III. Ministerial Development Regulations and Procedures

A. THE ROLE OF THE DISTRICT BOARD OF MINISTERIAL DEVELOPMENT

The role of the District Board of Ministerial Development is to combine the work of the former Ministerial Studies Board and Board of Credentials in order that we might improve the quality of our ministerial education. Our mission is to implement a competency-based curriculum which will emphasize the elements of Content, Competency, Character and Context as spelled out in the Sourcebook for Ministerial Development.

C. STUDY REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

Eligibility

The District Ministerial Studies Board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open to local ministers (*Manual*, par. 426.4) and licensed ministers pursuing elder or deacon ordination (*Manual*, pars. 427.1 and 428.1). Refer to the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* (latest edition) for specific requirements for each course of study.

How to Enroll in the Course of Study

Persons wishing to enroll in the Course of Study (COS) need to have a letter requesting enrollment sent to the Board Ministerial Development secretary by their pastor. Current name and address are necessary to complete the enrollment process. The student enrollment fee is \$50.00. There is also a \$25 per year fee for ongoing transcript assessment and record keeping. A check payable to Washington Pacific District should accompany the enrollment request.

Transcripts must be sent to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Development so they may be evaluated as to placement in the Course of Study.

Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts university or Nazarene Bible College and, if possible, Nazarene Theological Seminary. The modules for the Course of Study are also available on-line through Northwest Nazarene University and Nazarene Bible College and Washington Pacific Spanish CLT classes. Other educational options need to be reviewed by the District Board of Ministerial Development to ensure credit. If an applicant is not established in a pastorate and is reasonably unencumbered, it will do both him or her a great service if the board of his or her local church will insist insisting that the candidate be trained for the ministry in the church's educational institutions.

We understand that in the midst of ministry, education can demand a great deal of time and energy. We would emphasize that a 'call to minister' is a 'call to become a lifelong learner'.

Requirements of Modular Study

- A. Each candidate must become familiar with the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* before enrolling, in order to better understand the process and details of the entire program. We are recommending that each church purchase a *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* and make this available to prospective students. We also recommend that each pastor become familiar with Ministry Internship so they will be able to mentor students in their own church. These books may be obtained from the Nazarene Publishing House.
- B. Paragraph 427.3 states that all applicants desiring to renew a district license 'shall have completed at least two courses in a validated course of study'. It makes clear that if the student has not done so "the license may be renewed by the district assembly only upon submission of a written explanation for this failure. Such explanation shall be satisfactory to the District Ministerial Development Board and approved by the general superintendent presiding." All modules should be in process by December 31, in order to apply on the current assembly year.
- C. College, seminary, and Bible college students are reminded to request the registrar to send notification of completed work so that accurate records of student progress can be made.
- D. College and seminary students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with the requirements of the course of study. The final transcript at graduation will be evaluated by the District Board of Ministerial Development.

Mentor / Student Relationship

Supervised field education is a key component of ministerial development. In most cases your local pastor will serve the mentor role. In situations where a district licensed minister is serving as pastor, a mentor will be selected by the District Board of Ministerial Development.

Ordination: A Privilege, Not a Right

While the Church of the Nazarene requires that certain educational preparation and certain ministry requirements be fulfilled before a person can be ordained, it is understood that completion of these requirements does not automatically qualify a candidate for ordination. The Board of Ministerial Development will want to examine all spiritual, theological, personal and professional issues pertaining to a candidates fitness for ministry.

IV. Daily Proceedings

Opening Service

Wednesday Evening, April 6, 2011

The Mountain View Church of the Nazarene worship team opened the 68th District Assembly of the Washington Pacific District with the song "Praise the Lord" setting a tone of worship and celebration. Dr. Keith Wright, Interim District Assembly, brought greetings and welcomed the assembly. Dr. Wright welcomed Dr. Stan Reeder, the Oregon Pacific District Superintendent, & his wife and Dr. Stan Toler, General Superintendent, and his wife, Linda. Dr. Wright led the assembly in an opening prayer.

The Mountain View worship team, led by Cathy Freeby, led the assembly in a time of passionate and joy-filled worship. A rich and full spirit was felt by the assembly.

Rev. Craig Laughlin read from the Scriptures. Psalm 146 was read in unison by the assembly, followed by another extend time of musical worship.

We continued to worship as we watched the 'Chisel' video, as performed by The Skit Guys.

Cardboard testimonies, stories of transformation, from around the district were shared as we listened to "You Never Let Go," by Matt Redman and "Come See," by Michael W. Smith. As the cardboard testimonies were raised in conclusion, the assembly stood and applauded God's transformative grace and His faithfulness.

Dr. Keith Wright introduced and welcomed General Superintendent, Dr. Stan A. Toler, to the stage to bring the Word of God. Dr. Toler shared a message about "The Power of a Loving Church." Using the text of John 13.34-35, presented a powerful message, reminding us that: LOVE is the signature of the Christian faith, LOVE is at the heart of all church ministry, and LOVE is the obvious reflection of heart holiness.

Dr. Wright thanked Dr. Toler and reminded us that we start tomorrow morning at 8.30. He then introduced the Washington Pacific Hispanic ministry as the benefactor of our offering for the evening and prayed a brief prayer to bless our offering for the night. The Mountain View choir sang "Thou O Lord" for the offertory.

Dr. Wright thanked the assembly for their praise and participation. The assembly was dismissed until 8.30am on Thursday morning, April 7th.

Thursday Morning, April 7, 2011

Rev. Richard Hudson led the assembly in singing the song "To God Be the Glory" to open the business meeting of this 68th District Assembly of the Washington Pacific District of the Church of the Nazarene.

Dr. Keith Wright greeted the president of Northwest Nazarene University, Dr. David Alexander and his wife Sandy, who joined the assembly during the evening service last night.

Dr. Stan Reeder, the district superintendent from the Oregon Pacific District brought greetings, and expressed their love and concern for the Washington Pacific District during this critical period of our history. Dr. Reeder shared some the vision that the churches and districts of the Northwest are moving toward.

Dr. Wright thanked the Mountain View church and introduced host pastor Rev. Bill Bowers. Rev. Bowers welcomed us to Mountain View Church and oriented the assembly to the location of important services offered throughout the assembly. Rev. Bowers prayed to invite God's spirit into the assembly and asked for guidance and direction for the business of the assembly.

Dr. Toler shared stories about the blessed church ministry in Cali, Columbia and shared a story of some of our Nazarene people who face great trials and risks for the sake of the gospel. Dr. Toler read from Lamentations 3.18-23 to encourage and raise spirits for the work that must be done by the assembly.

Dr. Toler turned the floor over to Rev. Scott Shaw to organize the assembly. Rev. Shaw invited friends of the assembly to distribute packets to the members of the assembly.

Rev. Shaw read the list of Assembly Assistants as follows: Recording Secretary – Trent Friberg, Elections Secretary – Tony Johnson, Assembly Pages – David Chambers, Richard Hudson, Barry Kennard & Dennis Spinnie, Official Reader – Ben Norris, Daily Journal Committee – Jan Green & Malisa Winebrenner, and Journal & Statistical Secretary – Jan Green. The Boards of Tellers #1 & #2 and the Minute Men are listed in the delegate handbook. The times of the business of the assembly were set for Thursday, April 7 from 8.30a – 12.00p, 1.30p – adjournment, with the ordination service to follow at 7.00p. The voting area for the assembly was set as the entire floor of the sanctuary. Delegations that need alternates seated were invited to stand in order to receive the paperwork necessary to seat the alternates. Alternates seated were sent to the journal secretary for review and were approved.

Rev. Shaw reported that letters of greeting will be sent to our Washington Pacific sponsored missionaries which cannot be read, as some are placed in creative access areas. They will also be sent to former district superintendents Dr. Bert Daniels, Dr. Mel McCullough, & Dr. Hugh L. Smith.

