C. STUDY REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

Eligibility

The District Ministerial Studies Board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open to local ministers and licensed ministers pursuing elder or deacon ordination. Refer to the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* (latest edition) for specific requirements for each course of study. (*Manual*, pars. 527).

How to Enroll in the Course of Study

Persons wishing to enroll in the Course of Study (COS) should visit the WaPac District website "Called to Ministry Checklist."

Transcripts must be sent to the district office, Board of Ministry registrar, Sharon Kester (sharon@wapacnaz.org) so they may be evaluated as to placement in the Course of Study.

Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts university or Nazarene Bible College and, if possible, Nazarene Theological Seminary. The modules for the Course of Study are also available on-line through Northwest Nazarene University, Nazarene Bible College and Washington Pacific Kaleidoscope, Spanish and Samoan CLT classes. Other educational options need to be reviewed by the Board of Ministry to ensure credit. If an applicant is not established in a pastorate and is reasonably unencumbered, it will do both him or her a great service if the board of his or her local church will insist that the candidate be trained for the ministry in the church's educational institutions.

We understand that in the midst of ministry, education can demand a great deal of time and energy. We would emphasize that a call to minister is a call to become a lifelong learner.

Requirements of Modular Study

- A. Each candidate must become familiar with the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* before enrolling, in order to better understand the process and details of the entire program. We are recommending that each church purchase a *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* and make this available to prospective students. We also recommend that each pastor become familiar with ministry internship so they will be able to mentor students in their own church. These books may be obtained from the Nazarene Publishing House.
- B. Paragraph 530.3 states that all applicants desiring to renew a district license "shall have completed at least two courses in a validated course of study." It makes clear that if the student has not done so "the license may be renewed by the district assembly only upon submission of a written explanation for this failure. Such explanation shall be satisfactory to the District Board of Ministry and approved by the general superintendent presiding." All modules should be in process by **December 31**, in order to apply on the current assembly year.
- C. College, seminary, and Bible College students are reminded to request the registrar to send notification of completed work so that accurate records of student progress can be made.
- D. College and seminary students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with the requirements of the course of study. The final transcript at graduation will be evaluated by the District Board of Ministry.

Mentor / Student Relationship

Supervised field education is a key component of ministerial development. In most cases your local pastor will serve the mentor role. In situations where a district licensed minister is serving as pastor, a mentor will be selected by the District Board of Ministry

Ordination: A Privilege, Not a Right

While the Church of the Nazarene requires that certain educational preparation and certain ministry requirements be fulfilled before a person can be ordained, it is understood that completion of these requirements does not automatically qualify a candidate for ordination. The Board of Ministry will want to examine all spiritual, theological, personal and professional issues pertaining to a candidates fitness for ministry.

IV. Daily Proceedings

**Assembly Opening Service, Sunday, April 15, 2018, 6.00p
(Mountain View Church of the Nazarene in Tumwater, WA)**

Washington Pacific's District Assembly was opened with the song "New Doxology" celebrating the source of all our blessings. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!! The praise team from Liberty Bible Church led by Rev. James Taylor led our assembly with passion and grace.

The gathering of our district church was welcomed by our District Superintendent, Rev. Jerry Kester, sharing that this assembly marks the 75th anniversary of the Washington Pacific District. Rev. Kester stated that as we meet and worship over the next 48 hours, we will hear of great things that God is doing in our midst and around the world. As he committed our time to God, Rev. Kester asked that the Holy Spirit would be with us and bless our time with God's presence.

Rev. James Taylor continued to lead the assembly gathering in musical worship. We sang songs with joy and exuberance. The assembly sang "Victory in Jesus", "Love Come Down", and "The Lion and the Lamb" in unison, clapping their hands and praising God.

Washington Pacific Nazarene Youth International (NYI) President Rev. Megan Wigham came to the podium to present a Timothy Award to a youth worker on our district. After reading a brief history of the award and some of the qualifications needed for receiving the award, Rev. Wigham invited Rev. David Lafrenz and his family to the platform to receive the award. Rev. Lafrenz began his ministry to youth in 2000 and currently serves on our district at the Rescue Church in Sumner. He is known as a hard and humble worker, serving in many roles, including NYI president, NYI treasurer, and on our Field NYI council. Rev. Wigham then presented Rev. Lafrenz his award and introduced a video of some of David's former students who wanted to express their thanks for his ministry over the years.

The Washington Pacific Nazarene Missions International (NMI) President, Rev. Debra Voelker, came to the podium to introduce our missionary speaker for the assembly, Dr. Eric Kellerer. Welcoming him to the podium, the assembly gave Dr. Kellerer a warm welcome of applause.

Dr. Eric Kellerer shared from a part of the current journey of the Joseph Project and our ministry effort in a foreign nation. He shared from 2 Timothy 3, which he admitted was not the happiest news, but it is true. We do not seek persecution, but as we live out the gospel we will encounter people who we make uncomfortable. We are called to be willing, and obedient, and faithful to the mission of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He shared stories of risk and of faithfulness about the work of the gospel, particularly with the Joseph Project and the risks it entails.

James Taylor and the Liberty Bible Worship Team returned for another time of musical worship singing "I Got Saved", reminding us of the joy of our salvation. We concluded worship by singing "Great Are You Lord" as an anthem of praise to God.

Rev. Kester took time to introduce presiding General Superintendent, Dr. Gustavo Crocker, and his wife. He is the first presiding GS on the Washington Pacific District that is not American-born. Coming to the podium Dr. Crocker brought greetings from the Board of General Superintendents and from the Church of the Nazarene, which is now present in 162 countries, preaching in over 200 languages, and consisting of over 2.5 million people. He spoke about the shift in the church's call of "Here I Stand" to "There We Go." He then prayed for the remainder of our service and our assembly.

Rev. Kester came to the podium to introduce and to pray for the offering. There will be only two offerings received, this one to help defray the cost of the assembly and another on Tuesday to support the Joseph Project, which Dr. Kellerer has come to share about. Our assembly offering was received to the words and music of the song, "I Need Thee Every Hour".

Following offering, Rev. Kester offered greetings to Dr. Bob and Carol Broadbrooks, the Regional Director of the USA/Canada Church of the Nazarene. He also offered greetings to Don & Brenda Ross, the Northwest Ministry Director for the Assemblies of God, Dr. Lloyd Moritz, the Area Administrator for the Church of God Anderson, and Matt Whitehead, the administrator of Northwest Pacific Conference of the Free Methodists Church.

Rev. Kester came to the podium to share from the Word of God. Sharing from the broken-heartedness of his recent journey, he talked about journeying with the grief of loss and the calling to lead in the midst of that brokenness. Highlighting the differences between the grief of Charles Darwin and Horatio Spafford, we choose to recite the anthem of faith, "It is well with my soul." Highlighting the Messianic promises found in Isaiah 51 & 52, as repeated in John 12, the assembly was reminded that we were sent, in the person of Jesus, a servant, one who is despised and rejected, who will die and be buried, but who will see again the light of life. We believe that incarnation, crucifixion, and resurrection are the pivotal truths of the Christian life. We believe that the resurrection makes all the difference for those that follow Christ.

Rev. James Taylor and the praise team led the assembly to close out our time together, singing "Jesus", reminding us who Jesus is and what he has done.

We concluded worship with a prayer and benediction offered by Rev. Kester. He invited the assembly to join our business session at 8.30am the next morning at Mountain View Nazarene Church sanctuary.

