## A. THE ROLE OF THE DISTRICT BOARD OF MINISTRY

The role of the District Board of Ministry is to combine the work of the former Ministerial Studies Board and Board of Credentials in order that we might improve the quality of our ministerial education. Our mission is to implement a competency-based curriculum which will emphasize the elements of Content, Competency, Character and Context as spelled out in the Sourcebook for Ministerial Development.

## C. STUDY REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

### *Eligibility*

The District Ministerial Studies Board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open to local ministers (*Manual*, par. 426.4) and licensed ministers pursuing elder or deacon ordination (*Manual*, pars. 427.1 and 428.1). Refer to the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* (latest edition) for specific requirements for each course of study.

### *How to Enroll in the Course of Study*

Persons wishing to enroll in the Course of Study (COS) need to have a letter requesting enrollment sent to the Board Ministerial Development secretary by their pastor. Current name and address are necessary to complete the enrollment process.

Transcripts must be sent to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Development so they may be evaluated as to placement in the Course of Study.

### *Modes of Study*

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts university or Nazarene Bible College and, if possible, Nazarene Theological Seminary. The modules for the Course of Study are also available on-line through Northwest Nazarene University and Nazarene Bible College and Washington Pacific Spanish CLT classes. Other educational options need to be reviewed by the District Board of Ministerial Development to ensure credit. If an applicant is not established in a pastorate and is reasonably unencumbered, it will do both him or her a great service if the board of his or her local church will insist insisting that the candidate be trained for the ministry in the church's educational institutions.

We understand that in the midst of ministry, education can demand a great deal of time and energy. We would emphasize that a 'call to minister' is a 'call to become a lifelong learner'.

### *Requirements of Modular Study*

A. Each candidate must become familiar with the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* before enrolling, in order to better understand the process and details of the entire program. We are recommending that each church purchase a *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* and make this available to prospective students. We also recommend that each pastor become familiar with Ministry

Internship so they will be able to mentor students in their own church. These books may be obtained from the Nazarene Publishing House.

- B. Paragraph 427.3 states that all applicants desiring to renew a district license ‘shall have completed at least two courses in a validated course of study’. It makes clear that if the student has not done so “the license may be renewed by the district assembly only upon submission of a written explanation for this failure. Such explanation shall be satisfactory to the District Ministerial Development Board and approved by the general superintendent presiding.” All modules should be in process by December 31, in order to apply on the current assembly year.
- C. College, seminary, and Bible college students are reminded to request the registrar to send notification of completed work so that accurate records of student progress can be made.
- D. College and seminary students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with the requirements of the course of study. The final transcript at graduation will be evaluated by the District Board of Ministerial Development.

#### *Mentor / Student Relationship*

Supervised field education is a key component of ministerial development. In most cases your local pastor will serve the mentor role. In situations where a district licensed minister is serving as pastor, a mentor will be selected by the District Board of Ministerial Development.

#### *Ordination: A Privilege, Not a Right*

While the Church of the Nazarene requires that certain educational preparation and certain ministry requirements be fulfilled before a person can be ordained, it is understood that completion of these requirements does not automatically qualify a candidate for ordination. The Board of Ministry will want to examine all spiritual, theological, personal and professional issues pertaining to a candidate’s fitness for ministry.

## IV. Daily Proceedings

### Assembly Opening Service, Sunday, April 12, 2015, 6:00 pm (Church For All Nations in Tacoma, WA)

The Washington Pacific District Assembly family gathered in the sanctuary of the Church For All Nations. Prelude music was offered graciously and beautifully by the Northwest Nazarene University Concert Band.

Accompanied by the NNU Concert Band, led by Dr. Casey Christopher, and led by the Tacoma Samoan worship team, the assembly sang an opening hymn, Come Thou Fount. In this way we expressed our heartfelt desire to see God and the Holy Spirit acutely present through all of our proceedings during this District Assembly.

The gathering was welcomed by District Superintendent Rev. Jerry Kester, who laid out a brief outline of the worship service that was about to take place. Committing our time to God, Rev. Kester offered an opening prayer to open this service.

The worship team from the Tacoma Samoan Church led the assembly in some fantastic and energy-filled musical worship. The assembly sang about lifting Jesus higher and about the blessed name of the Lord. We concluded our time of musical worship together with a song declaring the countless reasons we have for worshipping the Lord together.

Rev. Debra Voelker came to the platform to introduce our missionary speakers, Carlos and Robin Radi, missionaries since 1999. He offered his thanks to the assembly and to the earlier generations for their commitment to send a missionary to Buenos Aires to bring the Gospel to his grandparents. They reminded the assembly that Acts 1:8 says that we will receive power and be witnesses to the ends of the earth and shared how the Church of the Nazarene has been reaching out to the ends of the earth in Argentina through a Work & Witness team and Jesus Film Harvest Partners from the Washington Pacific District.

The assembly was led in singing offering ourselves to the worship of God and inviting God and the Spirit into our moments together. Following musical worship, the host pastor Rev. Bowers then took time to welcome the assembly and greet them in the name of Christ on behalf of the Mountain View Church. Dr. Graves took time to pray for Rev. Bowers and the Mountain View Church family as they grieve a recent accident in the life of their church family.

Rev. Debra Voelker came to the podium and welcomed Carlos and Robin Radi to the platform to share a bit of God's story about the work of the Kingdom and the unique culture in Argentina. Dr. Graves directed the assembly's attention toward the Board of Ministry's Partial reports 1-4 found on pages D-1&2. Dr. Graves drew particular attention to the list of candidates for ordination, as well as the list of people for whom we will recognize credentials. Motion to accept was made, seconded and passed by the assembly.