Partial Report #1 of the Ministerial Development Board was referenced in the delegate handbook and partially read by Rev. Shaw. ***The report was moved, seconded and unanimously approved.***

The District Advisory Council (DAC) was invited to the stage to report on the search process for a new District Superintendent, and was offered by Rev. David Rodes. Rev. Rodes began by offering our thanks and appreciation to Dr. Wright for their year of service to the Washington Pacific District. Rev. Rodes introduced the members of District Advisory Council. Rev. Rodes talked to us about a new process for election whereby the DAC received permission to formulate a new process for electing a new DS. Upon receiving word that the candidate elected last year was declining the position as superintendent, the task of the DAC was to begin to define the mission of the district, 'To resource the development of healthy churches.' Rev. Shaw reported the results from the preliminary survey done across the Washington Pacific District. Rev. Voelker reported on the six focus groups that were held to discuss the results of the survey. Several priorities surfaced through the focus groups that were conducted. Rev. Bowers discussed the document entitled *Qualifications for District Leader*. Members of the DAC spent time touching on the six key qualifications we are looking for in a new District Superintendent:

- Missionally-motivated
- Carries a strong Wesleyan theological foundation
- Is an effective communicator
- Understands the call of the local church in today's world
- Is a creative thinker and leader
- Progressive in developing a vision for a new district structure

The goal is to provide a leader that will, in all ways, find a leader that will help support the local church ministry in all ways. Steve Walden shared some of the process about searching for a District Superintendent and someone was interviewed, but that initial door was closed. After much prayer, more names were discussed and another name began to surface as a viable candidate and another interview was conducted. Rev. Rodes discussed this second interview that went very well and there was confirmation from the candidate for his willingness to proceed in light of the *Qualifications for District Leader* document. The name of Jerry Kester was presented and a brief history of his ministry assignments was read and stories of his heart for ministry were shared. The DAC then made a formal nomination of Rev. Jerry Kester as a candidate for district superintendent for the Washington Pacific District.

Ballot #1 was distributed as a nomination ballot for the position of district superintendent. After distribution, Dr. Bert Daniels led the assembly in prayer for the election. Dr. Toler invited the assembly to mark their ballot and return them to Board of Tellers #1. Board of Tellers #1 was excused to tally the ballot.

Dr. Toler introduced several of the books that are available on the back table.

Dr. Wright invited all of the new pastors who have been installed in the previous year to the front of the assembly to be introduced with their spouses. Introduced to the assembly were Ron & Jane Tyler (Bethel - interim), Todd & Denise Futter (Carson), Dave & Joy Ness (Seattle North), Todd & Janna Puckett (RedWood Family), Brian & Jean Thomas (Ridgefield), Tim & Jane Stearman (Seattle Aurora - interim), Daniel & Laural Bibb (Seattle Olympic Hills), Ken & Carolyn Pults (Sequim Valley - interim), Garry & Linda Lewellen (Sequim Valley), Michael & Leslie Smith (Sky Valley), Bob & Marilyn Meade (White Salmon Pinecrest). All of our new Hispanic and Samoan pastors were unavailable as they are working. New associate pastors were introduced: Steve Ripp from Bonney Lake introduced Patti Crane. Dick Sales from Camas introduced Jonathan Meade. Mike Ford from Kirkland introduced Trevor Lee & Melissa Teeter.

Rev. Ben Norris was invited to the platform to read Partial Report #2. In this report it was recommended that the following individuals: Jeremy Seth Cook, Clifford "Chad" W. Leeson, Jr., Lisa J. Roberson, Nereida Rodriguez and Santos Rodriguez. Restoration of elder's orders to Donald C. Moore. **The approval of these ordination candidates was moved, seconded and passed unanimously.**

The assembly was invited to read Partial Reports #3 & #4 from the Ministerial Development Committee. **There was a motion and a second to adopt the report.** A member of the assembly stood to share their concern regarding David Jacobson and the conditions leading to the recommendation to not approve the renewal of his district license. Rev. Shaw discussed the rationale for removal and express the committee's hope and desire to see Mr. Jacobson renew his license in the future, should he be prepared and willing to do so. **The motion passed.**

Rev. Shaw read the results from Ballot #1 for District Superintendent as follows: Jeff Austin - 1, Bill Bowers - 2, Bill Coker, Jr - 1, Jan Green - 1, Jerry Kester - 338, Terry Ketchum - 1, Rocky J. Meade - 1, Ben Norris - 2, David Rodes - 4, Jeren Rowell - 1, Scott Shaw - 3, Tom Shaw - 2, Wes Smith - 1, Stan Toler - 1, Keith Wright - 1. 360 ballots were cast. 240 votes were needed to elect. **Rev. Jerry Kester was elected as District Superintendent of the Washington Pacific Church of the Nazarene.**

Rev. Norris was invited to the stage to read the recommendations A - F from Nominating Committee Report. The entire Nominating Committee Report was presented to the assembly in written form. **The report was moved, seconded and passed unanimously.**

Board of Tellers #2 was called to distribute Ballot #2 to elect members of the District Advisory Board, Northwest Nazarene University Trustees and Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries Chairperson. The assembly was invited to mark their ballots. Board of Tellers #2 was excused to tally ballot #2.

Dr. Toler invited the assembly to take a fifteen minute break.

Dr. Toler reconvened the assembly after a brief break. Rev. Shaw invited the assembly to turn to the District Advisory Board/District Advisory Council. **Reception of the report was moved, seconded and passed unanimously.** Rev. Shaw invited the assembly to review the Church Properties Board report. **Receptive of the report was moved, seconded and passed unanimously.** Rev Shaw invited the assembly to review the Education Committee report, highlighting the mission statement of our university and offered the corrections that the "Trusting Matching award has been increased from \$300 to \$350" and "award totaling \$2800." **Reception of the modified report was moved, seconded and passed unanimously.**

The assembly took time to view a video presented by Pensions & Benefits about the importance of the ministry of Nazarene Pensions and Benefits. Dr. Toler encouraged the assembly to do everything they can to fulfill 100% of the responsibilities given to the church for Pensions and Benefits.

Dr. Toler recognized Dr. Keith Wright and invited him to the podium to give his report as Interim District Superintendent. Dr. Wright took time to thank his wife for her support over the course of the year, as well as key district leaders who have contributed throughout the course of the past assembly year. Dr. Wright shared some of his goals and his priorities during his term of service. Bethany Hull Somers was invited to share her testimony of

God's faithfulness in the financial situation of the Mount Vernon Church. Dr. Wright shared of the importance that the churches of the Washington Pacific District reestablish the culture of team on the district. Bill Bowers reported by video about the 21-day fast that the Washington Pacific District experienced together in the month of January. David Rodes reported some of the results of fasting at the Puyallup Church and God's faithfulness and the faithfulness of his people. Dr. Wright concluded with the assertion that the church absolutely needs the re-emphasis of becoming a spiritually-infused and -energized church.

Rev. David Rodes came and expressed on behalf of the District Advisory Board and the entire district our thanks and appreciation for their year of service to the Washington Pacific District. A love offering was taken for the Wrights for purpose of gifting them with a trip to Hawaii for rest and renewal.

Reception of Dr. Wright's District Superintendent's report was moved, seconded and pass unanimously with great joy and celebration.

Rev. Shaw read the results from Ballot #2. 315 Ballots were cast. 158 votes were needed to elect. For the ministerial positions on the District Advisory Board: Craig Laughlin – 110, David Ness – 234, Ben Norris – 156, David Rodes – 242. ***David Rodes and David Ness were elected to a three-year term. Ben Norris was elected to a one-year term.*** For lay positions on the District Advisory Board: Heidi Anderson – 166, Tom Bourne – 87, Bill Carlson – 122, Randy Freeby – 178, Duane Mattson – 140, Steve Walden – 196. ***Steve Walden and Randy Freeby were elected to a three-year term. Heidi Anderson was elected to a one-year term.*** For the elder positions on the Northwest Nazarene University Board of Trustees: Bill Bowers – 253, Craig Laughlin – 98, Ben Norris – 96, Tim Westerberg – 179. ***Bill Bowers was elected to a three-year term. Tim Westerberg was elected to a one-year term.*** For the lay positions on the Northwest Nazarene University Board of Trustees: Mike Guest – 132, Steve Walden – 170. ***Steve Walden was elected to a three-year term.*** For the position of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries Chairperson: Tony Johnson – 160, Dick Sales – 148. ***Tony Johnson was elected to a two-year term.***

Dr. Toler brought to the attention of the assembly that at 2.15p, Dr. Alexander from NNU will be sharing his report and encouraged the delegation to be expecting that with anticipation. He also endorsed the development of our students happening with Nazarene Bible College and Nazarene Theological Seminary and encouraged that we send our students to these institutions. Nazarene Publishing House, which was unable to send a representative to our assembly, wanted to give a gift for the lead pastors of our churches. A commentary on Philippians will be sent to each of our senior pastors free of charge.

Rev. Shaw made announcements regarding the remaining activities for the day. He reminded the assembly to be back at 1.30 pm. Rev. Shaw prayed to begin our lunch break.

Thursday Afternoon, 1:30 PM

Rev. Richard Hudson led the assembly in singing the song *When the Roll is Called Up Yonder* and encouraged the delegation to reflect with remembrance upon the names listed in the Memorial Roll in the delegate handbook and then opened the afternoon session in prayer.