Morning Business Session, Monday, April 16, 2018, 8.30am (Mountain View Church of the Nazarene in Tumwater, WA)

District Superintendent Rev. Jerry Kester welcomed the assembly to the gathering. He invited the Mountain View worship team to lead us in worship to start our day.

Rev. Bill Bowers welcomed the assembly to Mountain View church and offered a few recommendations for the assembly. Rev. Bowers opened in prayer offering thanks to God for how he fights for our good and asking for God's anointing over our time together.

Rev. Kester welcomed the presiding General Superintendent, Dr. Gustavo Crocker, to the podium to share the morning's devotional. Sharing from 1 Samuel 7, Dr. Crocker spoke of the power of the presence of God. As was a theme in worship and our opening prayer, God is fighting for us. The assembly was challenged to not only enjoy God's presence, but to now grow in holiness. The assembly was invited to make the choice to commit today to a deeper walk.

At 9:25, Dr. Crocker called the assembly to order. He yielded the microphone to our District Secretary, Rev. Ben Norris, who then organized the assembly as follows:

The assembly took time to seat alternate delegates. Forms were distributed and a *motion was made to seat these delegates immediately without further action once the alternates are verified. The motion was seconded and passed.*

Rev. Kester came to the podium to introduce new lead pastors to the district: Troy & Wendy Johnson at Mount Vernon, Scott & Shawna Fox at Maple Valley, Tim Shampoe at Bingen Rooftop Ministries, and Dan & Marcy Samuelson at Tacoma First. Lead Pastors with new staff were then invited to introduce those who have joined their pastoral team over the previous year.

Dr. Crocker called the assembly's attention to the report of the Board of Ministry (D1-D3), partial reports #1-4. *A motion was made, seconded. The assembly then unanimously voted to approve this report,* including the approval for six people to be ordained: Michelle D. Borbe, Wendy A. Johnson, Brandon J. Marten, Mark E. Roskam, Jonathon I. Wren, Bethanie R. Young. The ordination candidates were asked to meet with Dr. Crocker in room 420 at noon for their final interview and approval by our presiding General Superintendent.

Dr. Crocker then invited our District Superintendent, Rev. Jerry Kester, to come to podium to share the District Superintendent's report. Rev. Kester asked our regional USA/Canada Director, Dr. Bob Broadbrooks, to the podium to pray for him and his report before he began. Rev. Kester shared highlights from his written report (C1-C5) with the Washington Pacific assembly. The assembly received the report with a round of strong applause. Dr. Crocker asked Dr. Fred Fullerton to come and pray for the Kesters as district pastors gathered around him and laid hands upon him. Rev. Rev. Jerry Kester invited Rev. Debra Voelker to the podium. She came to introduce Dr. Eric Kellerer to the assembly and welcomed him to the podium to share with the assembly. His remarks were centered around courage and were based upon Philippians 1.12-21. He shared some incredible stories of courage happening with the Joseph Project.

Rev. Debra Voelker and Rev. Jerry Kester came to the podium and read a list of Churches of Excellence from around our district for their financial contributions. These churches were invited to receive a certificate of appreciation and to receive thanks from Dr. Crocker. The assembly thanked them for their generous support. The assembly watched a brief video about the World Evangelism Fund.

Rev. Norris brought the attention of the assembly to the second ballot (a sample of which can be found on D6) and election biographies (D7-D8). The Board of Tellers distributed ballot #2 for the District NMI council and the SDMI council. Ballots were distributed, marked, and collected so they can be tallied.

The assembly then received the zone reports via video from the Lake Washington zone and the Green River zone. Lead pastors were invited to the platform during the video presentation.

Rev. James Matthews was asked to come to the podium to give us instructions and updates for this afternoon's workshops. In the afternoon, Dr. Crocker planned to be in the sanctuary to answer questions about the church or recent resolutions that were passed as General Assembly.

Rev. Norris reminded the assembly about the box lunches that are available and the ministers' choir rehearsal at 6.25p. He also reminded the ordination candidates to please head to room #424 immediate following the morning adjournment.

**Afternoon Workshop Session, Monday, April 16, 2018, 1.30p
(Mountain View Church of the Nazarene in Tumwater, WA)**

During the first and second workshop sessions (1.30p – 2.30p and 3.00p – 4.00p), a variety of workshops were held throughout the Mountain View campus centered on the theme of discipleship. A full listing of workshops offered was in the assembly notebook from pages A3-A7 (workshop leader biographies can be found from A8-A10).

**Ordination Service, Monday, April 16, 2018, 7.00p
(Mountain View Church of the Nazarene in Tumwater, WA)**

The praise team from Mountain View church led those in attendance in musical worship, singing "Blessed Be Your Name" and "Build Your Kingdom Here", inviting God's presence into our gathering and the hearts of those gathered.

Our District Superintendent, Rev. Jerry Kester, brought greetings to those in attendance and reminded us of the importance and sanctity of ordination. He invited our presiding General Superintendent, Dr. Gustavo Crocker, to talk about the ordination service.

Dr. Crocker came to the podium and spoke briefly of the importance and the significance of the ordination service. The church is not sustained by the planting of churches or the gatherings of the church, but by the ordination of those who are called to lead the faithful and proclaim the Gospel. This significant night has meaning for those who are already ordained, those who are journeying toward ordination, and those who might sense God's calling on their lives. May our hearts be receptive to what God is doing. Dr. Crocker led the gathering in an invocation prayer for our time of worship.

The worship gathering read in unison the Apostle's Creed as led by a video and by the worship team. Following this statement of faith, those gathered continued to worship by singing "We Believe". Rev. Rev. Kester took time to acknowledge one elder who is retiring this year from active ministry, Rev. Mervyn Friberg. The Minister's Choir came to the front to sing a resounding rendition of "And Can It Be?", as they were led by Cathy Freeby.

Rev. Taulima Oge came to the podium and read from the Manual the qualifications of a minister, paragraphs 502.1-502.6.

The Mountain View worship team led the gathering in singing "Lord I Need You".

Dr. Crocker opened the Word of God and shared a message from 1 Samuel 3.1-11, the story of God calling Samuel to ministry. He encouraged the church to keep the message of the church and the ministry of the church to be focused upon Jesus and the Word of God and with a compelling kingdom-vision. Too often the church suffers spiritual dryness where we do the same things over and over, we fail to see the calling of God on others, and forget to introduce our people to Jesus in our ministries. But the good news is that God still calls people amidst our dryness and we become ambassadors of the message and Gospel of Christ. For we can proclaim that the calling is greater than and overcomes the dryness! Dr. Crocker invited those in the gathering the opportunity to say yes to the call of God or to come to God asking to have our dry and empty vessels filled with the spirit of God.

Dr. Crocker invited the assembly to affirm the class of ordinands to platform to undergo the ordination ritual, praying and commissioning each of the six ordination candidates: Michelle Borbe, Wendy Johnson, Brandon Marten, Mark Roskam, Jonathon Wren, and Bethanie Young. The hands of the currently ordained elders were laid upon each candidate and each were prayed for and blessed as they were ordained with elders orders and had credentials recognized in the Church of the Nazarene.

Our representative from Northwest Nazarene University, Dr. Fred Fullerton, came forward and made a presentation of Scott Stearman's sculpture, *The Calling*, to each of the

ordinands. This sculpture is meant to serve as a reminder of the significant ritual of ordination and, more important, the call that led them to ministry in Christ's church. Rev. Rev. Jerry Kester welcomed the assembly back to the floor and introduced Sharon Cattich, the worship leader at our church plant, Encounter Church, premiering her new version of "Holiness Unto the Lord" and led the assembly in singing "Your Great Name".