Rev. J. Scott Shaw announced and instituted the process of seating alternate delegates. Lead pastors who had alternate delegates were asked to stand and given alternate seating forms. Motion to seat valid alternate delegates was made, seconded and passed.

Rev. Debra Voelker was invited to platform to introduce Davide & Tanya Cantarella, missionaries to Russia. They reported on the grace and movement of God in their place of ministry. They shared the blessings of continuing to serve and the joys of starting a small family with their adoption of Lilly last year. They shared ways that the assembly can continue to pray for them over the course of the next year. Rev. Kester led the assembly in praying for the Cantarellas and their continuing ministry efforts in Russia.



Dr. Graves invited Rev. David Lafrenz to the platform to offer his report on the ministry of Nazarene Youth International (NYI). He directed the assembly's attention to page C-8 for his written report and spoke about the privilege it is to serve with the NYI council and some of the challenges of leadership over the course of the past year. He also spoke about the 81 students and leaders who will travel to Nazarene Youth Conference in Louisville, asking the assembly to pray passionately for the group that is going and for God's work to be done.

Dr. Graves welcomed to the podium Dr. David Alexander in order to offer a report about Northwest Nazarene University (NNU). Dr. Alexander introduced a video featuring kids, students and alumni who told a beautiful story of the impact Nazarene higher education. He then invited Dr. Fred Fullerton to the podium to introduce a video about PALCON on NNU's campus on June 27th-29th, 2016. He highlighted the university's decision to provide quality programming for elementary and middle school aged children. Dr. Graves reminded the assembly that a description of available workshops is in the assembly notebook, starting on page A-3. One modification was announced as one of our presenters was unable to come at the last minute. Business meetings were adjourned for lunch until Tuesday morning, April 14<sup>th</sup>, at 8.30am.

#### **Ordination Service, Monday, April 7, 2014, 7.00p**

The gathering was opened with a powerful rendition of the creedal song, We Believe, led by Brenden DuBois. Together the gathering celebrated the truths together.

District Superintendent Rev. Jerry Kester welcomed the gathering, including assembly delegates, ordination candidates, and others that gathered for worship to celebrate Jesus Christ. He then introduced and welcomed to the platform Dr. David Graves, General Superintendent.

Dr. Graves came to the platform and spoke some brief words about the meaning and significance of ordination and welcomed those that have gathered to share in this special celebration. He then led the gathering in an opening prayer.

Rev. Chuck Judd came to the platform in order to read Scripture, reading sections of Ephesians, chapter four.

Rev. Jerry Kester then asked retiring minister John & Marilyn Berggren, Lyle & Anna Coblentz, and Rick & Sue Skeen. The gathering rose to celebrate their service with a standing ovation. Each couple was presented with plaques from Dr. Graves representing their years of service and our love for each couple, celebrating their grace and faithfulness in ministry.

Rev. Kester then read the names of people who are receiving, for the first time, a district license. # V. Reports

## A. DISTRICT OFFICERS

### 1. District Superintendent

I always look forward to our annual gathering and the opportunity to celebrate the good things that are happening among us. Be encouraged by the commitment we have to each other and be challenged by the gospel mission that still lies before us. I asked every pastor to search for a passage of scripture that would be a focus for their local congregation for the coming year. I prayerfully sought for a text that could be a source of inspiration for us all. In Paul's prayer for the Ephesians in the opening chapter of his letter to them he says, "I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light, so that you can understand the confident hope he has given those he called. *You are* his holy people, his rich and glorious inheritance." Ephesians 1:18 – I want to share a message from this passage in our concluding service tomorrow afternoon at 3:00, but let me just say now, that as we think about the Church of the Nazarene in western Washington, we need be captured again by this confident hope for our collective calling.

### Things to Celebrate

For the second year in a row, we have expressed our commitment to the collective work of the church by giving more than 100% (101.8) of our portion of the World Evangelism Fund. This has been accomplished selflessly in every instance - sacrificially in many. I believe this generosity of spirit is one of the defining characteristics of who we are as WaPac Nazarenes. In every area of our connectional support for ministry we've shown an increase – 95.9% P & B, 93.5% NNU, 92.3% District.

Just a three years ago we were trying to reestablish our youth and children's camping programs. This last summer our biggest issue was trying to insure enough bed space and qualified counseling staff for all of the students that wanted to participate. The beautiful by-product of this accomplishment is a deep and growing connection between our youth and children's workers across the district. We are just beginning to see the creative fruit that will come from these friendships.

In the fall, men from around the district gathered for the first district men's retreat to happen on WaPac in many years. Todd Strong did a great job of organizing and Ned Floeter delivered challenging messages. The weekend was marked by a lot of laughter and good conversation as groups of men developed new connections. This fall's retreat is already on the calendar for September 18-20<sup>th</sup>.

Your delegate notebook is filled with stories of transformation and acts of compassion that only highlight all of the ministry that has taken place through our 85 churches and 14,005 members. You will be encouraged to read all of the scripture-based challenges that are contained in the reports of our pastors. Local churches baptized 390 and 537 officially joined the church of the Nazarene for the first time during this church year. We are blessed with a great group of leaders who have a commitment to making Christ- like disciples in western Washington.

In the fall, with the help and blessing of the Mountain View church, we launched a new congregation in Olympia. Pastors Brad Edgbert and Dean Jenkins have teamed up to lead Real Life Communities. In just a few short months the congregation is ministering to 31 every week and has already baptized 6. The total weekly attendance of the 5 churches we have planted in the last 3 years is 227. Our church planters have met nearly every month as a cohort and have encouraged each other in the work that God has called them too. Brandon Marten, our pastor from Battle Ground and district church plant coordinator, has given real leadership to this endeavor. Next Sunday, the Battle Ground church will bless Brandon and Bekah Marten and set them free to give undivided focus to developing leaders for new works on our district. Brandon's business allows him the freedom to devote thousands

of hours to ministry at no cost to the local church or district church. He is well trained and passionate about planting new churches; give him a few minutes and you will catch his passion for what God can do through the resources of our district. It is one thing to set goals, but a vision and strategy are taking shape and I can hardly wait to see all that God has in store for us.