Dr. Wright invited Rev. Jerry and Sharon Kester to the stage to introduce them and immediately, with joy and laughter, turned the key to the district office over to him. Dr. Toler then invited Rev. Jerry Kester and his wife Sharon to respond to the given invitation.

Rev. Kester started off by expressing that he is humbled and honored and frightened. He expressed his gratefulness for the opportunity to serve and feels honored to serve in this way.

Sharon shared her testimony in her life of God's grace and faithfulness. She shared her great love and heritage of faith and ministry. She expressed her gratefulness and asked the assembly to continue to pray for them in this new assignment of ministry.

Rev. Kester shared his experience with growing up in a small church and his deep love for the ministries of the district. As he left the Treasure Valley headed off to undergraduate studies, he made the commitment and promise that his life belongs to Christ. Rev. Kester has accepted this call for one reason only, to be obedient to the

promise to allow God to lead his life. He is also here because of the many ways that he has a deep love for the Church of the Nazarene. He concluded by expressed his deep and secure love for Jesus Christ. Rev. Kester concluded by reminding the assembly of 2 Corinthians 5:18-19 that reminds us that we have been reconciled unto Christ and we have the calling to reconcile the world unto Christ, as well. Rev. Kester prayed for the assembly and for the future of the Washington Pacific District.

Dr. Toler formally announced Rev. Jerry Kester and his wife Sharon as the new district superintendent and wife of the Washington Pacific District.

The assembly was shown a video explaining the mission of and encouraging participation with the Nazarene Foundation.

Dr. Toler welcomed Dr. David Alexander to the stage to give his report regarding Northwest Nazarene University. In opening remarks, Dr. Alexander spoke of his sensing of a stirring in the body of Christ within this assembly gathering, to God be the glory. Dr. Alexander also expressed his gratefulness for Dr. Wright and Dr. Toler in this year of service to the Washington Pacific District as interim district superintendent and responsible General Superintendent. He extended an invitation to anyone in the assembly that is a Northwest Nazarene College/University alumnus to share their story on video. *"The mission of Northwest Nazarene University is the transformation of the whole person. Centered in Jesus Christ, the NNU education instills habits of heart, soul, mind and strength to enable each student to become God's creative and redemptive agent in the world."* Dr. Alexander took time to elaborate on this mission and how it is expressed in the lives of the many present and former students associated with NNU. Dr. Alexander declared NNU exists to serve Christ, the church and its youth and we can only accomplish that together. Dr. Alexander and the assembly read together in unison the NNU Covenant. The Minute-Men handed out to each of the lead pastors a DVD designed to introduce the people of our churches to NNU.

Dr. Wright invited Brian Thomas and Loren Hanna to share what God has been doing through 'Funding the Mission' at the Ridgefield church. Pastor Loren shared the transformation and joy that has been experienced as the Ridgefield church has made the decision to fulfill their giving privileges and responsibilities with the first fruits of the income of the church, not the leftovers.

Rev. Shaw invited Steve Walden to come and share the treasurer's report with the assembly. Mr. Walden thanked Jan Green for her work and efficiency. In referencing the Year End Summary report, Mr. Walden thanked the churches of the district for improving the percentages of responsibilities met, which increased in all categories. He reported that we had a slight positive cash flow on the year as a whole. Accounting for the SDMI and NYI accounts are included in the assembly journal. Reception of the financial reports were moved, seconded and passed unanimously.

Mr. Walden moved on to the 2011 District Assembly Finance Committee Worksheet and reviewed the figures projected in that report on the income and expense sides. He also brought to light the modifications in the narrative section of the Financial Policies included in the assembly journal. Paragraph #2 was modified to eliminate redundancy. Paragraph #15.e. eliminated some words to reflect the current situation. Paragraph #21 was reworded to include more positive wording. These changes were brought to the assembly as recommendations. It was moved, seconded and passed unanimously. Dr. Toler shared that the Global Ministry Center is experiencing many of the same fiscal concerns as the districts are experiencing. He expressed that, if there were ever a year, this is the year for churches to step up and meet 100% of their financial privileges and responsibilities.

Dr. Wright invited Brandon Marten to the stage to tell the story of the church we have at Battle Ground Church. Pastor Marten challenged the assembly to consider the question, "What does your church do with the gift of the visitor who comes to your church?" Dr. Wright invited Chad Leeson to the stage to share the story of The Bridge church in Stevenson which has been restarted in the past few years. Pastor Leeson encouraged the assembly to start with obedience and believe that God will bless an obedient ministry.

Dr. Wright invited Dr. Toler to share, in a few moments following the concluding remarks and announcements, some words regarding the seminar he had planned to share

earlier this year on *The Vibrant Church*. The assembly was encouraged to anticipate this presentation coming up very shortly.

Rev. Shaw took time to acknowledge the faithful ministry of Rev. Wes Smith as our Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Chairperson for the past number of years. The assembly thanked Rev. Smith with an ovation. Rev. Tony Johnson, our newly-elected SDMI Chairperson, stood and was also recognized. The assembly also thanked Debra Voelker for her excellent leadership during our NMI Convention for the days leading up to the assembly with an ovation.

A few other logistical announcements were given by Rev. Shaw for the proceedings this afternoon and this evening.

It was also announced that the love offering for Dr. and Liz Wright was supplemented to come up to \$2,500. They leave with this gift as an expression of love from a grateful district.

Dr. Wright entertained the idea that following Dr. Toler's presentation on the Vibrant Church, the business portion of the assembly shall be concluded and the assembly shall be excused until the ordination service tonight at 7.00p. The motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. Toler made a brief and condensed presentation about *The Vibrant Church* to the assembly. His presentation, in the form of PowerPoint, will be made available to Jan Green in case a member of the assembly wishes to review it or could not transcribe sufficient notes.

Thursday Evening Ordination Service, April 7, 2011

Rev. Tim Westerberg led the congregation in the singing of *A Church's One Foundation*, a fitting and significant start to this worship experience. Following this opening hymn, the congregation sang together *Holiness Unto the Lord*. As the congregation sang, ordination candidates Jeremy Seth Cook, Clifford "Chad" W. Leeson, Jr., Lisa J. Roberson, Nereida Rodriguez and Santos Rodriguez.

Dr. Stan Toler introduced the purpose of the ordination service.

Rev. Julio Ortiz read Ephesians 4.1-7, 11-16 to the congregation.

Rev. Bill Bower came to lead the congregation as they read in unison The Apostle's Creed. *"We believe in God the Father Almighty; Maker of Heaven and Earth; And in Jesus Christ His only Son our Lord; Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary; Suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead and buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose from the dead; He ascended into heaven; And sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. We believe in the Holy Spirit; The holy Church universal; The communion of saints; The forgiveness of sins; The resurrection of the body; And the life everlasting. Amen."*

Dr. Keith Wright introduced Leah Wheeler as a first-time recipient of a District Minister's License. The newly elected District Superintendent, Jerry Kester, read the minister's charge to Ms. Wheeler. The entire congregation affirmed the commissioning of this disciple in the form of an ovation.

Dr. Wright invited Rev. John Beadles to the stage to recognize his years of faithful service on the Washington Pacific District. Dr. Toler read a plaque on behalf of the Washington Pacific District and the Board of General Superintendents to honor Rev. Beadles and his years of investment into the church. The congregations thanked him with a standing ovation.

Dr. Wright introduced Don Moore to the congregation. Dr. Toler was invited to come and pray for Don Moore as his ordination credentials were fully restored. The congregation punctuated this commissioning with a loud amen as Rev. Don Moore rose to take his seat among the congregation.

Rev. Scott Shaw then took the time to introduce each of the ordination candidates. Excerpts of the biographies listed in the worship folder were read by Rev. Shaw for Seth Cook, Chad Leeson, Lisa Roberson, Nereida Rodriguez and Santos Rodriguez.

Dr. Toler invited the ordinands and spouses to stand. To them he described the nature of ordained ministry and the scope of working for Christ's Kingdom within the church. Dr.

Toler asked of the ordination candidates several questions regarding their perception of their calling and their understanding of the Article of Faith in the Church of the Nazarene. Dr. Toler certified that the candidates are now ready to receive their ordination credentials.

Led by Rev. Westerberg, the Elder Choir sang *And Can It Be?* in the spirit of joy and worship of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Rev. David Rodes read from the *Manual* the Call and Qualifications of the Minister, paragraphs 401.1 – 401.6.

Mr. Daniel Slocum sang for the congregation *I Will Not Forget Thee* as a reminder of the faithfulness and care of Christ.

