He made missions actual in sending the Holy Spirit." — George W. Peters

The last command of the ascending Christ to His church was that it "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15).

What a joy it is for me to report to you that this is exactly what you are doing!

John Stott says "mission arises from the heart of God himself, and is communicated from his heart to ours. Mission is the global outreach of the global people of a global God."

May God who is able bless you abundantly, so that in all things, at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

5. District SDMI Chair

Dear Dr. J.K. Warrick, Rev. Jerry Kester, and the Washington Pacific District Assembly: Have you ever had that quick shot of anxiety or confusion rush over you as you receive a phone call from a number you didn't recognize? Maybe caller ID told you who it was and you wonder why they are calling you. What good news - or more likely bad news - are they calling to share with you? Well, that's how I felt six years ago when I saw the district office's phone number suddenly appear on my cell phone screen less than ten days before district assembly. I tried to think of what form I had filled out wrong, or what I might be in trouble for now.

Well, that call sent me on an adventure I was not expecting, as it was then district SDMI chairperson, Rev. Wes Smith, asking me if I would allow my name to go on the ballot for this position. Honestly, I didn't know what I was getting myself into when I said yes, but I am glad I did. It has been an honor and privilege to serve as your district SDMI chairperson for the past six years as I have been stretched and hopefully, have grown in my understanding of what it means to create Christ-like disciples in our local congregations, communities, as well as in the nations.

In the past six years, your District SDMI Council has worked diligently to develop ministries related to camps, conventions, and coaching that would do two things. One, we hoped they would enhance and enrich the discipleship ministries of the local church by providing events that congregations – especially the smaller ones – could not facilitate on their own. Starting with reinvigorating our district children's camping ministry, to the

development of annual events for men, women, and PrimeTime adults (and the not-so-ready for PrimeTime). Our hope has been to create meaningful encounters which would connect people with other Christ-followers from across the district, and enrich them in their journey in Christ-likeness. As you will read in a few paragraphs, I would like to think we have done a good job on this goal.

Our second goal has been to encourage and help equip local pastors, SDMI leaders, and local lay leaders with ideas and opportunities to grow in their effectiveness as disciple-makers in their local settings. Be it through the monthly “Discipleship Thoughts” that I sent out to local pastors and SDMI Chairpersons, to providing partnerships with organizations such as the Northwest Ministries Conference and the Willow Creek Global Leadership Summit so pastors, leaders, and teachers can attend at significantly discounted rates, to creating workshops here at District Assembly that cover a wide-variety of practical, biblical, and theological topics, I think we have established a coaching model that has made our district at least five-percent better at being disciple-makers in our local churches and communities. Thank you to our ministry-area directors, and to our elected SDMI members, Justin Barksdale, Pat Crane, Richard Huling, and Shaun Mattson for your efforts to create a workshop schedule that equips and empowers our people for leadership and ministry.

As far as reporting on these discipleship and coaching efforts, here is a brief report of how we have worked to fulfill our mission, “resource local congregations for the creation Christ-like disciples in their congregations, their communities, and in the nations.”

Children’s Camp: Camp this past summer was one of the best we have had at Miracle Ranch! Increasing those on the leadership team had an incredible impact on what we were able to accomplish. We had powerful times of standing in the presence of God as Reece Wighaman and the Bethel youth group led all 256 in the worship of God. We utilized four different children’s leaders from our district as camp speakers, creating a great opportunity to collaborate in the sharing of the gospel to our WaPac kids. The Xtreme Team (teens from several district churches) raised the energy level in our worship times and daily activities, and truly demonstrated a heart of service as they loved and ministered to others all week. We had a fantastic team of camp counselors and were only 4 short of what was needed. We are truly confident that God will continue to move in such a way and that this year we will have more than we need. We look forward to ministering to all 4-7th grade kids this summer at the POWER UP WaPac Kids Kamp, July 10-14. Thanks, James Matthews, and the district children’s ministry team for creating a life-altering, Christ-forming camp for our kids.

Women of WaPac: The WoW council worked diligently to create two meaningful events for the women of our district. Women who attend District Assembly are always encouraged and inspired by the annual luncheon sponsored by WoW as they connect with women from across the district and learn new insights about ministering to women in diverse settings. This past year, WoW hosted a dessert gala in Des Moines at which eighty women enjoyed a dessert buffet put together by a premier dessert chef from Seattle. They were encouraged in their faith as they laughed along with a Christian comedian. Thanks Sueanne Skeen, Sharon Kester, Rhonda Tustin, and the WoW team for giving our women such an evening of elegance, significance, and laughter.