It was encouraging to see the great support and warm spirit at our October Minister and Mates' Retreat with Dr. Scott Daniels and our Pastors' Day in January with Dr. Jeren Rowell. Rich teaching, inspirational messages and the presence of the Lord were obvious at these events. I love to see deep friendships developing between pastors and churches. In addition, Missional Zone leaders have facilitated cooperation and care among local churches in geographic clusters. These connections are an important part of intentionally working to prevent the discouragement that is common to isolation.

The district Board of Ministry continues to refine the process of qualification for ministry by improving our annual interviews of licensed ministers, encouraging those in the process through direct connection with a mentor and an annual weekend retreat provided in conjunction with the department of spiritual and leadership development at NNU. Each of our district licensed ministers participates in this ministry enhancing 3 day experience once in their process toward ordination. We are grateful for the assistance on the academic side of ministerial preparation we receive from NNU, Nazarene Bible College, Nazarene Theological Seminary and our on district multicultural learning center Kaleidoscope. Training of pastors for the ongoing development of local church ministries is central to our stated mission of "Establishing and Resourcing the Development of Healthy Churches."

With a heart for helping local churches find new tools to work through some of the complexities that hinder effective ministry, Dr. Lyle Pointer, from our Mount Vernon church has organized 4 different cohorts of Vibrant Church Renewal. One of them has been completed and 3 are currently in process. These 4-hour workshops held on Saturdays 4 times throughout the year are bearing fruit in local churches where pastors and lay leaders are thinking prayerfully and strategically about more effective ways to fulfill their mission. Vibrant Church Renewal is not a temporary district emphasis. Like church planting, it is being embedded deeply in our DNA. Every existing local church should count these Saturday summits among their assets for leadership and vision development.

I have been blessed by the ministry of prayer that has been coordinated by Dave Ness. At a recent prayer summit hosted by our North Seattle Church, we spent one entire morning focusing our prayer on each of our 85 churches, their pastors and leaders. We are asking that in every situation the blessing of the Lord might be experienced and local churches will be renewed and healthy.

### **Encouraging Developments**

Deep in the roots of what it means to be part of the over 100 year history of The Church of the Nazarene is concern that moves beyond pity to compassion. In almost every local church on the district there is some ministry of compassion that is being extended to members and neighbors in need. With a desire to pool our resources and experience, we are introducing this morning the creation of an umbrella organization for our district called, *Nazarene Compassionate Alliance/ Northwest*, NCA/Northwest is designed to connect our efforts and through shared experience, resources and strategic partnerships making us better able to meet the needs of our churches and communities. NCA/NW is hosting a one-day connecting point at the Kent Hillside Church on November 14<sup>th</sup>. This will be an opportunity to hear about and learn from ministries across our district that are making a difference in the lives of people in their communities. In your delegate notebook is a form where you can register your local church as an affiliate of NCA/Northwest.

If you've been reading WaPac E-Quips, you've noticed that a new women's ministry connection has been created. WoW – Women of WaPac is organizing to support and encourage women by connecting ministries of local congregations. This newly formed group is developing partnerships with



like-minded organizations to be better informed and prepared to respond to issues that especially affect women in western Washington, A retreat is planned for Oct. 1st-3rd, 2015 at the Heathman Lodge in Vancouver.

Just for the fun of it, we've reserved seats for WaPac Naz night at the Seattle Mariners on Friday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, when they are playing the Houston Astro's. You can get your group signed up and seats reserved by following the links at [wapacnaz.org](http://wapacnaz.org). The game that night ends with a fireworks display and it is an opportunity for great fun and fellowship.

### **Challenges Ahead of Us**

There are many reasons to be encouraged as we look around the district and see good ministries happening in churches of all different sizes - healthy churches come in many varieties and configurations. But when you compare our worship attendance to this time last year we are down by 86, or about one person per congregation. Truth is that we have declined in worship attendance every year for all 4 years that I have been your district leader; 124 the first year, 108 the second, 89 the third and 86 this year for a total of 407 or almost 5 people per congregation. If we had not planted 5 new churches in the last three years the total would be 620 people or 7.5 people per church. I suppose we could cite a number of surveys and studies to account for this decline. People are not attending church as regularly as they once did, there is a cultural shift away from church attendance. In our area, the fastest growing segment of our population are those who claim no religious affiliation; we have an aging demographic in many of our churches. The problem with reasons is that they can easily become justification for circumstances that should call for examination. Don't we all know five people who could be encouraged by the fellowship of a local church? Five people per church is the total of our 4 year decline.

So what shall we do? First, we need to acknowledge the effective ministry of a local church cannot be measured in worship attendance alone. Some churches that have difficulty drawing a crowd on Sunday may be highly effective in other forms of ministry. Sometimes a large crowd on Sunday can have little to do with discipleship. Perhaps our accountability structure and what we count needs some adjustment, but what we must NOT do is allow our reasons to become excuses and our lack of evaluation to become denial. We also must not abandon the vision of a worshipping community in exchange for a service organization. The question we must ask should be, is our influence for Jesus on the rise. Since we know that hand wringing is not a solution, let's individually and collectively pray that the Spirit will guide us. Scripture promises us that, "if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him." So we ask, "Lord we need your wisdom." In too many instances we are tempted to ask google before we ask God. Have you ever noticed that everyone with internet access and a keyboard is an expert in what's wrong with the church? If you collect these top 10 lists you are likely to find some helpful information and suggestions, but if you attempt to use them for strategic direction you will find yourself bipolar. Your local church has its own unique setting, culture and assets - be your best "YOU", because it almost never works to fight in someone else's armor.