Dr. Eric Kellerer came to the podium for the morning devotional message, speaking from Luke 4.16-21. He shared stories of the hunger for God and the connecting networks that make the Joseph Project possible to be used to spread the Gospel. The work that God is doing through the Joseph Project is for good people and through good people in that country.

The assembly then received the zone reports via video from the Mt. Baker zone and the Capitol zone. Lead pastors were invited to the platform during the video presentation.

Dr. Crocker asked for the results of our elections to be read. Rev. Norris read the election results of ballot #1. Total ballots cast: 312, spoiled ballots: 1. Elder members of the District Advisory Board: Chuck Judd-133, Craig Laughlin-135, Larry Rounsley-128, Tim Westerberg-213. Rev. Norris also read the election results of ballot #2. Total ballots cast: 302, spoiled ballots: 0. Approval of Jean Calman, Karen Duranceau, René Hayes, Fred Humber, Crystal Howell-Burke, Tom Lafrenz, Debbie Lund, Marian Smith, Dennis Spinnie, Shelley Wagner, Cindy Whiteman to the Nazarene Missions International council: Yes-295, No-6. **NMI Council members approved.** Approval of Justin Barksdale, Jeff Borden, Pat Crane, Shaun Mattson to the Sunday School & Discipleship council: Yes-300, No-0. **SDMI Council members approved.**

Rev. Kester came to the podium to introduce Rev. Debra Voelker and informing the assembly that Rev. Voelker was recently elected as the northwest representative to the regional NMI council. Rev. Voelker came to the podium to offer her report (C6-C8). Her report was received by the assembly with a standing ovation of strong applause. *Motion to approve her report was made, seconded, and passed.*

Dr. Crocker introduced the next video, which was a report of the work and ministry of Africa Nazarene University. It focused on the continuation of campus development at Africa Nazarene.

The assembly then received the zone reports via video from the Peninsula zone and the Snohomish zone. Lead pastors were invited to the platform during the video presentation.

Becky Miller came to the podium to offer a report of the eighteen chaplains serving under the auspices of the Washington Pacific district. She spoke about the registered chaplain ministry role that is offered by our district and told a brief story about the recent Amtrak accident. Capt. Brian Haley brought greetings from Honolulu, HI as they serve the men and women in the military in chaplaincy ministries with our armed forces. Rev. Kester came to the podium to inform the assembly that Rev. Mike Boisture has been accepted to serve as a chaplain for the Secret Service. Remember to pray for all the chaplains represented by the Washington Pacific district.

The attention of the assembly was directed to the report of District Advisory Board (D9-D10). *A motion to receive the report was made, seconded, and approved.*

The attention of the assembly was directed to the report of the Church Properties Board (D19). *A motion to receive the report was made, seconded, and approved.*

The attention of the assembly was directed to the Treasurer's Report (C18-C24). *A motion to adopt the report was made, seconded, and approved.*

The attention of the assembly was directed to the report of the Finance Committee (D11-D16). *A motion to adopt the report was made, seconded, and approved.*

Dr. Crocker directed the assembly's attention to a video produced to highlight what happened at the 2017 General Assembly. He shared about the growth and progress of the global church and our ministry. He explained how some of the changes must be ratified by two-thirds majority of the established districts around the world.

The attention of the assembly was directed to the explanations of the amendments (D21-D24). A motion was made to consider the changes made to the Articles of Faith (amendments #1-6) be considered without question due to the editorial and review process these amendments have already been through. Motion was seconded and approved. Amendment #1 was considered and approved unanimously (no opposing votes, no abstentions). Amendment #2 was considered and approved (no opposing votes, 1 abstention). Amendment #3 was considered and approved (no opposing votes, 2 abstentions). Amendment #4 was considered and approved (no opposing votes, 1 abstention). Amendment #5 was considered and approved (no opposing votes, 3 abstentions). Amendment #6 was considered and approved (no opposing votes, 1 abstention). Amendment #7 was considered and approved unanimously (no opposing votes, no abstentions). Amendment #8 was considered and approved unanimously (no opposing votes, no abstentions). Amendment #9 was considered and approved (no opposing votes, 2 abstentions). Amendment #12 was considered and approved unanimously (no opposing votes, no abstentions). Amendment #10 was considered and approved (2 opposing votes, 1 abstention). Amendment #11 was considered and approved (no opposing votes, 1 abstention).

Rev. Kester made some modifications to the schedule of the assembly and invited Jon Twitchell to the podium to share about the Nazarene Foundation. He challenged the assembly to consider the legacy we leave to those who follow behind us in our churches.

Rev. Voelker invited Dr. Kellerer back to the podium for his final chance to share with the assembly more stories of the Joseph Project. She also reminded the assembly that following his presentation, an offering would be taken to support this ministry. He talked about a partnership that has developed between NNU and a university in the area of the Joseph Project. The assembly was given the chance to give an offering to specifically support the Joseph Project.

Rev. Norris reminded the assembly that the box lunches are available. He asked that the District Advisory Board (newly elected and continuing members) to meet before lunch. Ladies with tickets for the ladies luncheon are invited to gather as soon as we dismiss

for lunch. Assembly was reminded that we will reconvene for business promptly at 1.30pm and dismissed for lunch.

**Afternoon Business Session, Tuesday, April 17, 2018, 1.30p
(Mountain View Church of the Nazarene in Tumwater, WA)**

Dr. Crocker welcomed the assembly back from lunch. He handed over the remainder of the assembly over to Rev. Kester to navigate through the reports that still need to be given.

Rev. Kester invited Rev. James Matthews to the podium to offer highlights from his SDMI report (C11-C12). He informed the assembly about upcoming SDMI opportunities this coming year.

Rev. Kester invited Rev. Megan Wigham to the podium to offer highlights from her NYI report (C9-C10).

Rev. Kester invited Darrell Leber to the podium to talk about Jesus Film Harvest Partners. Their heart is to resource the church to reach new people.

Rev. Kester invited Rev. Tim Westerberg to the podium to read through the Memorial Roll for this year's assembly (D20). A brief prayer was offered in thanks for these lives and the legacy of faith they left.

Dr. Fred Fullerton came to the podium and on behalf of the university and President Pearsall brought their congratulations and thanks to the Washington Pacific district on our 75th anniversary. Dr. Fullerton directed the assembly's attention to a video designed to chronicle a story of five generations of impact for the good of humanity, the Kingdom, and Nazarene students, along with the help of Associate Vice President for Marketing & Public Relations, Mark Cork. He spoke about upcoming opportunities sponsored by and resources and programs offered through NNU.

Rev. Voelker reported the offering that was collected for the Joshua Project, which came to \$14,285. The assembly was thanked for their continued generosity.

The assembly then received the reports via video from our Samoan ministries. Lead pastors were invited to the platform during the video presentation.

The assembly then received the zone reports via video from the Metro North zone and the Metro South zone. Lead pastors were invited to the platform during the video presentation.

Rev. Kester introduced a video to talk about Welcome Home ministry. Following the video, Rev. Kester invited Rev. Dan Samuelson to come to the podium to share about the district's effort to care for refugees as the church.