Dr. Toler spoke to the entire congregation about 'holiness' and 'attitudes.' Sharing the Scripture from Romans 12.1-2, Dr. Toler encouraged the congregation to understand changing, transformational power that is evidenced in the Spirit of Christ. He challenged the congregation to Give God Control of Your Mind (by fixing, filtering, forming and feeding our minds in Christ), to Shine God's Light on What Is Right (by replacing anger with love, replacing fear with faith, replacing judgment with acceptance, and replacing sadness with happiness) and to Allow God to Change You (by reversing the way you get out of bed, saying 'I love you' often, becoming a giver instead of a taker, and focusing on the future). Dr. Toler asked everyone what our word is going to be when people ask us how we are doing.

Dr. Toler asked the ordinands and their spouses to stand and face the audience. He encouraged the congregation if they would commit to encourage them and support them. The audience resoundingly affirmed their prayers and on-going care and support for this class of ordinands.

Dr. Toler invited the ordinands to the stage to kneel at the altar. Ordaining each of them, Dr. Toler invited the ordained elders who were present in the service to come gather around the class of ordinands to lay hands on them and pray for them, commissioning them to a life of service to Christ. Following the prayer, Dr. Toler presented each with their ordination credentials and congratulating them on completing the ordination requirements. Dr. David Alexander then presented to each of the ordinands a sculpture of 'The Calling' on behalf of Northwest Nazarene University.

A closing hymn, *A Charge to Keep I Have*, was sung by the congregation as led by Rev. Westerberg as the ordinands were dismissed to prepare to be greeted in the Family Center. Thus, the 68th District Assembly of the Washington Pacific District was officially concluded. The congregation was then dismissed and invited to make their way to the Family Center to greet the ordinands.

A. DISTRICT OFFICERS 1. District Superintendent

I greet you in the strong name of Jesus! I want you to know that God loves you and there is nothing you can do about it. Turn to someone and tell them, "God loves you. And there is nothing you can do about it." God just keeps on loving us.

A very special welcome and thanks goes to Dr. Stan Toler for providing leadership during this assembly and during this past year. Would you welcome Dr. Stan and Linda Toler. It is also very good to have our Nazarene University President, Dr. David Alexander with us, and he will be speaking to us this afternoon. Good days are ahead for NNU.

My goal for this assembly:

1. I want you to feel inspired to believe that God has a great future for the WaPac District
2. I want you to be encouraged to know that God is at work in a powerful way.
3. I want you to be challenged to **pray, plan, and expect** a supernatural invasion of God in your personal lives and the life of your church.

I have a story to tell that is a good story. It is a story of sacrifice and service, love and obedience, vision and risk. It is a story of God at work. God working with us, working for us, and God working in us, and sometimes, working in spite of us, to bring His good will to pass. The story I tell is His story, and it is our story.

Our story cannot be told unless I give words of appreciation to so many people. First of all I want to say, I am so grateful for my wife, Liz, who has walked by my side with encouragement throughout this year as we have served the WaPac District.

I am appreciative for the advisory board and the departmental heads who have worked diligently to accomplish the mission before us.

A very special thanks goes to Taulima Oge, our director of Samoan ministries, and to Julio Ortiz, our district Hispanic ministries Coordinator. Both of these men recruit, and train pastors, as well as assist in starting and strengthening new works. Thanks men, for a job well done!

District Treasurer Steve Walden, and District Secretary Scott Shaw have both done an excellent job in their responsibilities. Thanks men for your labor of love.

Our story also includes statistics. Some people think that statistics are not very important, but they do tell part of our story. In fact, the Bible uses statistics to tell the redemptive story of God.

For me, my story begins with a phone call from Dr. Stan Toler on a Sunday morning, informing me that he had appointed me as the interim district superintendent for the WaPac district. Liz and I met with the District Advisory Board and they suggested we stay maybe three or six months. Well, it's been almost a year now.

We soon discovered that the lease on the district office in Edmonds was expiring. I called my friend Bob Helstrom and asked if he had space to rent, in Olympia. He said that he had space and that he would rent it to us for \$1,000 a month, but he and Yvonne would make a \$1,000 a month donation to the district. I quickly did the math, and realized that this meant the space would be free. Thanks, Bob and Yvonne Helstrom for your love for God, and His Kingdom.

The District Advisory Board asked Jan Green, our District Office Administrator, to facilitate the move from Edmonds to Olympia. They also asked her to recruit and organize

people to remodel and paint the new space. She took the challenge and did a great job pulling it all together. Thanks, Jan, for an excellent job, well done!

I came to this interim job with a strong belief that the district is to serve the local church, because the local church is the place of mission. As Bill Hybel says so well, "The local church is the hope of the world." I believe this 100%!

The district that is healthy and thriving is known for empowering pastors and lay leaders to become agents of transformation within the local church. The huge task of the district is equipping pastors to have the courage to lead, the wisdom to know what principles need to be adopted, and the insight to implement effective strategies.

During this year, I have spoken in a church, somewhere on the district, almost every Sunday. What a privilege to speak to our wonderful people and to inspire, encourage, and challenge them. In almost every church we have seen new people become followers of Jesus. I have met with pastors and church boards in leadership reviews with the goal to assist, teach, resource and help churches to be healthy and vibrant in their ministry. These have been wonderful times of sharing and learning. Through email, phone conversations, and one-on-one personal meetings, I have tried my best to inspire, encourage, and challenge pastors as they lead their churches. I need you to know we have some of the very best pastors, in all the world, right here on the Washington Pacific District. Our pastors want to lead vibrant and healthy churches. It is the task of the District to equip and resource them so they can reach their God given objectives.

During this year, we have worked hard to resource pastors with materials and books such as Maximize to help churches grow in their stewardship. Listen to Pastor Bethany Hull Somers, from the Mt. Vernon Church, share her story. (I have a book on the front row for every pastor entitled, "The Generosity Ladder: Your Next Step to Financial Peace). Pastors, after we break, please be sure to come down and get your free book.

Our story continues around the word "mission." The mission of the church is the same as the mission of Jesus Christ, which was, and is, to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:10).

I believe that a healthy and vibrant church is made up of people who believe passionately that lost and broken people matter to God; therefore, lost and broken people must matter to us. This is what the church must live out seven days a week. We are not here just to have church and go through a routine. No! We are on a mission to see our neighborhood, our city; our state, our nation, and our world experience the transitioning Grace and hope in Jesus Christ.

The church must always be in the business of multiplication, multiplication of classes, small groups and churches. Do you realize that every one of the 88 churches on the WaPac District was started by someone, or a group of people that said, "We need a church of the Nazarene here?" They rolled up their sleeves and went to work launching a brand new church.

We have a few examples: Centralia was started in 1920 by a lay couple by the name of Mr & Mrs Walter Babb who said, "We need a Nazarene church in Centralia!" They met in their home, and invited their neighbors, and before long the church was growing and thriving. And they called a pastor, and organized in 1923. A church was started just because someone said, "We need a church!"

A lady by the name of Nannie Jackson from Centralia moved to Olympia, and said, "We need a church!" She asked the General Church of the Nazarene to send a preacher. Reverend H.O. Jacobson came, and they pitched a tent and had a revival meeting. People started meeting for a Bible study, in Nannie Jackson's home, and before long, the church was growing, and organized in 1925. A new church was born because someone said, "We need a church!"

But what about Vancouver Hillcrest? In 1920, seventeen people met and decided to have a tent revival. They prayed and fasted, and believed, and before long, the tent was full of people and they launched a new church. Because some people saw the need for people to be saved, they said, "We need a church!"

I love this quote taken from the archives of the Puyallup church, "Pastor Elsie and her husband, Henry, and their children, started the church on East Main, where the quilt barn is

located today. The first service was based in their home, held in their living room." That was in 1936. It all happened because someone said "We need a church!"

Marysville church was started when some lay people said, "We need a church that preaches holiness." They met in a rented a facility, called a preacher, and the church was launched in 1911. It was started because some people saw a need, and said let's start a church.

Today, we have 87 churches on the WaPac District. It was the mission to start new churches, and it is our mission today. We must start strong, healthy churches.

Jesus said, "...Open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." (John 4:35b NIV)

Jesus also said, "...Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (Luke 10:2b NIV)

We must keep starting new works. It will not be like it was in the early 1900's but we must keep reaching lost and broken people for Christ.

The question is often asked, "What do new start and restart pastors and lay people do today?" New start pastors like Julio Ortiz, Taulima Oge, Chad Leeson, and Brandon Marten.