I had a hard conversation at a Shari's restaurant in Bellingham a month ago. Six of the 10 remaining members of the Van Zandt church and I squeezed into a good sized booth to share a meal and to decide what to do about the future of the church. Two of them had attended the church their entire lives and for one of them her mother was part of the church as an infant 89 years ago when the church began. The building has neither running water nor sewer connection. Most of those around the table, out of loyalty have been driving in a good distance to keep the church going. Truthfully, we could not find a plan that made sense to pour more resources into that piece of property in that location. We took a few weeks to think and pray and then decide to discontinue Sunday worship. Next Sunday night we've planned a celebration of ministry - a time to thank God for all of the good that has been done in the last

nine decades. But, whatever else we call it, it is still a funeral and there is appropriate grief in this decision. I promised the people that we would use whatever assets are left at Van Zandt to plant a new church somewhere we think it could grow.

Next Sunday morning I will join Robin Hyde in organizing Key to Life, our new church plant that the Gig Harbor Church mothered on Key Peninsula. This **is** a cause for great celebration! A time to be born and a time to die is the nature of things and I know it. A time to be born and a time to die – but my favorite is a resurrection. My heart rejoiced with some amazing reports of Easter Services from some churches that have experienced amazing turn around in the last couple of years. I believe a resurrection is possible in your local church too.

So first, we pray and second, we take an honest inventory - in every case we care about the future of the churches we lead. Let's start simple – write the names of five people in your sphere of influence who either need to know the love of Christ or could benefit from the fellowship of the church. If you can't think of 5 you have likely identified a problem.

Recognizing that new churches are often the best way to reach people who have not yet connected to a church, we are pouring energy and resources into **establishing** new works. Three years ago we announced a goal of planting 20 new churches in 5 years - to date we have 5. You will hear more about our strategic vision to reach this goal when Brandon Marten shares with us tomorrow afternoon as part of our closing service.

We will continue resourcing our existing churches through the ongoing vibrant church renewal cohorts and the development of that training opportunity. Ministry development resources will also be made available for the expansion of this strategic endeavor.

Leadership development is essential to the **health** of our pastors and churches. Facilitating that growth is among our highest priorities. That is the reason that it is an expectation that every pastor will complete 20 hours of continuing education each year. These hours can be accomplished in a variety of ways, but providing opportunities is an intentional focus of WaPac leaders. For example, SDMI has put together some great afternoon workshops at this Assembly and is hosting The Willow Creek Global Ministry Summit August 6-7, at Hillside Church of the Nazarene in Kent. Identifying and equipping those that God is calling to lead our part of his church, is of first importance and at the heart of the work of our Board of Ministry.

We live in a time of rapid cultural change and the church finds itself on the fault line of that shift. In both cultural and theological areas we find ourselves being pushed and squeezed. As missionaries we are called to present the gospel in our culture and context - knowing what to change and deciding what shouldn't and can't is part of the complexity. I've always loved the way JB Phillips paraphrased Romans 12:2 reminding us not to "let the world around us squeeze us into its mold." More bold type and louder voices are not likely to make our case in western Washington - Strong and healthy churches are!

We have had a great group of leaders who work together to provide vision and leadership for all of the ministries of the district this year. I'm grateful to David Lafrenz and the NYI council, Tony Johnson and the SDMI council and Debra Voelker and the NMI council for all of the work all three of these leaders have done to create ministry opportunities and keep us focused on our mission. Appreciation goes to Julio Ortiz for leadership among our Latino churches and ministries and to Taulima Oge for the development and oversight of our Samoan Ministries. I am thankful for the advice and counsel of the District Advisory Board who have help guide and direct the decisions of the district. Scott Shaw, District Secretary, Steve Walden District Treasurer, and pastors Bill Bowers, Dave Ness, Ben Norris, David Rodes, along with lay leaders Randy Freeby, Dick Halvorson, Debbie Kuykendall, and Heidi Anderson. Jan Green has served us in a numerous ways, answering your questions, keeping the books and records, assisting boards and committees as well and assisting me with appointments and scheduling. We have deep appreciation for her 17 years of service to Washington Pacific District.

Sharon and I feel so blessed to have the opportunity to spend this season of our lives serving with you on this great district. WaPac is on the rise.

### **3. District Samoan Ministries Director**

I want to report that the Samoan Ministry is still strong and active and alive by the grace of God and power of the Holy Spirit. At this time we only have three strong active congregations. We do face struggles and trials of all kinds, yet in the midst of all these, we learn that God is still in control of His church as well as our lives. The following is a summary of where the Samoan Ministry is and where it is headed in the next five years on the WaPac District.

**VISION** - After weeks of prayer and fasting for God's direction for Samoan Ministries, our committee of Samoan ministers and laymen felt led and reminded by the Holy Spirit to remain true and faithful to the Great Commission of our Lord Jesus to, "Go make disciples of all nations." The Church Planting training serves as an encouragement and inspiration for us to move forward to advance Christ's kingdom through planting new churches.