The assembly then received the zone reports via video from the Mt. Rainier zone and the Columbia River zone. Lead pastors were invited to the platform during the video presentation.

The assembly then received the reports via video from our Hispanic ministries. Lead pastors were invited to the platform during the video presentation.

Rev. Kester invited Sonya Edgbert to the platform to allow the assembly to express our thanks for all of her hard work. Debe Loeber expressed thanks to Sonya on behalf of the District Advisory Board. Rev. Kester then allowed the assembly to express our appreciation to Debe Loeber for her work in helping to coordinate assembly over the past three years.

Dr. Crocker came to the podium to share some closing thoughts with the assembly, speaking about the power of one person, one pastor, one church, and one district to help transform those around them. God is always looking for one and it starts from there. The difference of the power of one was shown through a passage found in Ezekiel 22. He ended

with a prayer of blessing for the assembly to go and be the church, showing our communities the face of Christ.

Business for the assembly was officially adjourned and those present were dismissed.

V. REPORTS

A. DISTRICT OFFICERS

1. District Superintendent

During the last week of April 1944, allied forces were preparing for the June 6th D-Day invasion of Europe. That same week, Nazarenes representing churches of the North Pacific District were gathered at Portland First Church of the Nazarene with multiplication of ministry on their agenda. At that assembly, two new districts were created; both Oregon and Washington Pacific Districts were established on the same day 75 years ago. The actual beginning of the Church of the Nazarene in western Washington dates to the turn of the 20th century with Monroe, our oldest active church organized in 1906. Just to summarize the changes that have occurred in the Pacific Northwest since April of 1944 would require more space than I have available. Along with enormous change, some things have been constant. For more than 3,900 consecutive Sundays, Washington Pacific Nazarenes have gathered for worship with a desire to honor and experience the presence of God in our communities, churches, families and lives. Spending a lot of time reflecting on the past is likely not the best use of our time at this 75th Assembly, but acknowledging the inheritance we have been given is important. B.V. Seals, the first person to serve as district superintendent of the Washington Pacific District said it well, "We can profitably look back upon the past only if we go there to seek lessons for the future." His call to the district during his 20 years as superintendent was, "Move Forward." Many of the churches on our district owe their existence to those who planted churches in the 1940's and 50's. So, by faith we hear their voices encouraging us to find our way forward as well.

It is a beautiful thing when pastors and lay leaders work together and see the ministries they guide becoming places of new life for people. Using a variety of methods, but sharing the same life-giving message, our churches reported that 687 people made decisions to follow Jesus; 401 of those were obedient to the call to declare their faith publicly and were baptized; 526 people professed faith in Christ and joined with us officially, committing themselves to the mission of helping others become Christlike disciples. As is our pattern, the Washington Pacific District demonstrated our commitment to the global mission of the church around the world by contributing our part to the World Evangelism Fund. By reaching this goal, we celebrate the work of our church and encourage congregational development in 162 areas around the globe.

As you read the reports from local churches and hear pastors share about ministries in their communities, you will be encouraged by all the good things that are happening across the Washington Pacific District. Both the number of baptisms and new members joining with local churches is larger than last year. These are good leading indicators of health, but we continue to see the total number of people attending our primary worship services decline. When we totaled the reports, we finished this year averaging 239 fewer people in worship each week than last year. Our discipleship attendance reflects that this year, 378 fewer people attended Sunday school, small groups or other spiritual growth opportunities each week. I've rarely talked with a pastor or lay leader who didn't find this declining trend troubling and discouraging.

Reasons for the overall decline of church attendance in the United States and Canada are the frequent subject of books, studies and blogs. Without question, the church has lost much of its favored position in the culture and has been pushed toward the margins of our society. Methods of evangelism and congregational development that once worked effectively, don't seem to bring the same result. It is not difficult to find good research that provides logical reasons for current trends in church attendance. But I was reminded recently that if we aren't careful, we can recite valid reasons for our circumstances and those reasons can easily drift and become the excuses we use for no longer pursuing solutions or taking responsibility. Following this path, we can find ourselves feeling victimized, hopeless and apathetic. The opposite extreme has the potential of being even more dangerous. If, despite valid reasons for difficult circumstances, we assume responsibility for things outside of our control, the result can be a debilitating discouragement or depression. Near the end

of Matthew 11, Jesus denounces the communities where most of his miracles had occurred because with all that they had witnessed, they were unrepentant. Seeing people being slow to commit to life transformation was frustrating even for Jesus. His encouragement in the face of difficult ministry is, “my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.” Spending your life and energy trying to keep all the charts and graphs moving up and to the right can be a very heavy burden. Jesus calls us to “yoke up” with him and promises to never leave us to do the work of ministry alone. For the days ahead, we need Jesus – it was true in 1944 and it is true 75 years later.

Finding our way Forward

At a recent retreat for district superintendents in the USA and Canada, General Superintendent David Graves called us to **desperate prayer** for the North American church. Let’s do that – pray that Paul’s list from his great prayer for the Ephesians might be true for us, *“That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead....”* If you walk through the front door of the district office on Monday – Friday one of the first things you’ll see is a small, free-standing chalkboard with a decorative frame. On that board are the names of 4 or 5 churches that we are praying for that day. That little board represents a spiritual truth and a good intention. It reminds us that we need to support each other in prayer and “unless the Lord builds the house, those who build, labor in vain.” The list has always been available on WaPac E-Quips, but we will post it daily on social media to make it easier to find. We believe that prayer for God’s kingdom to come and his will to be done is our priority. Let’s write prayer on our hearts and into our calendars and with the disciples ask, “Lord teach us to pray.”

It wasn’t until 1977, that the Church of the Nazarene began using worship attendance as the major metric for determining the strength of a local church. Before 1977, it was Sunday school attendance that was tracked. Not that this has ever been an either-or question, both discipleship training and corporate worship are important to the overall health of the local church, but we have emphasized worship attendance for the last 40 years. I know as the pastor of a local church and now as a district superintendent, I’ve focused on worship attendance as the metric to measure congregational development. In a society formed around Christian standards, where the Bible was valued and authoritative, spending an hour or so on Sunday in worship, prayer and being reminded in a 30 or 40-minute sermon of the foundations beneath those values, may have been suitable, but our current situation, especially in western Washington is significantly different than that. Because we serve a mission field, leadership development and discipleship training are crucial to our work and future. The spiritual health of the congregation must be a collaborative effort between pastors and godly lay leaders. The solution is not to deemphasize the quality and importance of the worship service, but let’s give the same passion to the discipleship/leadership development of the congregation. The specific assignment Jesus left us is to make disciples of all nations, baptize them and teach them to obey his commandments.

It will always be our desire to provide opportunities for pastors and leaders to learn new skills and have the resources they need to help churches that are stalled find renewed vitality. This time last year, we were working on a plan to follow up on the work that Lyle Pointer facilitated for us in Vibrant Church Renewal. As we were making our plans, we learned that the USA/Canada regional office had the same desire and were nearly ready to make their project available to us. The RAND Project for Vibrant Church Renewal is designed to equip pastors and lay leaders through training, support, and accountability. This high commitment project is built around pastors of 4 churches working together with lay leaders as a cohort to see plateaued and declining churches turn around. Two groups are currently forming.

