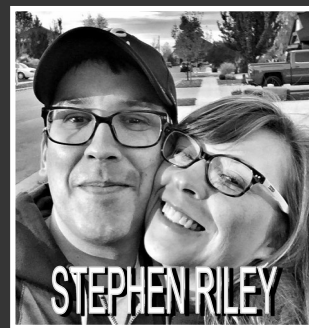

Clothes (daily clothes, white shirt, something you can get messy in for paintball/games, long pants & long sleeve shirt for motocross & paintball)