**PLAN AND TIME LINE** - We are convinced that planting new churches is one of the greatest and effective ways to win people to Christ. For that purpose, we are committed to plant five new churches in the next five years targeting the unchurched Samoans in Pierce and King County. That is an average of one church every year, depending on availability of leadership. To properly prepare for this church planting program, we are now focusing on:

- A. Recruiting and training from within the USA and from abroad
- B. Identifying target areas for new churches; this includes Seattle, Puyallup, Normandy Park, Federal Way, Lacey and Vancouver
- C. Training people for evangelism outreach
- D. Recruiting and establishing relationship with sponsoring churches
- E. Secure the support and involvement of existing Samoan churches through prayer and outreach
- F. Obtaining the approval and prayerful support of our District Superintendent and Advisory Board

#### **PRAYER REQUESTS -**

- Outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Samoan leaders and existing Samoan churches; a fresh touch of the Holy Spirit to empower and encourage our people to carry out the divine commission to make Christ-like disciples of all nations.
- We desperately need leaders/pastors; men and women called and sent of God to His harvest field that our pastors would not only pray, but also include in their preaching program for the year, emphasizing God's call to full time ministry.
- We need Samoan instructors to train and develop prospects for full time ministry in our local extensions, especially those who have limited knowledge of English and those who cannot afford college.
- Pray for local church sponsorship, to provide necessary support and to guide the development of the new church until it's ready to be released to accomplish its purpose.

### **4. District NMI President**

The street we walked down outside Puerto Cortez, Honduras was typical of any street you would find in Central America. It was made of packed dirt bordered on each side by an open canal. The houses are elevated above the stagnant water with simple plywood floors. So typical. Yet the story of this neighborhood is a remarkable illustration of what happens when someone takes the church where it is not yet.

Seven years ago it was unsafe to walk down this very street even in daylight. The area was economically depressed, with low literacy rates, and high unemployment. There were no churches, or

schools in the area. Police protection was limited and the neighborhood was ruled by gangs. Many people lived in fear.

The transformation of this neighborhood began when God called Carlos and Carolina Gomez to leave their good paying jobs in Puerto Cortez and “take the church where it was not yet” – to this poverty, gang controlled neighborhood where people desperately needed to hear the message of hope.

The Gomez family started going out to this area every Sunday morning to share God’s Word with the children. This was their mission field and yet it was only a few miles from their home.

It was a challenge. Carlos found an old frame house that could be used for Sunday school. His family would go to the house early on Sunday morning to sweep out the tarantulas and scorpions so the children would not get bitten. And the children came. First 20, then 25. They heard the gospel and felt the love of the Gomez family. But the house was just not safe for the children, so Carlos found a small block house to rent. This became the beginning of Nueva Esperanza Church of the Nazarene (New Horizon Church). The numbers grew to 30, then 40 and then the mothers came bringing their children. Soon, the men in the community became interested in what was happening. The house was bursting with children and adults, something needed to be done! So the men in the congregation built a “galara” (a roof on poles with a wooden floor) in the yard. Now the whole community could hear the singing and the gospel and even more children came.

This was a church built on faith. The Gomez family relied on donations for the rent, gifts of food to feed the children and volunteers from the Puerto Cortez Central Nazarene Church. Their greatest need was for a permanent building for the new church. Donors responded and land was purchased a block away. A “Work & Witness” (W&W) team responded to the challenge to build a two-story building that would be used for church, Sunday school and a Christian elementary school for children that could not afford to attend a public school. One afternoon as the W&W team was working on the foundation; an armed gang member approached the group, lined them up against a wall and demanded their money and cameras. The neighbors watched as the police came and the North Americans left the work site. Would this be the end of the Nueva Esperanza Church? God says He will build His church and the gates of Hell cannot stop it!

The construction proceeded and the community saw God working. About 2 weeks later, this same gang member returned and approached Carlos to ask his forgiveness for robbing the team. Carlos shared the salvation message and the man accepted Christ. Sadly, several months later Carlos received word that this young man – once a gang member, now a member of the Kingdom, was killed in a traffic accident. But his eternity was transformed because the Gomez family took the church where it was not yet.

With the church and school growing the Gomez family realized they needed to be part of this community, so they sold their comfortable home in the city and moved into a home down the street from the new church building.

A year passed and Carlos had another dream from God. The community needed some place for the children and young teens to gather, to play basketball and have devotions. This would enable them to avoid the temptation to join with the gangs. W&W teams built a covered gym area. It also doubled as a sanctuary for the growing church. Basketball camps were held and the children and young people were hearing the gospel. The control of the gangs in the area was diminishing.

The presence of the Nueva Esperanza Church has changed this community. Today the gangs are no longer a problem. The community is taking pride in caring for their homes, helping one another and sending their children to school. It is now a safe community in which to live. Lives have been, and are continuing to be transformed because someone took the church where it was not yet.

Acts 1:8 tells us that we are to go *into Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth. God is telling us we have a mission – to take the church where it is not yet.*

*In the last few years our understanding of missions has changed. There was a time when we were simply concerned about spreading the gospel to the remote parts of the world. We are now realizing that the mission field is not always beyond oceans and over mountains, but has literally come to our doorsteps. Today Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria and the ends of the earth can all be within 5 miles from our churches, from our homes. Our mission field has come to us.*

A missional church understands that the central message of the Bible is not about rescuing us from the world, but rescuing us for the world. We are saved for His purpose! He is leading us not out of the world but to follow Him into the world- a world of bondage and brokenness.

*The Church of the Nazarene is blessed with a rich heritage that is more pertinent to today's struggles than we might imagine.*

In 1906, Phineas Bresee set the vision for early Nazarenes when he said, "our church is preeminently a missionary church. It knows no difference between home and foreign fields, in these days all fields are near." Those words are as relevant and true today as they were when they were first spoken.

Missions is not local or global, it is both. There is no difference between home and foreign fields, no difference between here or there. We have a mission – to go where we are not yet, no matter how near or far that destination may be.