Our district runs from the Hood River Bridge on the Columbia River to the Canadian border. We have churches in towns and cities all along the way. There is no way that all the support for our congregations and church plants can happen from the district office in

Olympia. Reports of churches working together more effectively by sharing resources, facilities, ideas, training and prayer are exactly what needs to happen moving forward. On May 8 & 9, Missional Zone leaders will gather for a short retreat to plan and pray about ways that churches can be even more supportive of each other during this coming assembly year.

Planting new churches continues to be an essential part of our strategy to “establish and resource the development of healthy churches.” Simple Life Church with Pastor Brandon Marten and Trinity Church with Pastor Shawn DeOrnellis were officially organized in March. Both churches have their own unique approach to ministry. Simple Life centers around home gatherings with an intentional service to the community emphasis and Trinity ministers to the needs of a retirement village. Creative ideas for church plants that minister effectively to diverse groups of people are needed and the opportunities are limitless. As an example, at last year’s Assembly, we introduced Samuel and Esther Hong from South Korea. Over the last year their new church plant ministering to Korean people has been parented by the Bethel Church. It has been a pleasure to watch this little group grow from one family into an effective small church. Just a few weeks ago they launched a ministry to children with volunteers from Bethel.

We have active plans for church plants in Seattle and Bellingham. The development of ministry in the city of Seattle, as we expected, has unique and significant challenges. The secular population, the price of housing and an underlying suspicion of all things Christian, call for creative approaches to ministry. Shaun Mattson, Mark Woodward, Brain Wardlaw, Regina Conlon and Paul Johnson continue to meet weekly to pray, dream and give effort to finding the most effective way forward. They were joined this year by Michael and Hilary Skinner, who are now part of the project and ministering in the city from the Mosaic Coffee House at Seattle First Church. Their youth, energy and passion add strength and fresh ideas to the ministry team. We are committed to the city and are making God-honoring dreams and plans an ongoing prayer for The Seattle City Project.

Earlier this month a group of 7 of us met at Generations Church in Marysville to dream about the planting of a church in Bellingham. Until just the last few years, the Church of the Nazarene has had a congregation in Bellingham. Our church was first organized there in 1911 and we are making plans to restart. This report doesn’t have room for the whole story, but in January we closed on a piece property that we needed to sell. The result of this sale is that we will have resources to reinvest in Bellingham and other locations. We will also have a lease on a church building that will be built on the property. The lease agreement will give us exclusive use of the building for \$1.00 a month for 100 years as part of the sales agreement negotiated by our District Advisory Board. I have been so thankful for the way I believe we have been provisionally led - the foundation is being laid for something good to happen in Bellingham.

Launching, restarting, refocusing, combining, and sometimes even closing congregations is part of what we must do to be faithful to the future of our mission. 115 years of continuous ministry in western Washington have given us a rich heritage of faith and more than 100 million dollars’ worth of real property. The challenging side is that many of our congregations are comprised of “builders” and “boomers”- many of them among the finest people I know - saints of God, but aging none the less. Our buildings, which list among our assets are showing signs of age and in many cases show a lack of consistent maintenance. So, it is a blessing when local churches see the larger vision and share their strength and resources to plant, restart, support or share space with another ministry. A few examples are: the restart of the Maple Valley congregation where The Rescue Church is taking an active role in seeing that church have a fresh vision, renewed resources and the hope of an effective future. Pleasant View has made their facility available to Simple Life Church as a place to gather and worship. Vancouver Real Life and Safe Harbor churches are working together to see the complete renovation of the old Vancouver Central building giving both churches remodeled space to use and grow. This collaboration will provide for decades of productive ministry on a street where tens of thousands of cars pass every day. These kinds of changes aren’t always easy or without some sense of loss, but the fruit of this type of team work is good stewardship of resources.

Ministry to youth and children is as important as anything we do – perhaps the most important thing. Local churches that are using their influence and resources to focus on ministry to children are making a wise investment. I am so grateful to the youth and children’s leaders across the district who have built a strong tradition for summer camping. The summer of 2017 was just a few short of a total of 800 campers and leaders. Thanks to James Matthews and Megan Wigham and their teams for providing such excellent leadership. SDMI and NYI have excellent leaders and we are seeing wonderful results from these ministry teams.

Encouraging and facilitating compassionate ministry has always been near the heart of what it means to be part of the Church of the Nazarene. I love the idea that started in the heart of Dr. Margaret Scott to establish an organization that would connect, train and resource efforts by local churches to meet real needs in local communities. Nazarene Compassionate Alliance – Northwest is a good ministry that bridges the Cascades and is giving support to both the Washington Pacific and Northwest Districts. An example of how this connecting ministry can work, happened at our White Salmon Pinecrest Church in February. For years, our church in that community has had a desire to reach the people living in an apartment complex adjacent to the church. There have been a few attempts, but nothing has been sustainable. Language and cultural barriers always seemed to be an obstacle. A fire swept through one of the apartment buildings on the morning of February 6th displacing 6 families and giving the church the perfect opportunity to put action to their longstanding desire. In the middle of the night, Pastor Randy Porter opened the church to the 6 families and allowed both the Red Cross and first responders to use the church as a base of operation. Following the initial crisis, the church became the community center for meeting the ongoing needs of the displaced families. A call to NCA/NW resulted in amazing resources to help the families put their lives back together. Dr. Scott was able, through a connection with World Vision, to acquire an entire truckload of new furniture that the local church distributed to the families. The result is that people were helped, friendships established, and there is a brand-new thriving ministry to next door neighbors. I’m not hoping for more crisis situations, but I am hoping for examples of more of this kind of connecting and resourcing.

At the first of May, following last year’s assembly the District Advisory Board voted to back a new initiative in connection with Nazarene Compassion Alliance/Northwest. At this year’s assembly we’re looking forward, officially introducing “Welcome Home,” a ministry to refugees who are finding a home in western Washington. Dan Samuelson is the director of this new ministry and has a background in leadership with both World Vision and World Relief. He is using his expertise working with refugees to help members of our local churches have the information and training needed to reach out with love and compassion to people who have fled desperate situations around the world. In this year’s assembly, you will hear some of the good things that are already happening in our local churches and the lives of refugees because of this new WaPac ministry.

This year, we will ordain 6 of our district licensed ministers. Our district secretary, Dr. Ben Norris and the Board of Ministry, have been working diligently to guide and assist our Ministers in Development in preparation for a life of productive ministry. As a Minister in Development (MID) takes steps from an initial local license, to the granting and renewal of a district license, they are encouraged by the talented team of leaders who meet with them annually to encourage their progress toward ordination. We currently have 50 MID in the preparation, 5 of them receiving a district license for the first time and 45 whose licenses will be renewed at this year’s Assembly. We are so grateful for the leadership of Dr. Ben Norris, (chair), Pastor Brad Edgbert (secretary), Pastor Craig Laughlin and Dr. Tom Shaw for giving excellent leadership to the ministerial preparation process.

Giving assistance and accountability to my office as district superintendent, is the work of the District Advisory Board. This group elected by the assembly meets 5 times a year to give overall leadership to the district. When faced with complex decisions, I am so thankful for the wisdom and years of experience that is present on this board. Giving leadership to the district this year are lay members Heidi Anderson, Randy Freeby, Debbie Kuykendall, Debe Loeber and Dick Halvorson. Pastors making up the clergy side of the

board are Dave Ness, Ben Norris, David Rodes, Ev Tustin and Tim Westerberg. Careful financial stewardship is important to any organization; we are blessed to have the services of Steve Walden as our District Treasurer. His understanding of finance and his experience are so appreciated. These are people that I have grown to trust and admire for the thoughtful and godly wisdom they provide.