Man Camp – Get in the Game: Many men from across our district had a great time of spiritual encouragement and inspiration as we came together at Island Lake Camp. Wet weather, unexpected pre-event complications, and a smaller group in attendance (forty-four this year) could not stop God from working in the lives of many men who attended. Our speaker shared out of his own experiences of brokenness and healing to empower men in their journey of authentic Christian maturity. In small groups, we were able to apply the principles we had learned and to build greater cross-district relationships. Thank you, Todd Strong for putting so much of your heart and soul into this ministry.

PrimeTime Spring Retreat: This past year, the PrimeTime council put together our district’s first PrimeTime retreat. Those involved enjoyed inspired preaching from Rev. Jerry Kester and Dr. Stephen Fletcher, soul-soothing music from the Tacoma Samoan Church, and a trip to Northwest Trek. The WaPac District PrimeTime will be hosting another retreat

this May 9-11 at the Black Lake Retreat & Conference Center, and we have invited the Oregon Pacific District to join us; should be a great time! Thanks Jan Apps, Marilyn Hopper, Don Bancel, and Fred Hummer for making this first-time event such a blessing.

Willow Creek Global Leadership Summit: Kent Hillside Church served as a satellite site for this amazing leadership conference which grew in attendance. Of the seventy-plus people in attendance, there was a wonderful cross-section of church leaders, people from the business community, and Spanish speakers as the simulcast was translated for them. We were inspired by John Maxwell, Belinda Gates, Alan Mullaly, formerly of Boeing and Ford, Patrick Lencioni, Chris McChesney of Franklin Covey, and Danielle Strickland of the Salvation Army. This was a powerful, inspiring, and equipping two days to be part of. Plan to be part of the Global Leadership Summit again this summer, August 10 & 11. We have arranged to make the discounted rate available to you and your leaders whether you attend at the Kent Hillside church, or at a site in your local community. Thanks to Debe Loeber who worked as our event producer, and to Ev Tustin and the awesome Kent Hillside staff for making this a great time of leadership development.

As your outgoing SDMI chairperson, I would like to thank a lady who most of you don't know about. Her name is Regina Lundgren. She has been such a blessing to me, the district office, and my work as SDMI chairperson. Regina has been our statistician for the past two years, and for the past three years, has been the "puzzle-maker" when it came to preparing the times, places, and papers for the assembly workshops. If it weren't for Regina, I would have stepped down two years ago, so thank you Regina for your silent service to me and WaPac.

As the ministry of discipleship continues to morph and mature with the days and culture we live in, I want to share a few final 'Discipleship Thoughts.' I hope these will help keep intentional discipleship at the forefront of our ministry strategies, for we cannot not allow intentional discipleship overlooked midst our efforts to increase worship service attendance and global mission projects. We continue to be a culture and country where our youth, young adults, and our neighbors have been raised in an atmosphere of dysfunction, division, and lacking direction. We live in a culture where young adult children are raising children, and where even our kindergartners know that the word 'weed' does not necessarily refer to a dandelion. A culture where the narrative as well as the doctrine of Scripture is unknown at the worst, lost at the best. So how do we respond to such a culture?

"You must teach what is in accord with sound doctrine. Teach the older men to be temperate, worthy of respect, self-controlled, and sound in faith, in love and in endurance. Likewise, teach the older women to be reverent in the way they live...and to teach what is good. Then they can train the younger women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled and pure, to be kind and to honor their husbands so that no one will malign the word of God.

Similarly, encourage the young men to be self-controlled. In everything, set them an example by doing what is good. In your teaching, show integrity, seriousness and soundness of speech that cannot be condemned, so that those who oppose you may be ashamed because they have nothing bad to say about us....

For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men. It teaches us to say "no" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in this present age while we wait for the blessed hope – the glorious appearing of our great God and savior, Jesus Christ...These, then, are the things you should teach." Titus 2:1-8, 11-14a

I think the model Paul presents to us in this passage is interesting. It appears people of all ages need to grow in their understanding of sound doctrine, and that growth happens in several ways. It happens through *teaching lessons*. It happens through *encouraging words* in conversations. It happens as we *set an example before them* in how we live. In essence, growth in spiritual maturity and Christ-likeness happens as we grow in relationship with God and with each other. We may have the 'teaching' part down, but what about the other parts – encouraging words in conversations and setting an example. How do we live that out?