*To be a missional church takes unwavering faith that God will provide the needed resources, it takes courage and creativity, it requires a new way of looking at our resources and it takes sacrifice. Sacrifice of our prayers, our time, our finances, and our calendars. It takes a willingness to see that we are all in this together – helping one another fulfill God's call on our lives for His Kingdom.*

NMI's purpose is to help mobilize the church for missions – for God's mission. It isn't simply to raise the World Evangelism Fund, or to read mission books. It's to help add structure to our passion of going where we are not yet. Its goal is to help keep the local church focused on missions. To do that, we must find new ways to minister to our world, whether that means crossing the ocean or crossing the street. We don't need programs. We need tools. We don't need methods or strategies, we need a Kingdom focus. And we can't do it alone - we need team work to fulfill God's mandate.

You've heard the story of the Nueva Esperanza Church of the Nazarene in Honduras, We heard from the Radis, and from Davide, and we'll here from the Pettit's in Dominica and Rob North in Africa how lives are being transformed when we take the church where it is not yet. God is on a mission. He's moving. He's doing a new thing – all around the world and in our neighborhoods. He has issued the invitation for us to join Him.

This past year by the sacrificial praying, sending and giving of the global Church of the Nazarene:

- We organized 609 new congregations. 506 of them were in the Eurasia alone.
- We gained 41,736 members (2.04 percent higher than the previous year).
- Our World Evangelism Fund and Mission Specials giving totaled \$73.2 million.
- And we commissioned 4 new missionary couples.

Here on the Washington Pacific District we believe in reaching the Pacific Northwest and the world for God. For the second year in a row our District World Evangelism Fund was paid in full and in fact was overpaid (Hurray!). We recorded giving at \$925,618.

There are so many ways we've put our faith into action:

- We built places of worship and preaching through our Alabaster giving of \$29,176 and \$75,151 to W&W. We are sending a team to Brazil to show the Jesus Film, play soccer and be Christ's love. Our people went to Honduras, Haiti, Ethiopia, Benin, Kenya, Madagascar, Romania, El Salvador ...and many other corners of the world.
- We improved the quality of life for children as we gave \$68,029 to Child Sponsorship.

- We supported our missionaries by giving \$223,723 through Missionary Health Care, Links, Deputation, Mission Corp, Missionary Christmas Fund and Field Specials.
- We gave \$147,789 to the Jesus Film.
- We helped our neighbors by providing \$10,657 for housing, transportation and medical needs of those impacted by the Oso Land Slide.
- And our children rose over \$4,048 for soccer balls & JESUS Film Equipment. This fall, the District W&W team will personally deliver these to help the church in Brazil go where it is not yet.

The gospel has come to us and we have a responsibility to live out its implications wherever we are – in this culture, in this time and wherever God sends us. We are all “sent” people with a calling to take the church where it is not yet. In doing so the world will be transformed - one person, one neighborhood, one community at a time. Only in heaven will we truly understand and see how God has forged every testimony, every new birth, and every miracle of grace into His Kingdom --- from here to the ends of the earth.

## **5. District SDMI Chair**

Four years ago when I was elected to be your District Sunday School Ministries and Discipleship Director. One phrase I heard from many of my colleagues was, “If you just do something, you’ll do great.” Well, over the past four years, the District SDMI team has worked diligently to “do something,” and to do it with excellence. It has been a fun adventure as we have focused on three main areas of concentration to assist local churches in nurturing Christ-like disciples in their local communities.

### ***Camps***

James Matthews and his great children’s camp team did it again as they pulled off another great week of ministry to the children of our district. It is amazing to think that four years ago, our district only had one district-wide camp with around fifty young ladies involved. In 2014, our district children’s camp had 212 children involved, along with forty-four adult ministering to them. Great job, team! We want to thank J.J. James from the Ridgefield Church for taking on the role of registrar for this camp, and the youth praise team from the Bethel Church for giving up a week of their summer to be used of God to lead our children in the worship of our God.

Pastors, if there is one way you could help our camps be effective in ministering to the children of our district along with getting children there, it is this: help us get qualified staff to camp and even consider being a staff person at camp as well. We had to use staff from Miracle Ranch to help us minister to our children, which increased the cost to our district for operating this camp. So pastors, if your church is sending children to camp, please consider investing in their journey in Christ by joining them as your presence at camp with them will deepen and enrich their journey as disciples more than anything else you could do.

And finally related to our SDMI’s ministry to children, I want to thank Linda Pasquale for serving as our District Children’s Bible Quizzing director. We had twelve churches involved this year with eighty-five children participating. It is exciting to hear that three new churches joined the ministry this year, and that two other churches are making plans to get involved this coming season. Whether you use the quizzing material for a children’s discipleship class or to participate in the four quiz meets, this is a great way to empower your church’s children to delve deep into the word of God so it can transform their hearts and minds.

Thanks to the work of Todd Strong, our district hosted our first “Man Camp” at Island Lake Camp. Ned Floeter from the Lakewood New Hope Church encouraged our men not just to survive in their

spiritual journey, but to thrive and excel in their relationship with God. Jonathan Meade from the Camas Church did a great job leading our men in worship. We had over seventy men participating in the event with about twenty churches from across the district joining. As I think about this event, two things stand out to me as to why this event and others like it are an important part of our District's mission of, "establishing and resourcing the development of healthy churches." Events like Man Camp give churches who are not able to put together such a quality event on their own an opportunity for their men to get away with other like-minded men for a time of spiritual direction and renewal which brings health to the church.