It is our desire that our ministries would reflect the diversity that is present in our communities. Helping us make this intention a reality, are directors of groups whose heart language is something other than English. Taulima Oge directs our ministry to Samoans and Ryan Foster directs our work with Hispanics. Both leaders are involved in coordinating, training and developing these churches and ministries. In addition to these, we have churches where the predominate language is Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean and Tagalog. Visiting one of our churches like Kent Hillside, that is developing a multiple cultural approach to ministry, you will find even more diversity of people and languages. As we increase our effective ministry to immigrants and refugees, we hope to expand the number of language groups impacted by the Church of the Nazarene in western Washington.

Last summer Sonya Edgbert began work in the district office as our administrative assistant. I'm sure you have already come to appreciate her calm and helpful manner. She's learning the assignment quickly and is helping us with all the details that need to be cared for to keep the ministries of our district running smoothly. We are grateful to have her serving with us.

Sharon and I are grateful to have the opportunity to work with so many outstanding pastors and churches on the Washington Pacific District. We are working together to fulfill the mission of the district by "establishing and resourcing the development of healthy churches." Just because the district is 75 years old, doesn't mean we have to act our age! We are still strong and vital. Good days are ahead.

2. District Hispanic Ministries Coordinator

March 1st, 2018, I began ministry as the WaPac Hispanic Ministries Coordinator on an interim basis. As such, I find myself trying to bring a report to the district assembly after only one month in this ministry. As I have begun to assume this new role it is increasingly clear to me that WaPac is blessed with a fantastic group of hardworking Hispanic Pastors. These dedicated men and women serve in congregations throughout Western Washington and it is a privilege to be able to serve alongside them.

This past year our district hosted several events and conferences geared toward Hispanic pastors, laity, and youth. These events were quite successful. This year we are planning to continue a similar focus and will have more details at the end of April. Since beginning this new role, much of my work has been focused on gaining a better understanding of the challenges facing our Hispanic Pastors and strengthening relationships. This will continue to be a focus for me in the coming year.

At this moment we have congregations functioning in 11 different locations from White Salmon to Mount Vernon. This geographical separation makes it difficult to stay connected. I am thankful for the commitment of our pastors to meet together on the last Saturday of each month for worship, prayer, and time together in community. This monthly meeting rotates between our congregations, giving us the opportunity to learn a little more about the specific context in which each church functions.

Another area we must celebrate is education. We have a roster of more than 20 students who have been participating in ministerial education and that number continues to grow. Please pray for these students and for more of our local people to hear God's call ministry. There is much work to be done among the Hispanic population of Western Washington. The State reports that in King, Pierce and Snohomish counties alone there are close to 310,000 people of Hispanic origin. The rest of our district is no exception with many counties reporting a Hispanic population of nearly 10%. This represents a large segment of our population which continues to grow. We must seek to raise up new leaders to meet this challenge.

Finally, I am thankful for the help and support of our Hispanic Pastors and District Superintendent. I would not be able to fulfill my role without their hard work and dedication to the expansion of the ministry of the Church of the Nazarene among the Hispanic population of Western Washington. If it were not for these Pastors going above and beyond fulfilling their call in the congregations they serve, much important work would go undone.

From the beginning the Bible is the story of God's plan to reconcile the world to Him. It's the story of a Father who longs for connectivity, a Savior who desires that all come to repentance, a Shepherd who seeks the one lost sheep, and a Prince who leaves His throne to rescue the one He loves. Genesis to Revelation, God is beckoning all His sons and daughters to partner with Him in bringing every "tribe, tongue and nation" to gather around His throne. This gathering is not just for a select few, but a Great Multitude, too numerous to count. An assembly from all the nations, and languages - countless, innumerable, international, and multicultural. Can you imagine how amazing that will be?

God has always sent forth his representatives to bring reconciliation, redemption and healing to the world. At the pinnacle, He sent His only Son as the ultimate missionary, to bring the best news. Jesus clearly understood His mission on earth. At age 12 he said, "I must be about my father's business," and 21 years later, dying on the cross, he said, "It is finished." In between these bookends that frame his life Jesus ministered to the vulnerable, marginalized, abused and the lost. He healed the blind, fed the hungry and gave living water to those that thirst.

The Son who was sent also sends - Jesus sends us, His church, a community united around one mission to continue that which He came to do, reconciling people to God. In John 17:18, Jesus prays to His Father, "As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world." We are His people sent to live as a reflection of His character to, for, and in all the nations.

Spoken at least five times in five different ways in five different books of the Bible, the Great Commission is OUR mission. Christ calls to us, "See what I am doing? This is where my heart is. Come and be a part of the greatest love story ever told." This Great Mission is actually the Great Invitation and it propels us to use what we can, where we can, to reach any part of this world we can. Missions is not just one task among many that we do, it is what we are. Reflecting the character of Jesus in a broken world is what defines us as His followers and is a natural part of who we are as His people. We are missionary people because our God is a missionary God.

Since the day of Pentecost, the mission of God has been an outward focused movement, always pointing in the direction of others. Jesus told his disciples that they would be witnesses for Him in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and the ends of the earth. You and I are here this morning because the first community of believers took seriously His words to go into the entire world! May we also be a people who are faithful to those instructions.

Our mission often takes place in the everyday and ordinary, locally and globally. The entire world becomes the stage in which we live out God's story.

As a denomination, the Church of the Nazarene strives to be faithful to the mission that God has given His Church.

In 2017, the Church of the Nazarene:

- Is established in 162 world areas
- Welcomed 146,577 new members
- Witnessed 221,730 decisions to follow Christ
- Launched 1,319 new churches
- Deployed 685 missionaries from 59 world areas.
- And gave \$37.8 million to World Evangelism Fund

Today, our denomination consists of a community with 2,550,374 members and 30,875 churches.

Did you know: On an average Sunday in 2017, about 1.5 million people attended a Nazarene church and worshipped in 190 different languages?

Here on the WaPac District:

- \$ We gave \$957,373 to the World Evangelism Fund

- \$ 694,043 to NMI approved specials which includes the
 - 72% of the WaPac churches that collectively gave nearly \$175,000 to Compassionate Ministries

We sent 41 people from 16 different churches to Africa Nazarene University in November to minister in many ways: painting the library, replacing lights, teaching sewing, ministering to children and youth, tiling bathrooms, and remodeling a dorm room. It was the largest W&W team the University ever received and the largest district team sent from WaPac. Praise God!

Within a span of four weeks, the hurricane trio of Harvey, Irma and Maria made the 2017 hurricane season the costliest ever. Death toll was nearly 400, overall losses reached around \$21 billion, and thousands of people were displaced. The rebuilding will go on for many years. Wapac's response was quick and significant.

Within a few days of the Hurricane Harvey we quickly rallied to fill a 16' trailer with Crisis Care Kits, and other compassionate supplies. Praise God! Thank you to so many of you that gave and prayed, and gave some more. Thank you to Pastor RJ and Kacy Strickland for driving the truck and being WaPac's hands and feet in Houston. The compassionate supplies were delivered to those needing help in Houston and our Crisis Care Kits were immediately loaded onto another truck and sent to Florida as Hurricane Irma had just hit.

When we heard of the need to restock the depleted supplies of Crisis Care Kits, we loaded up another trailer and sent nearly 400 Kits to Hands of Hope Warehouse in Nampa. And there are approximately 600 more kits ready to leave on Wednesday. Thank you for reflecting Jesus' compassion.