In this day, discipleship happens:

In the fantasy football leagues, flash-mobs gathering at coffee shops and restaurants, and game nights like we see happening at the West Seattle Church, with an inter-generational, inter-cultural mix of people who join to share life outside of traditional bible study and worship.

It happens as the men's ministry from Longview sponsors men from their church's Celebrate Recovery group so they can attend the District Man Camp where these men battling addiction and dysfunction can take new steps in their sobriety, freedom, and maturity in Christ.

When individuals in the Bethel church taking time to teach older children and youth how to play musical instruments so they can become part of the church praise team, which also allows them to get to know these students and speak God's life into them. As an older woman from Vancouver Hillcrest begins to meet regularly with three younger women, some of who are new to the faith, to share the journey of maturing in Christ and as a person together.

When congregations like Marysville and Gig Harbor take intergenerational ministry more seriously by not just giving young adults, students, children jobs in the church, but joining these younger individuals in their ministry so they can walk alongside them, learn from these youngin's, and share their faith-maturing stories with them.

When a retired elder, well in his eighties, intentionally goes out of his way to meet with a young man trying to figure out what direction he wants his life to take, and to connect with men who can't make it to church on Sundays because they work.

When some older men pull some of the middle school boys alongside them as they build the decorations for Advent, helping the young men see how algebra is important in real life, modeling faith and obedience to God.

These are snapshots of discipleship in the new culture, to the new generation we live with, and I pray we continue to strive as Christians and congregations to reach out and in these generations so they might know the transforming mercy and grace, forgiveness and power that is found in a surrendered life to Jesus Christ.

Thank you again for allowing me the honor and privilege of serving as your WaPac SDMI chairperson for these past six years. It is my prayer that your church's discipleship ministry is just a little bit more equipped and encouraged because of my service to you.

2016 Junior High Camp—July 18-22

223 junior high students and leaders made memories to last a lifetime and engaged with God in unique and creative ways during our summer camp at Miracle Ranch. Our theme this year was "Create" and Pastor Keegan Lenker gave powerful messages to the youth and Brenden DuBois, the Worship Arts Pastor from Aurora Nazarene, led us in worship. Joshua Stines successfully directed an amazing week for our students.

2016 Senior High Camp—August 8-12

305 high school students and leaders met at Island Lake Camp for our “Create”-themed week. Megan Wighamman and Michelle Borbe co-directed the camp. Carly Bartlett was this year’s speaker and her husband, Mike, created some visually stunning art pieces that enhanced Carly’s messages. Covenant led us in worship. During both youth camps our students raised \$2,250, enough money to buy 150 pairs of The Shoe That Grows that we sent to a school in Rwanda where 75 of the 150 children are orphans. We have a connection at the school Rafiki and are friends with the headmaster there.

Missions Day—November 12, 2016

201 students and leaders from 15 churches across WaPac gathered at Tacoma Naz prepared to be sent out into the greater Tacoma area to meet needs through service and bring the hope of Christ to those they encountered. They worked in 9 existing compassionate ministries organizations like New Beginnings (a home for teen moms), World Vision, and local shelters and food banks. At the end of the day they gathered for worship led by Robby Skinner, shared their experiences, heard a great message from God through Eric McConnaughey, and enjoyed dinner together.

Main Event/Convention—March 17-18, 2017

205 students from 17 churches gathered, after a two-year break, for Main Event. There were competitive sports, talent competitions, worship and speaking. Jared and Stephanie Trygg, youth pastors at Puyallup Naz, did a great job preparing and directing this event. During our NYI Convention we had a record number of delegates participating. We elected the 2017 NYI Council during our time together.

3. Education Committee (NNU Board of Trustees)

It is a special privilege to bring this annual report for 2016-2017 to the Washington Pacific Assembly from your Trustees of Northwest Nazarene University. Under the leadership of Joel Pearsall, NNU is thriving amidst days of great change.

STRATEGIC GOALS—With the newly organized leadership team under President Pearsall, the Board is currently preparing Strategic Goals for 2017-2020. As these are approved and rolled out to the campus and constituents, the Assembly can be assured they will reflect a deep commitment in practice to Christ, the student, the denomination, and to local Churches of the Nazarene on the seven districts that comprise the NNU Educational Region.

ACADEMICS--NNU's commitment to rigorous and relevant academic programs has been an institutional hallmark throughout our history. Key indicators of academic quality continue to find their place among University narratives. We have reason to be proud of NNU's academic programs and the faculty, staff, and students who are the heart of those efforts. One indication of the exemplary nature of NNU's academic program is the number and measure of grants offered to faculty and departments by varieties of funding agencies; from federal and state governments to corporate and charitable foundations.