1. Cast vision with passion and zeal for lost and broken people
2. Raise money and pray like crazy
3. Communicate with excellence with preaching and teaching
4. Raise money and pray like crazy
5. Recruit leaders
6. Raise money and pray like crazy
7. Train leaders
8. Raise money and pray like crazy
9. Build a quality pastoral staff
10. Raise money and pray like crazy

Lives are being changed and transformed every week because people believe God could use them to start a new ministry.

The WaPac story is about what it means to be a team. Listen to what Mother Teresa of Calcutta said, "If we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other." We are a team. We help one another. We give beyond ourselves to others. We pray for each other. We believe with each other. We refuse to criticize each other.

A few examples: Because of a terrific rainstorm, the Highland Park church parsonage was flooded. It would cost at least \$15,000 to fix the damaged walls and replace the carpet. Where do you get that kind of money? Sequim church had \$10,000 to fix their parsonage so they could call a permanent pastor. Interim pastor, Ken Pults, challenged this little church to give \$7,000 to help Highland Park and they began to pray for a miracle. Money and appliances have been given. Bonney Lake heard that they needed help so they sent a work team of 15 people to paint and repair. It's all about team.

Kalama church needed to do work on their building. Would you believe Nazarene volunteers showed up and stayed two weeks to finish the project? It's all about team.

Don't ever forget it. Whether you like it or not, we belong to each other! That is a BIG truth. This helps us with our need for BIG faith.

And here is some really good news, Jesus Film Ministry, for the last three months:

- Worldwide: 4,928 presentations were made of the Jesus Film.
- 867,623 attended these showings.
- 160,560 people made decisions for Jesus Christ.
- 100,893 people registered to begin the follow-up process.
- 986 preaching points were established as a result of these showings.
- 24,337 people are now attending these 986 preaching points.

I am really excited about what God is doing through the use of the Jesses Film. Heaven is being populated and hell is being depopulated.

There is no place in the church of Jesus Christ for an independent spirit. We are a team.

There is more to the WaPac story. Our story includes facing the reality that we desperately need God to work His supernatural power and presence in our churches. I received a letter from Dr. Bob Broadbooks, who is our director of USA/Canada Mission Evangelism. And Broadbooks quoted David Olsen's book entitled, "*The American Church in Crisis*." He said, "Church attendance from the American church, this millennium, peaked during the five Sundays following the 9/11 attacks. The national trauma sent worshippers to church services in record numbers, but the memory of the event and the attraction was short-lived. On the sixth Sunday, attendance returned to normal. Since then, the American church attendance has declined in an unprecedented fashion. Broadbooks asked the question, "What does this say to us as spiritual leaders?" He went on to answer, by saying, "Once the trauma wore off, many people no longer felt the need to come to church. Perhaps it took them six weeks to finally realize that church was giving them few answers, little help, and God couldn't be found there, either." Oh I pray this is not the case.

The questions I am asking... Could it be with all of the economic crisis we are experiencing, and the bad news that haunts us daily, that maybe, people will be looking to God, again? The question is, what will they find if they come to your church? I need you to know that my prayer is that the presence and power of God will unmistakably be present when they enter our churches. That they will find answers, and help, and hope. And yes, they will find God. I am convinced that we desperately need to humble ourselves before God, and realize that without God breathing His power into each of our 95 churches on the WaPac district, we are without hope. We need to see God break every yoke of weakness and bitterness, and evil that exists in our churches. We need Him to change the mundane into the miraculous.

When Liz and I moved here for these months, we began to pray and ask the Lord, "What should we do that will help make a difference for this short period time?" I sensed God saying, "Challenge the pastors to lead the churches in a 21-day fast." Because you see folks, if we become serious about this, maybe, just maybe, God will release His marvelous power and presence in our Churches. Sixty-three pastors stated they would lead their churches in a 21-day fast. So for 21 days, in January, people were fasting and praying and believing for the marvelous direction of God in their personal lives, and in the life of their church. This fast was not designed to be a legalistic kind of a thing, but simply, fast and pray in a way that would be right for every local church. The issue was to simply pray and cry out to God for a supernatural invasion of God's presence in our churches. We decided to pray and ask God to intensify our hunger for Him, so that the deepest passion of our being is for God and His divine presence.

Pastors began to challenge their people to pray, fast, and believe God for miracles. People who were addicted to cigarettes, for years, were delivered and set free. God answered prayer in amazing ways. Listen now to Bill Bowers, as he shares, on video, what has happened as he lead his church in a time of fasting.

David Rodes reported that his 8-year old grandson, after hearing his grandfather speak about fasting, decided he would fast from eating any candy. After a short time, he came to his parents and said, "I need to ask Jesus to come into my life." And his parents had the wonderful privilege of leading their son to the Lord. Pastor David Rodes will tell you the rest of the story. Please move in close, and listen carefully.

We must pray and plan and expect a supernatural invasion of God in our personal lives, and in our churches. We must call out to God until He opens the Heavens and shows Himself in supernatural ways. We need to clear away the clutter of our own agendas and make room for God and His supernatural power. Bill Bright, founder of Campus Crusade for Christ, suggested how to cultivate the supernatural perspective. He said, "We need to **think supernaturally, plan supernaturally, pray supernaturally, love supernaturally, and believe God for supernatural results.**"

Dr. Leonard Sweet, a Christian futurist says, "The Church has tried everything except one thing that is needed. It has tried to be an inclusive church. It has tried to be a compassionate church. It has tried to be a program church. It has tried to be a purpose-

driven church. It has tried to be a seeker-sensitive church. What if it tried to be a spiritual church?"

My friend, Dr. Neil Wiseman, said "God's Holy Spirit invades ordinary events and common circumstances wherever He is welcome." The supernatural provides the difference between what the church so often is, and what it could be.

- **The supernatural provides a connectedness between us, and God Almighty!**
- **The supernatural makes ministry effective.**
- **The supernatural helps us recognize God and His supernatural power.**

I am convinced we need to cherish and nourish the holy involvement of God. That means, pray, plan, and expect a supernatural invasion of God in our lives and in the church. There are at least seven things that churches are doing that are really serious about being a church, where spiritual renewal is taking place.

1. They pray, by name for people who need salvation.
2. They pray and expect an overwhelming sense of God's presence.
3. They pray for physical healing and healing of relationships.
4. They pray for unity in the body of Christ, and will not allow disunity to take place.
5. They plan prayer events where people come together and pray intensely for the needs of the people.
6. They have small groups of people who meet on a regular basis to pray for God to direct every aspect of the church.
7. They walk the sanctuary and building praying for God's supernatural power to be sensed as people walk into the building.

I want to challenge you to go home with an open and receptive spirit, and to begin to pray, by name, for lost and broken people. Innovate and plan strategically as if your life depends on it, because the eternities of many do. Let's begin to think, and act like God's ambassadors, that's what we are, God's ambassadors to people in our world.

Come in close now, and listen to my heart. The Church of the Nazarene came into existence to proclaim holiness of heart and life. This is a message of hope for all people. We believed in our beginning days, and we believe today:

- **There is no one who is beyond the reach of God's grace.**
- **There is no one who cannot be saved.**
- **There is no one whose life is so lost that they cannot be redeemed.**

We believe that God is able to utterly transform the worse sinner, in the most horrible hellhole in the world. We are totally optimistic about the grace of God, for everyone. That's our message of hope.

Ladies and gentlemen on the WaPac District, we are followers of Jesus the Nazarene. And we have this great privilege of saying to the whole world that in God's church, there is no distinction between the rich and the poor, black, white, and brown, powerful and powerless, old and young, housed and homeless, educated and illiterate... there is not distinction!

There is hope for every person who walks on the face of the earth. This is our message.

My prayer is that we will go from this assembly:

1. Inspired to believe that God has a great future for the WaPac District.
2. Encouraged to know that God is at work in a powerful way.
3. Challenged to pray, plan, and expect a supernatural presence of God in our personal lives and in the life of your church.

3. District Samoan Ministries Director

It is my distinct privilege and joy to present you with my fourth report as Director of Samoan Ministries for the great Washington Pacific District. Writing this report reminds me of how good and pleasant it is when the people of God come together in the spirit of love and unity to celebrate our Lord Jesus. My words cannot fully express and define the greatness of the love of God that obviously reached and penetrated every area of our Samoan ministries this year. We watched, with awe, and marveled at how God answered our prayers in His ways and in His own timing.

Samoan Ministerial Training

Last year, God finally granted the longtime desire of my heart for a training program to prepare our young people for ministry in the church. Fifteen students registered and have completed the first two courses. The future of expanding the ministry to our Samoan community becomes much brighter than ever before. Our existing churches are also benefiting greatly from this training in areas of leadership skills, worship, Sunday school, and more.