In just a few short weeks our District Superintendent will be leading a team to Dominica. They will be rebuilding one of the 6 Nazarene churches that were destroyed by Hurricane Maria. They go with our blessings, our financial support and our prayers.

Mission is not always about crossing the oceans, jungles and deserts. Sometimes it's about crossing the street in your neighborhood. For years we have prayed that God would open the doors in the 10/40 window for ministry. In all those years of praying did we ever imagine that God would bring the 10/40 window to us? Today there are still 16,600 ethnic people groups that are considered unreached in the world. But did you know that according to the International Mission Board's Global Research, the United States has at least 282 identifiable, unengaged and unreached people groups? The United States - right here - right in our community there are unengaged and unreached people groups. Our mission field has arrived at our doorstep. The flags that line our sanctuary are a reflection of our district – of the immigrants and refugees – that fill our churches and our neighborhoods. Praise God!

Kent is one of the most diverse cities in the Puget Sound region. Looking for ways to engage and minister to the growing refugee and immigrant population, Kent Hillside joined forces with World Relief, and conservation agencies to transform an under-utilized acre of paved parking lot into the Paradise Parking Plots Community Garden.

The gardens will serve families from 14 different countries by providing 50 sustainable plots, where refugees, immigrants, and local community members can gather to grow culturally appropriate foods that promote a healthier lifestyle, foster economic independence, and build community.

Kent Hillside is located in the heart of a food desert. The U.S. Department of Agriculture defines food deserts as areas where at least 20 percent of people earn below the poverty line and 33 percent live more than a mile from a supermarket. Since many new immigrants and refugees do not have access to a car, getting groceries can be a daunting challenge. In addition, produce is costly and can quickly use up any available funds. Located on a bus route, Hillside Paradise Parking Plots tries to fill the void by providing a space where people can grow food and get to know their neighbors.

As Tahmina Martelly, a member of Kent Hillside Church and a World Relief employee describes it, community gardens provide a space to “connect to community, connect to the soil, connect to food – and make it feel like home.” By creating this community

garden, Hillside Church and World Relief are giving refugees and immigrants a renewed sense of belonging and community.

Each of our local Nazarene churches, with their own unique DNA, is God's gift to their communities, the nation and the world. There are so many examples across our district of ways that our churches are outward focused. Churches like Battle Ground Starting Grounds that offers respite care for families of special needs children through the Buddy Break program; Forks Nazarene that partners with other churches in their community and the city of Forks, to serve over 4000 meals a year; Mt Vernon Nazarene adopted a local elementary school. They find creative ways to honor the staff and faculty members, and provide school supplies, clothing and backpacks for those children who 'fall in the cracks'. Our White Salmon Church became the staging area as well as incident command center for the fire department when a fire broke out in a neighboring apartment complex. They hosted displaced families in their Sunday School rooms, and worked with other local churches and organizations to help the families get back on their feet. Their compassion changed the character of their church and community. Nearly every single one of our WaPac Nazarene Churches reached out into their community and made a difference. We are a compassionate people because our God is a compassionate God.

Never before has the church had the opportunity that we have today to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. Let's not squander this precious gift, for we were created for such a time as this! It is so amazing that He invites us to be intimately involved in His story. May He give us a renewed desire to see the good news of Jesus Christ proclaimed to the very ends of the earth. One day we will join the multitudes from every tribe, tongue and nation singing Hallelujah around God's throne. I can't wait!

5. District SDMI Chair

Stepping into a position previously held by an amazing leader, such as Tony Johnson, is not an easy task. Thankfully, he was willing to assist me throughout the transition. Under his leadership and with the guidance of the District Office, the SDMI and Assembly have evolved over the past six years into one of the greatest models for other districts. I would like to thank Jerry Kester and Tony Johnson for responding to my numerous text messages, phone calls and emails, as I have tried to discover what it means to guide the WaPac SDMI. Thank you, Sonya Edgbert, for your hard work and patience as I continue to understand my role and responsibilities. Of course, the biggest support has come from the SDMI council. Thank you, Pat Crane, Justin Barksdale, Jeff Borden, Shaun Mattson, Todd Strom, Kelly Bogart, Jan Apps, Sharon Kester and Sueanne Skeen. It has been my privilege to learn and serve together.

This past fall, during our Minister and Mates retreat, Jerry posed a question which has challenged me as SDMI Chair and helped me to challenge the SDMI council. How do we best resource the local church to make disciples? I believe, in ministry, we have all gone through seasons where we have shifted our focus off the mission and placed greater emphasis on numbers, budgets, and other agendas that don't grow the Kingdom. Of course, we realize that resources are needed to reach people and counting heads has a place, but I believe God has called us to be more than just role takers. During our council meetings this year, we spent many hours talking about discipleship. We brainstormed ideas on how to equip the local church to disciple those in our churches. Although we were unable to actualize some of the ideas during this calendar year, we hope to implement some of these ideas over the next year.

While I am still learning what it means to be an SDMI leader, the great district of WaPac has continued to thrive, thanks to our many great ministry leaders. Once again, we have seen growth in the lives of Children's Ministry, Men's and Women's Ministry and Primetime Ministry.

- Children's Camp:** The WaPac Kids Camp at Miracle Ranch continues to be a phenomenal and impactful event. This past summer we had the privilege of ministering to nearly 190 kids with the help of over 50 adults. Our worship was led by the Bethel Nazarene youth band and Pastor Dave Mowry made a return to the PNW to deliver our evening messages. During our first year of moving camp to Miracle Ranch the camp team decided to implement a 15-minute quiet time every morning. The idea of trying to get that many kids quiet all at once is overwhelming. As we continued the same rhythm again this year, I was amazed at the way God spoke to the kids and leaders during that small window of time. We were reminded that God desires to speak to us, we just need to settle ourselves and listen. Thank you to all the volunteers and counselors who came and gave of themselves to minister to the amazing kids on our District. Thank you, Kelly Bogart, Tim Edgbert, Paula Johnson, Ashley Forsberg and Blake Caldwell for the many, many hours you put in to making camp a success.
- Women of WaPac:** What a great year it has been. As a council, we decided that our Women's Ministry Luncheon at District Assembly would be the focus of our attention. It is a sell-out every year and has become a great time to reconnect, refocus and retool. We've encouraged the women on our district to organize and implement activities as Missional Zones, that would enable smaller, medium and large churches to share resources and get to know each other on a smaller scale, rather than larger, district-wide scale. We have received reports of zone leaders that took advantage of that, had great success. Many of our churches have their own Women's Ministry retreats and that seems to be more cost effective and time sensitive. Our Women's Ministry Facebook page enables us to share ideas, prayer requests and post activities all around the district. We've promoted Come to the Fire, The Gathering (a retreat for women married to ordained and district licensed clergy), and the NW Ministry Conference as larger group activities that our women can take advantage of. Thank you to Sueanne Skeen, who has led us and organized us to be more effective on our district and in our churches.
- Prime Time Ministry:** What a wonderful privilege it has been to see God open new windows to senior adult ministries in the WaPac district. Forty-one people from WaPac district went to the Fraser Valley Gleaners in British Columbia. This charity makes dried soup mix for people in need and ships worldwide. Last year, they provided 14 million meals. WaPac will partner with Fraser Valley Gleaners again April 24-26. The Gleaners also ships hand-made clothing to children in the Philippines. WaPac delivered four hundred dresses and shorts in December 2017 and eight hundred in January of this year. PrimeTime Ministry has exciting opportunities coming soon. The PrimeTime Retreat and conference will take place May 8-10 and feature speakers Dr. Scott Daniels and Cynthia Tobias Talley. This will be a refreshing time of getaway and renewal. Grandparenting mini-seminars are being constructed and developed. At district assembly we will have a workshop dedicated to influencing our grandchildren for Christ and encouraging them to become disciples. Grandparenting is one of the most beautiful experiences we can have. We want to leave a legacy. Pray for the senior adults in our WaPac district. Pray that we will not lose the vision of having a hope and a future for Christ. Thank you, Jan Apps and your PrimeTime team for all you have done to serve many around the world.
- Willow Creek Global Leadership Summit:** Kent Hillside Church served as a satellite site for this amazing leadership conference. Of the people in attendance, there was a wonderful cross-section of church leaders, people from the business