OPERATIONS & CAPITAL CAMPAIGN--The 2016-17 school year is looking much better financially than last year. We are tracking well compared to our budget, which is projecting a year end positive reserve. Work is progressing on the new student center project.

The *Century Two* Campaign Team continues to have conversations and interactions with donors and prospects to secure major gifts for the campaign.

STUDENT HIGHLIGHTS—We asked some of our students from Asia if they were Christians. A young man responded, “Not yet!” It is a privilege to pray on Tuesday and Thursday and to know that the Holy Spirit is leading students closer and closer to salvation. • *Can I Get a Witness?* has been a meaningful chapel theme as we have heard a wide variety of testimonies from guests about how God has written them into His story. • 40+ students volunteered their time to help dig people out of unusually deep snow. One response: “I am a disabled vet, and my wife is a Traumatic Brain Injury Survivor. 4 wonderful young men show up at our home in Weiser to shovel off our roof & driveway. We have been scared our roof would collapse & couldn’t get into our garage for 2 weeks. We are so grateful!” • The NNU on a Mission trip to Haiti is unfolding beautifully as we partner with the Northwest District who gifted us \$20,000 to do a project. • In a survey of Christian Formation, 369 students chose a 4 or 5, with 5 meaning I cared greatly about my faith before coming to NNU. 441 of the 587 surveyed selected a 4 or 5, with 5 meaning I care more about my faith now than when I came. Plus, 41% of students surveyed pray more than they did before they came to NNU and 38% read their Bible more than when they came.

*We encourage each church to rally behind our University by paying the Educational Budget weekly or monthly at the 2.5% rate of monies received. And, we strongly urge churches that have not been paying this budget to plan this year to pay in full.

*That all our pastors encourage their people to invest generously in the work of NNU through— encouraging every Nazarene young person to seriously investigate the possibility of attending NNU; encouraging persons to invest in NNU through life income contracts, trusts, annuities, and by including the university in their wills, enabling it to raise additional funds for scholarships for deserving students.

*That each local church supports NNU by making plans for 11th and 12th grade students to visit the NNU campus during one of the several Explore NNU days offered during the school year; having 9th to 12th grade students attend the regional event, *The Gathering*; taking advantage of Trustees Matching Scholarship. As a way of acknowledging the important contribution Nazarene churches make to NNU, the Trustees Matching Scholarship was initiated on behalf of students who come from our churches. This award is provided according to the following factor and criteria.

4. Church Properties Board

The Church Properties Board and the District Advisory Board have taken action on the following church property issues and requests:

Kent Hillside - Approved the sale of the undeveloped property they own near Covington, WA for \$470,000. Proceeds from the sale will be applied toward the church's loan with Wesleyan Investment Foundation [\$300,000] and toward improvements to the current grounds and building.

Tacoma First - Approved the sale of 3 of the 4 rental houses they own. Proceeds from the sale of the 3 homes will pay off the current indebtedness [\$350,000] and leave the church with approximately \$130,000 in the bank to help with a project to expand off-street parking.

Puyallup - Approved the sale of 2 church-owned rental properties. Proceeds from the sales will be used to pay down the church's existing indebtedness.

Van Zandt – Approved a lease with “option to buy” of the church and parsonage buildings. Monthly lease amount of \$1,000, of which, \$300 will apply towards down payment of the purchase price of \$119,500. Lease payments and proceeds from the ultimate sale of the property will become an asset of the district.

2. In the light of the remarkable success and blessing presently being enjoyed by many of our churches involved in the ministry of Faith Promise, as well as the increased funds available to the cause of world evangelism, we heartily recommend that each church give prayerful consideration to the establishment of Faith Promise giving.

3. We recommend that the churches struggling with their Funding the Mission goals confer with the district superintendent. With concern for local church health and commitment to operating district ministries as efficiently and as economically as possible, the District Assembly Finance Committee recommends that the District Advisory Board review annual church finance reports, and to visit with any church regarding the equanimity of its report.

4. That members of the local church receive, at the discretion of the district superintendent, regular communication regarding the total district program of Funding the Mission.

Insurance and Properties

5. That the pastor give special attention to filing (a) the nonprofit corporation registration with the Secretary of State by the last day of your anniversary month (the month in which your church was incorporated), and (b) the tax exemption forms for the church and parsonage properties with the State Department of Revenue by March 31. (Notices are sent to each church by the State of Washington.) That the deadline due dates be printed in pastors' letters. That each new pastor be notified by letter from the district superintendent regarding these requirements. Also, that the district office keep on file (a) the federal ID tax number, (b) state property tax exemption number, and (c) the Labor and Industries account ID number for each church.