Seattle Samoan Ministry Reopened

Last year, we discontinued services and activities in Seattle due to leadership problems. God answered our prayer for Seattle when a young couple from our Auburn

ministry felt called into full-time ministry. They are attending the training program to prepare for the ministry. When presented with the need for ministry in Seattle, they prayed about it and felt convinced that this is the direction for their lives. Opening services are scheduled for March 27th, of this year. Please pray for Atesa and Iakopo Timali as a move in obedience to God's call on their lives for Seattle.

Community Outreach

In 2009, our Samoan Mission Strategy Committee (including all pastors) led the way in organizing a program to bring the Samoan community together for a time of worship and celebration during the Christmas season. Last year, more than 300 people attended, including two non-Nazarene congregations. This year, we are expecting twice as many people to attend because more churches want to join. The event is centered in the preaching of the Word and special youth choir presentations that light up the Christmas spirit. Pastor Terry Mattson, whose Samoan group joined last year, preached a powerful message on the love of God that is available to all people, all colors, all nations, and all languages, through Jesus Christ. What an opportunity for the community to hear this message translated and presented in a unique and anointed way. It's an opportunity for the community to learn who we really are. Praise the Lord.

God's Grace Makes Happy Connections

I returned from Samoa in 2007, with a mission to look for my niece's children that she had left in Tacoma when she returned to Samoa to attend her oldest son's funeral. The three children were six, eight, and nine years old when their mother left 20 years ago. Marital problems and immigration restrictions closed the doors for the mother to return to America. The only picture we had of the oldest son was lost during our return from Samoa to the United States. The only identification available to help this search was the mother's and the husband's names. I asked about the children anytime I met someone who might be able help to locate the them.

However, the long search finally came to an end three months ago, when I was meeting with the young couple, in my office, to finalize arrangements for them to start a new Samoan church in Seattle. At the end of our meeting, I asked them the same question I asked every person in the Tacoma area. Neither of them knew anything nor did they remember anything about this couple and their children. Eventually, I was ready to close our meeting with a word of prayer when the woman turned to her husband and said in a low voice, "It sounds like the story of your mom." Then they both turned to me and asked, "What is her name?" I told them her first and last name. They got very quiet and then they both stared directly at me. My eyes started turning red in unbelievable amazement at what would come out of their mouths next. With tears in the young man's eyes, he said that my niece was his mother, he was the oldest son. He said that he was nine-years old when she left and he had been longing to see her and know of her whereabouts. He asked, "You have been looking for me?" I said, "Yes!" and with tears of joy, I thanked God for His amazing grace that brought about this happy connection. Iakopo and his wife have been in the class and have accepted the call to the Seattle church without my knowing that this was the same person I had been looking for. One night, in the class session, I changed his name to Iakopo. Mission accomplished. God did it. Iakopo now has a story to tell.

4. District NMI President

Dr. Keith Wright, district and retired missionaries, district NMI leadership team, pastors, delegates and co-laborers of this 68th NMI Convention of the Washington Pacific District. It is with a deep sense of appreciation and gratitude that I share the report of your partnership with God this past year.

God has expanded the boundaries of His kingdom to every continent --- even every nation -- on the face of the earth. What began with 120 Jewish disciples in the upstairs room of a building in Jerusalem has grown into a worldwide presence of over two billion people of all ethnicities. You and I are part of this enormous movement of God. Our contribution to the history of Christ's church is being realized daily with each choice we make, every sacrifice we give and every action we take. God has given us the opportunity to be His partner in the life-transforming work of the Holy Spirit. There is no higher privilege and no more important responsibility.

Missions is at the very heart of everything which God is concerned about. It is, in essence, His very heartbeat. The center of this concern is humanity. God loved His creation so much that He put us in the center of His Story. It is His desire to empower us to be an expression of His heart to those around us.

If we develop a heart like God's, it must lead to action. When we understand that God's character is one of action and faithfulness as exemplified in Jesus, we are also moved to action. Our God is one who speaks and acts. They are one and the same. The Hebrew word for "word" is *dabar*, which literally means both action and word. We have no adequate English word for this. Therefore one cannot speak the word of God without taking action. There must be a consistency between what we say and what we do. They must be as one ... God is always gracious and loving and faithful to act. There is no division in these in God's character and there must be none in ours.

We had been working in and around Port-au-Prince for a week, rebuilding churches that were damaged in the January 2010 earthquake. Piling in the back of the flatbed truck we used for our daily transportation, we toured around the city one last time before we left... the streets -- narrow, twisty, dirty, dusty, filled with pot holes, garbage, chickens, dogs, children, people walking everywhere. Cars and trucks filled to capacity and beyond with more people, children and chickens. The air full of dust, car exhaust, sounds of markets and life.

This is Haiti, the same Haiti as on my first trip back in 1991. But with each turn in the road my heart grew heavier and heavier. Piles of rubble some of it 2 stories tall, lined both sides of the streets. Multi-story buildings flattened like pancakes. People are still buried beneath the rubble. There are absolutely no words to describe how overwhelming Port-au-prince looked 8 months after the earthquake. All you could do was weep. Weep for those that were lost, and weep for those that were left.

In this city of 9 million people, we did not see a single piece of heavy equipment. People were using pick axes and hand carts to carry off the debris. A full year after the earthquake only 5 percent of the debris has been cleared, and over 1 million people remain displaced, scraping by in shacks made of sticks and tarps, many without access to proper hygiene, food, and drinking water.

There are a thousand and one explanations for the slow pace of reconstruction in Haiti. The absence of pre-existing infrastructure is preventing the timely removal of rubble. Distribution of money is being stalled through the disorganization and incompetence of the Haitian government, something that has plagued Haiti for the last two decades. And urgent concerns, such as a lack of food and water and the ongoing cholera and polio epidemics are drawing the attention away from Haiti's longer-term needs. Haiti is a country facing the fierce urgency of the now.

There were millions of dollars pledged & given from around the world. Container loads of equipment, food and water were shipped, but it is primarily God's church, being His hands and feet, that is making the difference in Haiti. The church of the Nazarene has been building churches, hospitals and school, feeding and educating children, administering medicine and food and clean water, and raising up pastors for over 60 years in Haiti. The needs there are so overwhelming, the levels of needs so deep but the church is helping

people - one person at a time, one community at a time – to encounter the living, majestic, healing God and through that help, bring healing and wholeness to the brokenness of their lives...

- Just this past year alone Nazarenes gave over \$4million and provided nearly 1 million pounds of food, water and relief supplies to Haiti following the devastating earthquake... W&W teams are going in, one after the other, to put hands and feet to God's love. And people are responding. There are spontaneous revivals occurring in Haiti today

Isn't that what it has always been – the church – the love of God shown by the dirt on its hands? Hands that wash the feet of its people; Hands that cook food for its neighbors and clean the streets of its neighborhoods. Hands that have painted buildings and planted gardens. Hands that have held the hands of orphans and widows and the least of these. Hands that are dirty from the work of the heart.

The images we are seeing now from Japan are similarly as overwhelming. The wall of water from the tsunami, the rising body counts, the nuclear fears, and the staggering number of missing people – is nearly impossible to believe. Who could have imagined the power of the tsunami, scooping up houses and buildings, and cars as if they were children's toys? My heart sank and I grieved, because there were people in those cars. Mothers and fathers, brothers and sisters, teachers and pastors. If we believe there are no unwanted souls in God's world, we must grieve at even one life cut short.

I think of Jesus' reaction when seeing the death of Lazarus; he simply wept. Sometimes weeping is our only response to such overwhelming tragedy. And yet it may be our most powerful for it is our weeping that leads to our praying. And it is our praying which helps us enter into someone else's tragedy. It is the first step in getting our hands dirty.

Reconstruction is often talked about as rebuilding communities and towns but reconstruction is not just about buildings; it's also about people. People in Haiti and in Japan and in places all around the world have been so shocked and wounded in their bodies and their souls, so scorched by their troubled life situations. This world is a broken mess, but we serve a God who is currently at work in it and in us to bring about his redemption plan. The funny thing about God's work is it usually requires getting dirty.

I will be honest; these have been difficult days for our denomination.

- The total number of active missionaries (including volunteers) was nearly 800 three years ago. It is currently approaching 700.
- For the first time since WW2 we commissioned no new missionaries this year. We are thankful for the passion and dedication of the seven sets of retiring missionaries, including our own.
- The Church income in the USA/Canada is down by \$50 million since 2008
- Our WEF giving in 2008 was nearly \$49 million. We are planning on a total WEF giving in 2012 to be \$37Million
- The goal for the WEF Plus Offering taken at Thanksgiving was 6 million, we netted approximately 1.3 million.