This leads to the second powerful aspect of these types of ministries: the building of cross-generational relationships. As I walked around during the retreat, I saw men of all ages from various churches spending time together, mentoring each other, pouring Jesus' love and God's word into each other's lives. This type of discipleship doesn't happen in a one-hour gathering on Sunday morning or Wednesday night. It requires time away together for such mentoring to happen. So, if you want to see to significant spiritual impact happen in the lives of those from your congregation, do what you can to get your men to the upcoming Man Camp this September, your women to the inaugural Women of WaPac (WoW) retreat this October in Vancouver, WA, and your Prime Timers to the upcoming retreat in the spring of 2016. Your church will be healthier for it.

### ***Convention/Assembly***

Your District SDMI team continues to work to provide the best opportunity for the local church leaders to be equipped, encouraged, and empowered for local disciple-making. Guided by Natural Church Developments' eight characteristics of a healthy congregation, and partnering with pastors from across the district and professors from Northwest Nazarene University, we seek to provide quality workshops which help your leaders become more confident in their ministry in your congregation. It is exciting to see workshops filled and people leaving encouraged because of their experiences at our District Assembly workshops. Thank you to all the workshop facilitators for your willingness to equip and empower people for ministry, and to Regina Lundgren for helping me create order out of the chaos.

### ***Coaching***

I read recently that it is the pastor's responsibility to develop their spiritual gifts to the zenith of their potential. Yet, many pastors and leaders can't take advantage of these opportunities because of distance, cost or bi-vocational jobs. This past year, your district SDMI team provided a free subscription for all the pastors on the district to Right Now Media's leadership video libraries. These video libraries give your pastor access to insights from many forward-thinking leaders and the best leadership conferences in our country, at no cost to your pastor or church. These video libraries are accessed online so you can train and equip your children, youth, other ministry leaders, and your church board members right there in your local church building or in your home. You can make sure your pastor is connected to Right Now Media by contacting me, Tony Johnson, so they might become a more encouraged and equipped leader.

In a continual effort to provide outstanding affordable, coaching opportunities for the pastors and leaders of our district, the District SDMI Team has partnered with the Willow Creek Association and the Kent Hillcrest Nazarene Church to establish the Kent Church as a satellite facility for the WCA Global Leadership Summit in August. The Global Leadership Summit brings together some of the best leaders in the world for two days of inspiration and leadership equipping. With this partnership, the pastors and leaders on our district who consider themselves "under-resourced" are able to receive a discounted registration fee of \$99 to this two-day leadership event. The district SDMI team is working to arrange discounted housing for those who will travel from a distance to attend, and the Kent church will have rooms available for teams to meet in to discuss the insights they have gained through this event. The Global Leadership Summit is a great leadership event your pastor and leaders cannot afford to miss, so



work to get as many people from your church to attend. And church leaders and pastors . . . whatever you do . . . do not allow your pastor to come alone or to only come with their spouse. Work to create ways for other leaders from your church to participate. If only your pastor comes, you will be robbing the leadership of your church of a valuable opportunity to be inspired and equipped for leading ministry in your local congregation and community.

### ***One Final Thought***

I have been challenged over this past year concerning my perspective of what discipleship looks like in the local church. Too often, we envisioned discipleship as the transfer of the information we know. That discipleship is seeing increased attendance at our events. That conformity to our behavioral pattern is discipleship. Truth be told, this is the creation of a religious church-goer and not necessarily a Christ-follower. Yet, in this process, we forget important aspects of discipleship. One aspect of discipleship we miss is that it happens best in relationship. Think of the teachers, bosses, mentors who impacted you most over the years. Think of all the things they taught you - shared with you - did with you. How would you describe the setting in which those lessons were taught: instructional, institutional; formal, relational? I would venture to say these mentors impacted your growth as a disciple most because of the relationship you held together. It is important to provide times for relationship and community to be formed so the roots of discipleship can grow deeper.

We can get so focused on transferring information we forget to address the questions they are wrestling with. We can get so focused on communicating truth, we miss their needs, their confusion, and their wonderings which need to be resolved before they can move forward in their faith. As we work to nurture disciples in our congregations, remember to create a space, an atmosphere where they can ask their questions for if we do not, then discipleship becomes about us showing off how much information we know instead of helping them work through their questions and wonderings that hinder their transformation.

As you work to develop your local congregation's plan for nurturing Christ-like disciples, remember that your District SDMI Team is here to help resource you for this process by answering questions and giving you encouragement for the journey. Remember to maximize the power of presence, of relationships, and of listening. Remember that as we engage them in relationship and create a place for honest conversation, we are better able to journey with them on the path of living a Christ-like life.

May God continue to bless your congregations' efforts as you work diligently at creating Christ-like disciples in your congregation, community, and in the nations!

It is my desire to journey with this great group of youth leaders, students, and staff that we call a district family. 2014-15 has been a good year for youth ministry on our district, mostly due to the people who invest in each other's lives. The more time we spend together, the more relationships grow and we become more effective at ministry.

It has been my privilege to work with a great NYI council this year as we dream of ways to create opportunities for God to be glorified through our youth. Our council was comprised of adult members Sherwin Rulloda, Ryan Stroud, Kelly McConnaughey, Todd MacDonald, Scott Davis, Eric McConnaughey, Claudia Miller, and Josh Stines. Student members included Jessica Rimer, Reece Wighaman, Matt Klippert, and Drew Goode. This year's council has been extremely helpful in stepping up and dealing with issues that arose throughout the year. Thank you all for a great year, for being willing to dream and plan!