community, and Spanish speakers as the simulcast was translated for them. This was a powerful, inspiring, and equipping two days. Plan to be a part of the Global Leadership Summit again this summer, August 9 & 10. We have arranged to make the discounted rate available to you and your leaders whether you attend at the Kent Hillside Church, or at a site in your local community. Thanks to Ev Tustin and the awesome Kent Hillside staff for making this a great time of leadership development.

I am encouraged by the impact made this year through WaPac SDMI. I am hopeful of the year ahead. I envision more teamwork, more innovation, and more life change. God is on the move.

4. Church Properties Board

The Church Properties Board and the District Advisory Board have acted on the following church property issues and requests:

Olympia Mountain View - Approved their request to sell a 7.5 acre portion of excess land on their church property located at 940 Israel Rd SW, Tumwater, WA. Funds would be used to pay down or eliminate the current debt.

Bellevue New Hope - Offered input on whether or not to take a payout on their cell tower lease.

Bellingham - Worked in consultation with the DAB on the sale/lease agreement of the property the district owns.

Battle Ground - Approved their request to sell a 5 acre parcel of property the church owns for \$225,000.

Federal Way - Approved their request to sell a 3.5 acre portion of their excess land on their church property located at 1525 SW Dash Point Rd, Federal Way, WA. for \$1,100,000. A portion of the proceeds would be used to do needed repairs and some upgrades on the current facility.

Poulsbo Connection Point - Approved the harvesting of timber on unused property they own.

Ridgefield - Approved a \$314,000 remodel project on their existing building/facilities. No debt will be incurred to fund this project.

West Seattle - Helped the church finalize a substantial development project approved by the DAB 4 years ago. Once the project is finalized, permitted and buyout is paid by the developer the church anticipates a profit of around \$825,000.

Kalama - Approved their request to sell a 5.4 acre portion of excess land on their church property located at 501 Cloverdale Rd, Kalama, WA. for \$275,000.

Vancouver Real Life Community and Vancouver Safe Harbor - Worked in consultation with the DAB on the sale of the Real Life property for \$1,310,000. Proceeds will be used to

complete substantial property repairs and upgrades on the Safe Harbor church building. Real Life will own the Safe Harbor property/buildings and Safe Harbor will have shared use. **Camas** - Approved their request to sell a small portion of their land (72'x120') located behind a parsonage they own on their property to a developer.

2. In the light of the remarkable success and blessing presently being enjoyed by many of our churches involved in the ministry of Faith Promise, as well as the increased funds available to the cause of world evangelism, we heartily recommend that each church give prayerful consideration to the establishment of Faith Promise giving.

3. We recommend that the churches struggling with their Funding the Mission goals confer with the district superintendent. With concern for local church health and commitment to operating district ministries as efficiently and as economically as possible, the District Assembly Finance Committee recommends that the District Advisory Board review annual church finance reports, and to visit with any church regarding the equanimity of its report.

4. That members of the local church receive, at the discretion of the district superintendent, regular communication regarding the total district program of Funding the Mission.

Insurance and Properties

5. That the pastor give special attention to filing (a) the nonprofit corporation registration with the Secretary of State by the last day of your anniversary month (the month in which your church was incorporated), and (b) the tax exemption forms for the church and parsonage properties with the State Department of Revenue by March 31. (Notices are sent to each church by the State of Washington.) That the deadline due dates be printed in pastors' letters. That each new pastor be notified by letter from the district superintendent regarding these requirements. Also, that the district office keep on file (a) the federal ID tax number, (b) state property tax exemption number, and (c) the Labor and Industries account ID number for each church.

6. That each local church carry liability and malpractice insurance and that Labor and Industries insurance, as required by law, be carried for every pastor and paid employee. That each year the local church evaluate the adequacy of its property insurance and, if necessary, adjust to current replacement costs.

Missional Vision

7. That the local church consider, at appropriate times, the support of the District Missional Vision through Funding the Mission and participation on assigned district Work and Witness projects. District mission's projects may count as 10% giving.

8. That every church pay its Education Share in full. For the **2018-2019** school year, Northwest Nazarene University will match all local church scholarships of \$350 per year as follows:

9. That each church supports the training of Nazarene ministers and missionaries by taking special offerings on:

October 7, 2018 for Nazarene Bible College

January 20, 2019 for Nazarene Theological Seminary.

And further, promote the distribution of God's Word through an offering for the American Bible Society on **December 19, 2018**. These funds may be sent through the district office.

SDMI, NYI, and NMI Ministries

10. That the financial support of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, Nazarene Youth International and Nazarene Missions International be cared for through district Funding the Mission.

11. Since the district director of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, the district NMI president, and the district NYI president are not salaried positions, we recommend that churches using their services pay their expenses.

Ministerial Support

12. That each church support the pastor and family in prayer and have concern for their ministry, and that the pastor's leadership be recognized and followed; that the pastor's salary be a preferred claim on the local church and be reviewed annually. In salary reviews, local professional positions of like responsibility should be considered, taking into account education, tenure and preparation. Further, those other benefits, such as Social Security and adequate health insurance, be provided for both pastor and other staff members and that the local church reimburses their pastor for professional expenses (auto expenses and depreciation, entertainment, conferences, continuing education, etc.).

That each church supports its pastor and pastoral staff in the establishment of tax-sheltered annuities. (Complete information is available from the Board of Pensions & Benefits in Kansas City and at www.pbusa.org.)

13. That the local church board provide for reimbursement of expenses incurred by ministerial staff in attending necessary conventions, district functions, education workshops, etc. That each church be encouraged to provide continuing education for the pastor, including a library allowance where possible. That an amount be set aside regularly, in a separate fund, to send the pastor and spouse to the General Assembly.

14. That each church, and the district, encourage pastoral renewal for its pastoral family through:

- a. regular use of at least one day each week for rest and relaxation;
- b. vacation time, given with full pay and with the church paying for pulpit supply, built around the pattern of:
 - (1) two weeks for pastors who have served the denomination up to five years;
 - (2) three weeks for pastors serving in the denomination from 6 to 15 years;
 - (3) four weeks for pastors serving in the denomination more than 15 years;
 - (4) Vacation is to be taken in the year earned unless prior approval is given by the church board.
- c. provisions for study and education of at least one week per year, apart from normal church functions (district assembly, etc.), paid by the local church and subject to prior church board approval with a subsequent report to the church board;
- d. camps, assemblies, conventions, etc. are considered as part of the pastor's responsibilities and not a portion of their vacation.