In his presentation to the General Board, Dr. J.K. Warrick, the chairman of the board of General Superintendents outlined the direction for the Church of the Nazarene in light of these times.

- The church's mission will continue expanding exponentially and will continue to reach new generations/cultures for Jesus.
- The church will do this at a lower cost using more individual initiative and less institutional structure.
- There will be more facilitating and resourcing and less programming and conferencing.
- There will be more focus on the mission enterprise.
- Salaries and personnel have been deeply cut from both the General Superintendents and the Global Ministry Center.

But have you ever noticed how God's movement isn't hampered by human economies?

There is good news from 2010:

- Our church grew to over 2 million members worldwide (2,059,261)
- Africa region crossed over the half million member barrier
- Kudjip Hospital in PNG expanded and served 60,000 people for outpatient care along with 6,000 admitted patients. Hundreds of those made decisions to follow Christ
- Our Eurasia region experienced double digit growth for the 6th consecutive year. Nearly 500 new churches were organized for a total of 6,000 congregations.
- In 10 years Bangladesh has gone from 1 church to over 1,224 churches. Last year 193 ministers were ordained in one service – the largest ordination class in our history.
- The Jesus Film project surpasses 10 million decisions for Christ after 13 years of showings around the world.

Each and every week in 2010 the Church of the Nazarene

- Planted 43 churches
- Organized 26 churches
- Took in 2,547 new members
- Produced 5.5 pastoral training books in 59 languages
- Aired 140 radio broadcasts in 72 countries and 36 languages through the world mission broadcast
- Helped 12,745 people made decisions to accept Jesus as their savior
- And fed 11,874 children Nazarene Compassionate Ministries

Here on the Washington Pacific District you gave:

- WEF: \$791,736
- World Mission Broadcast: \$7,743
- NCM: \$139,253
- Jesus Film Project: \$72, 543
- Other 10% projects: \$61,479

We understand that when we minister to the needs of the poor, and the oppressed we are ministering to Christ and being Christ to the world. It is in our foundation, our DNA. It is who we are. For such a time as this God is using our district, our denomination, to bring His plan of redemption to the world. Are we willing to get our hands dirty?

In just a few weeks we will have an opportunity to put our words into action through the Easter Offering. These are defining moments in the life of our church. What we have learned through history is that we can't do it alone – we need to come together with all of our passion and resources to partner with God to reach the world for Him. Let me encourage you to use this Sunday to inspire your congregation to help the Church of the Nazarene carry out God's vision and plan for the world.

The mission of Christ church is for the poor and the oppressed, for the unemployed and the destitute, for prisoners and captives, and for all who remember and care for them. Let us pray to God that our attention spans stretch beyond mere moments of compassion. And that our thoughts may linger so we can better pray and offer up our dirty hands of help where they are needed.

1. District Advisory Board

The Washington Pacific District Advisory Board, consisting of laypersons—Heidi Anderson, Debbie Edgbert, Ed Johnson, David McClung and Steve Walden, and elders—Keith M. Wright (chair), John Beadles, Bill Bowers, Kirby Hughes, David Rodes, and J. Scott Shaw (secretary), has met in 10 regular meetings and two conference-call meetings since the 2010 district assembly.

Interim ministerial transfers have been processed and referred to the Board of Ministerial Development in accordance with *Manual* paragraphs 223, 228.8-228.10, 432.

Acting upon request of a local church, we have approved the name change of the following churches per *Manual* 101.1: Kirkland to Kirkland Life Community; Lynden to Lynden CrossPoint; and Lynnwood to Lynnwood Silver Creek.

We recommend the disorganization of the following churches: Anacortes; Spanaway First Wisdom Korean; Stanwood/Camano Living Hope; Tacoma First Hispanic; and Valley View.

In the midst of the challenges faced by our region, we are excited to report that this has been a dynamic year for Northwest Nazarene University. As we move closer to celebrating our centennial in 2013, the University is positioning herself to continue to be an influential voice in the educating and shaping of leaders.

Of central concern to our president, **Dr. David Alexander**, has been the establishment of our University 'mission' which declares, "The mission of Northwest Nazarene University is the transformation of the whole person. Centered in Jesus Christ, the NNU education instills habits of heart, soul, mind and strength to enable each student to become God's creative and redemptive agent in the world." Northwest Nazarene University seeks to be 'a transformative learning community expressing the love of Jesus by forming scholars, nurturing disciples, serving the church, shaping the culture and redeeming the world.' At the March meeting, the Board of Trustees unanimously affirmed Dr. Alexander's leadership, re-electing him to serve as our president for the next four years.

Outstanding Enrollment: In the midst of a changing financial landscape, NNU has experienced strong enrollment with 1,913 traditional, adult and graduate students and 4,325 students in some form of continuing education. Under the leadership of the new Vice President for Academic Affairs, **Dr. Burton Webb**, new majors are being developed to stay current with the marketplace. Moving Forward: At the March meeting of the Board of Trustees, a decision was made to move forward with the development of a new Student-Learning Commons which would more than double the space provided by the Riley Library. Stanwood/Camano Living Hope—Because of the disorganization of the Stanwood/Camano Living Hope church, the District Advisory Board received the funds remaining in the church bank account in the amount of \$23,178.52, and will be receiving the proceeds from a CD that matures in May 2011, in the approximate amount of \$4,600.

White Salmon Pinecrest—Entered into an arrangement with the White Salmon Pinecrest church, that if they would pay their *Funding the Mission* shares in full, plus an additional 1% of their income for their district shares for the next five years, then the remaining balance on their church property note (which is held by the Washington Pacific District) will be forgiven.

2. In the light of the remarkable success and blessing presently being enjoyed by many of our churches involved in the ministry of Faith Promise, as well as the increased funds available to the cause of world evangelism, we heartily recommend that each church give prayerful consideration to the establishment of Faith Promise giving.

3. We recommend that the churches struggling with Shares for Others confer with the district superintendent. With concern for local church health and commitment to operating district ministries as efficiently and as economically as possible, the District Assembly Finance Committee recommends that the District Advisory Board review annual church finance reports, and to visit with any church regarding the equanimity of its report.

4. That members of the local church receive, at the discretion of the district superintendent, regular communication regarding the total district program of Shares for Others.

Insurance and Properties

5. That the pastor give special attention to filing **(a)** the nonprofit corporation registration with the Secretary of State by the last day of your anniversary month (the month in which your church was incorporated), and **(b)** the tax exemption forms for the church and parsonage properties with the State Department of Revenue by March 31. (Notices are sent to each church by the State of Washington.) That the deadline due dates be printed in pastors' letters. That each new pastor be notified by letter from the district superintendent regarding these requirements. Also, that the district office keep on file **(a)** the federal ID tax number, **(b)** state property tax exemption number, and **(c)** the Labor and Industries account ID number for each church.

In salary reviews, local professional positions of like responsibility should be considered, taking into account education, tenure and preparation. Further, those other benefits, such as Social Security and adequate health insurance, be provided for both pastor and other staff members and that the local church reimburses their pastor for professional expenses (auto expenses and depreciation, entertainment, conferences, continuing education, etc.). That each church supports its pastor and pastoral staff in the establishment of tax-sheltered annuities. (Complete information is available from the Board of Pensions & Benefits in Kansas City and at www.nazarene.org)

13. That the district continue to carry dental, disability, and life insurance plans for every full-time paid employee in every church that wishes to join and pay the premium.

14. That the local church board provide for reimbursement of expenses incurred by ministerial staff in attending necessary conventions, district functions, education workshops, etc. That each church be encouraged to provide continuing education for the pastor, including a library allowance where possible. That an amount be set aside regularly, in a separate fund, to send the pastor and spouse to the General Assembly.

15. That each church, and the district, encourage pastoral renewal for its pastoral family through:

a. regular use of at least one day each week for rest and relaxation;

b. vacation time, given with full pay and with the church paying for pulpit supply, built around the pattern of:

(1) two weeks for pastors who have served the denomination up to five years;

(2) three weeks for pastors serving in the denomination from 6 to 15 years;

(3) four weeks for pastors serving in the denomination more than 15 years;

(4) Vacation is to be taken in the year earned unless prior approval is given by the church board.

c. provisions for study and education of at least one week per year, apart from normal church functions (district assembly, etc.), paid by the local church and subject to prior church board approval with a subsequent report to the church board;

d. camps, assemblies, conventions, etc. are considered as part of the pastor's responsibilities and not a portion of his vacation.

e. In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor following each seven consecutive year of service in one congregation. It is strongly urged that the pastor's salary continue in full and that the church board provide for pulpit supply during the sabbatical period. (Manual 129.10) A sabbatical policy manual is available on the district website (www.wapacnaz.org).