6. That each local church carry liability and malpractice insurance and that Labor and Industries insurance, as required by law, be carried for every pastor and paid employee. That each year the local church evaluate the adequacy of its property insurance and, if necessary, adjust to current replacement costs.

Missional Vision

7. That the local church consider, at appropriate times, the support of the District Missional Vision through Funding the Mission and participation on assigned district Work and Witness projects. District mission's projects may count as 10% giving.

Education

8. That every church to pay its Education Share in full. For the 2017-2018 school year, Northwest Nazarene University will match all local church scholarships of \$350 per year as follows:

9. That each church supports the training of Nazarene ministers and missionaries by taking special offerings on:

**October 1, 2017 for Nazarene Bible College
January 21, 2018 for Nazarene Theological Seminary.**

And further, promote the distribution of God's Word through an offering for the American Bible Society on December 10, 2017. These funds may be sent through the district office.

SDMI, NYI, and NMI Ministries

10. That the financial support of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, Nazarene Youth International and Nazarene Missions International be cared for through the district Funding the Mission.

11. Since the district director of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, the district NMI president, and the district NYI president are not salaried positions, we recommend that churches using their services pay their expenses.

Ministerial Support

12. That each church support the pastor and family in prayer and have concern for their ministry, and that the pastor's leadership be recognized and followed; that the pastor's salary be a preferred claim on the local church and be reviewed annually. In salary reviews, local professional positions of like responsibility should be considered, taking into account education, tenure and preparation. Further, those other benefits, such as Social Security and adequate health insurance, be provided for both pastor and other staff members and that the local church reimburses their pastor for professional expenses (auto expenses and depreciation, entertainment, conferences, continuing education, etc.).

That each church supports its pastor and pastoral staff in the establishment of tax-sheltered annuities. (Complete information is available from the Board of Pensions & Benefits in Kansas City and at www.pbusa.org.)

13. That the local church board provide for reimbursement of expenses incurred by ministerial staff in attending necessary conventions, district functions, education workshops, etc. That each church be encouraged to provide continuing education for the pastor, including a library allowance where possible. That an amount be set aside regularly, in a separate fund, to send the pastor and spouse to the General Assembly.

14. That each church, and the district, encourage pastoral renewal for its pastoral family through:

a. regular use of at least one day each week for rest and relaxation;

b. vacation time, given with full pay and with the church paying for pulpit supply, built around the pattern of:

(1) two weeks for pastors who have served the denomination up to five years;

(2) three weeks for pastors serving in the denomination from 6 to 15 years;

(3) four weeks for pastors serving in the denomination more than 15 years;

(4) Vacation is to be taken in the year earned unless prior approval is given by the church board.

c. provisions for study and education of at least one week per year, apart from normal church functions (district assembly, etc.), paid by the local church and subject to prior church board approval with a subsequent report to the church board;

d. camps, assemblies, conventions, etc. are considered as part of the pastor's responsibilities and not a portion of their vacation.

e. In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor during the seventh consecutive year of service in one congregation. It is strongly urged that the pastor's salary continue in full and that the church board provide for pulpit supply during the sabbatical period. (2013-2017 Manual 129.10).

15. That evangelists be compensated to provide an income adequate to cover the meeting being conducted, as well as consideration for interim periods of time lost due to travel and lags between meetings. In addition, all expenses incurred in holding a meeting (i.e. travel away from home costs) be provided.

16. We believe that adequately supporting ministerial personnel will help build the Kingdom and relieve personal pressures, thereby resulting in more effective leadership and direction. Therefore, it is recommended that a copy of this subsection be provided each church board secretary and read to each local church board early in the assembly year.

Planned Giving

17. That we encourage each church to invite a representative of the Church of the Nazarene Foundation for legacy giving resources.

18. That we adopt the giving plan adopted by the Board of General Superintendents and the General Board that asks each local church to give at least the following percentage of their income:

World Evangelism Fund	5.5%
Pensions & Benefits Share	2.25%
Education Share (NNU)	2.25%

19. That each church support the District Budget presented in paragraph No. 1 of this report. District (including NYI, SDMI & NMI) 3%.

20. It is encouraged and expected that our churches participate in Funding the Mission of the Church of the Nazarene and that those who serve on district committees and boards will realize the responsibility of their influence.