16. That evangelists be compensated to provide an income adequate to cover the meeting being conducted, as well as consideration for interim periods of time lost due to travel and lags between meetings. In addition, all expenses incurred in holding a meeting (i.e. travel away from home costs) be provided.

17. We believe that adequately supporting ministerial personnel will help build the Kingdom and relieve personal pressures, thereby resulting in more effective leadership and direction. Therefore, it is recommended that a copy of this subsection be provided each church board secretary and read to each local church board early in the assembly year.

Planned Giving

18. That we encourage each church to invite a representative of the Department of Planned Giving to present programs available and to assist our people in their family wills

19. That we adopt the giving plan adopted by the Board of General Superintendents and the General Board that asks each local church to give at least the following percentage of their income:

World Evangelism Fund	5.5%
Pensions & Benefits	2%
Education Share (NNU)	2.5%

20. That each church support the District Budget presented in paragraph No. 1 of this report.

21. It is encouraged and expected that our churches participate in Funding the Mission of the Church of the Nazarene and that those who serve on district committees and boards will realize the responsibility of their influence.

Debra opened the meeting by introducing the new name for the NMI Convention, M.O.V.E.= Missions Our Vision Empowered; moving through the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ. We will be hearing about transformed lives throughout the meeting.

Pastor Bill Bowers welcomed everyone and prayed for the Convention.

Award of Excellence recipients were: Battle Ground Starting Ground, Bethel, Big Lake, Bremerton, Camas, Centralia, Enumclaw, Everett First, Everett First Hispanic, Everett South, Forks, Gig Harbor, Kalama, Kelso Abundant Life, Kent Ardent, Lakewood New Hope, Lakewood Hispanic, Liberty Bible, Longview, Maple Valley, Marysville, Monroe, Oak Harbor, Port Angeles, Port Orchard, Poulsbo, Redwood Family, Renton, Ridgefield, Sequim Valley, South Sound, Stanwood/Camano Living Hope, Tacoma First Samoan, Van Zandt, Vancouver Fourth Plain, Washougal, White Salmon Pinecrest, Woodland, Yelm

Debra stressed the use of the DVD, which contains much valuable information. The Haiti Work and Witness Trip is to be August 26-September 2. Enclosed is a pledge card to raise funds for the building materials. The application to attend the 5th Annual NW Regional W&W Conference fall 2011 in Portland. She advised that as each local president picks up their packet, they are to take a thank you gift; a thank you for all you do to promote missions.

Dennis Spinnie introduced the order forms for the NMI materials and books.

Debra introduced the Skype interviews that will take place throughout the assembly as one way for us to see ourselves as one large family and hear about the transformed lives on the various mission fields. The first will be with our missionaries from Ukraine, being inter-viewed by David Edwards. They shared the transformation lives of two persons. One encountered a Work and Witness team in a rehab center, who prayed for him, and his surprise of a worldwide Church who prayed for him was overwhelming. He accepted Christ and accepted call to the ministry, now is taking a leadership course, Bible Study, and is in music ministry. The other was a heroin addict for 12 yrs, through the love of a Christian, found Christ and married a pastor's daughter. They are the first missionaries to the capitol

of Moldova, where more transformations are occurring. David ended the interview with prayer for the missionaries' ministry, and the Ukrainian region.

Debra Voelker gave her NMI President Report.

A Yes/No Ballot to elect Debra Voelker for a two year term was introduced. 269 ballots were cast with 267 yes and 2 no. Debra Voelker is reelected as District NMI President.

Tom Lafrenz interviewed Howie Shute, Horn of Africa via Skype. Howie shared about a demon possessed Muslim woman who was prayed over by an Evangelical pastor, and she was totally healed in Jesus Christ. A drug addict was freed from drugs when he gave his life to Christ. His time for execution came, he was shot but miraculously stood up! The executioner told him he was free to go. Tom prayed for the Shute's work in the Horn of Africa, and for the changed lives.

Marian Smith presented the Treasurer's report and the Ways and Means report. A motion was made to accept both of the reports, second, discussion called for, carried.

Debra introduced the ballot for the Council Members. The recommendation of the nomination committee placed nine names on the ballot for a one year term, and to vote for up to nine names. 269 votes were cast. Elected were Benjamin Rodes, David Edwards, Jean Calman, Linda Harmaning, Louisa Wong, Rene Hayes, Steven Bruce, Susan Lewis, and Verle Ketchum. Debra advised that the rest of the Council was by appointment.

Brian Ketchum and family in France was interviewed by Terry Ketchum via Skype. Brian shared how God is working in the fields white unto harvest in France. Terry prayed for the Ketchum's, the mission field of France, and the lives being touched by God.

Debra introduced the morning speakers, retiring missionaries from Malawi and Mozambique Africa. They shared about their work in Africa. Whole Muslim villages coming to Christ, Mosques have become Churches. The Nazarenes started a church and work in refugee camps. David Rodes prayed for them, for the mission fields in Africa.

Debra introduced Rev. Larry Rounsley, pastor of Liberty Bible Church. His church has been transformed to love the people of Rwanda. On one trip, as people were pressing in on his vehicle, the Lord said, "Get out of the truck", so he did. Do we sit behind windows, or do we get out into the multitudes to share Gods love? Larry then read I John 3:17-18.

Rev. Tim Wheatley prayed to dismiss the morning session.

Wednesday Afternoon 1 PM

Worship was led by DeAnn Johnson and Cathy Freeby.

David Lugo interviewed and interpreted for a Peruvian missionary to Argentina via Skype. The missionary shared about a young Columbian who found Christ while studying at the University. He accepted a call to ministry, and studied at the Seminary in Ecuador. He ministered in the jungles of Peru, but has a call to go to Japan as missionary. He is currently studying the language in preparation. He shared about the 40/40 Extreme Nazarene that has been going strong in Peru and is extending to other South American fields. He shared that he is a 3rd generation Nazarene. David prayed for the missionary and his family, their mission field, and the many lives that are being transformed.

Debra introduced the speakers for the afternoon, who are from Montreal Canada, and are missionaries to a creative access country. The missionary shared his call to go minister for Christ. He had spent 5 years searching for peace, when someone shared salvation and peace through Jesus. The call to missionary work has been hard, but a blessing as well. C. NMI WAYS AND MEANS

We, your Committee on Ways and Means, submit the following recommendations for the year 2011-2012.

1. That every local NMI works enthusiastically with the Pastor in making sure the World Evangelism Fund is paid in full.
2. That the District Missionary Budget be \$2.65 per member
3. That all churches become 10% for Missions.
4. That all churches contribute to the Medical Plan. Funds shall be raised by:
 - a. placing names on the Memorial Roll by payment of \$50 for that purpose;
 - b. and/or presenting the Distinguished Services Award to a chosen person to be honored for service to the Kingdom of God by payment of \$100/person for that purpose;
 - c. receiving one or more offerings per year especially for the Medical Plan
 - d. and/or participating in "Gifts from the Heart" plan.
5. That the Christmas Gift Fund of 15 cents per active member be sent to the District NMI Treasurer **by September 1** so that our missionaries and families will receive it in time for Christmas (In order for each church to receive 10% credit, this money must be received by the District NMI Treasurer before **September 1.**)
6. That all LINKS moneys for designated LINKS families be sent to Global Treasury Services, Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184-3116.
7. That an amount of \$500 be allocated for our district president to cover her expenses in the work of this office, and that if she should exceed this amount, that she is reimbursed by the district treasurer from the Emergency Reserve Fund.
8. That token appreciation gifts be given as follows: District NMI President \$650; District NMI Treasurer \$400; District NMI Secretary \$300, Recording Secretary \$50; Pages at the District NMI Convention \$25 each.
9. That the District NMI cares for the expenses of the District NMI officers attending the district convention.
10. That a token appreciation gift of \$250 be given at Christmas to our active district missionary families; and that \$100 be given to the District Superintendent and the District NMI President.
11. That all churches support our missionaries by attendance, hospitality, and offerings on local deputation assignments. We urge continued generous giving in the deputation offerings. While not mandatory, the following guidelines are by the World Mission Division:

16. That, as new families become a part of the local church, a "*Holiness Today*" magazine subscription be presented to them.
17. That every local church pays the expenses of their president and delegates to the District Convention.
18. That every church pledges their support to the quadrennial theme: "**To Make Christlike Disciples in the Nations.**"