I am proud to get to report to you about a great year of summer camping this past summer. Our camp theme was, "All things New." Eric & Kelly McConnaughey led the way for our Sr High camp while Sherwin Rulloda directed our Junior High camp. We had great speakers, worship, and fun at both camps, but the increased sense of community is the thing that I would highlight. Our attendance numbers this year were outstanding, especially at our Senior High camp where we had 254 students. Jr High was strong, but was behind on the attendance a bit at 155 students. Total attendance for both camps on the district for 2014 was 409 students. We are excited to watch camp continue to grow in the years to come and have been in conversation with Crista as to how they will help make that happen since our Senior High camp was 20 away from maximum capacity. Numbers tell part of the story of camp, but not the whole story by any means. God was calling students to camp this past year so that He could interact with their hearts. I know of many stories of students hearing and accepting God's call on their lives from this year's camp.

The last week of September we had our annual **Seattle Mission's Day** (now just Mission's Day). We felt led to change the event quite a bit this year. We went from one central location to two separate hubs, (a north and a south). The thought this year was to ask the students to pray and ask God to lead them to a specific area of service on their mission day. There were some good stories about places that God asked students to serve. I think that this event will continue to grow and change over the coming years. We want to have a culture of *service*, not just a once-a-year arranged event.

We have had some of our core youth pastors leave the district this year which has had a lot of impact on a few key events. We plan to reinvent ourselves over the coming year with a new focus at **Main Event**. I am excited about a reworked NYI convention, where we focus on youth leadership training. We have new leaders stepping up and plan to include our students more in direct leading of events.

The final area that I want to report on is the event that is the passion of my heart, **NYC – Nazarene Youth Conference**. This summer we have 81 students and adults heading to Louisville, KY for the "once-every-four-year" event; a gathering of over 6000. The theme this year is, "Thy Kingdom Come." The leadership team is putting together an amazing lineup of speakers and musicians to lead us into a life changing experience with Jesus. Some of the artists who will be performing are *Lecrae, For King and Country*, and *Rend Collective*. There are a couple ways that the local church can partner with those who get to go to Louisville. One way is to pray for the students and secondly, to participate in the "**Bring Along Project**." We have been asked to bring baby items to Louisville with us that we will distribute to those in need in the community. NYC changes lives and I know that this year will be no different.

My final thanks go to Enumclaw for giving me the time this position requires, to my students who sacrifice their youth pastor for the region, and to my family who make me so proud to be a part of them.

### **3. Education Committee**

The Trustees of Northwest Nazarene University are pleased to report that 2014-2015 was another strong year in the pursuit of NNU's mission of being "a transformative learning community expressing the love of Jesus by forming scholars, nurturing disciples, serving the church, shaping the culture and redeeming the world." As we celebrated many achievements on campus, we were pleased to renew President David Alexander's contract for an additional 4 years. Here are a few of the positives from this year.

**Strong Enrollment:** NNU was excited to announce a strong spring enrollment, with a six percent increase in traditional undergraduate students over spring of 2014, and a 96.9 fall-to-spring retention rate for all programs. Currently there are 1,297 degree-seeking undergraduate students and 690 graduate students. New opportunities continue to develop in our online programs and in the majors of engineering and nursing. With increased financial assistance available, there is a great need for Nazarene churches to emphasize to their youth that NNU is an affordable educational option. We are pleased that over the last couple of years we have seen a significant increase of applications from WaPac. We would encourage you to invite NNU Admissions Counselor, Jennifer Miller ([jenmiller@nnu.edu](mailto:jenmiller@nnu.edu)) to visit your church.

**Leah Peterson Learning Commons:** At the fall meeting of the Trustees we were able to celebrate the ribbon cutting of the new Leah Peterson Learning Commons. This facility which houses the John E. Riley Library, the J.A and Kathryn Albertson Foundation Atrium, the newly developed Doceo Center for Innovation in Teaching and Learning and the university coffee shop has become a popular gathering place for the campus community. Head counts show that there are seven times more people utilizing this facility each day than those who made their way into the old library.

**Spiritual Health of the Campus:** To step on NNU's campus is to be struck by a strong emphasis on the call to become a Christlike disciple. Led by our new chaplains, Dustin and Olivia Metcalf, this year's chapel services have focused on Jesus' words in the Sermon on the Mount. Opportunities are also provided for students to interact with a small group, participate in a mid-week student-led gathering known as 'Time Out' and engage in service.

**Wesley Center Activity:** The growth of the Wesley Center has provided pastors on our district with practical handles for growth. We have continued our partnership with NNU in the use of faculty and staff during our Ministerial Enhancement Weekend targeted at our district Ministers in Development. There are also lifelong learning opportunities being provided at \$29 a course (one week online) which can

be found at wesleycenter.nnu.edu. Through this site, pastors can also utilize the new "Clergy Life-Long Learning (CEU) Registry."

**Church/University Partnership:** Let's be reminded that there are three major ways that every church can support NNU. First of all we can pray. The challenges of providing education in our world have never been greater, and there is a need to lift the administration, faculty, staff and students to God. Let's pray for God's protection and blessing over the university. Second, we would encourage every church to support the university by paying their 2.25% of the Education shares. The University's Trustees Matching Award of \$350 per student is matched at 7:1 for all churches that pay their Educational Assignment (2.25%) in full. Finally, we can do our part to encourage students to consider NNU. Whether it be high school graduates or those seeking graduate degrees, our university is a great place to become equipped to make a difference for Christ within the world.

The Church Properties Board and the District Advisory Board, have taken action on the following church property issues and requests:

**Peninsula (Long Beach)** - Approved borrowing \$43,000 and refinancing the current debt of \$54,000 for a total debt of \$97,000 with Wesleyan Investment Foundation. The additional debt will be used to purchase land adjoining the current church property to the north.

2. In the light of the remarkable success and blessing presently being enjoyed by many of our churches involved in the ministry of Faith Promise, as well as the increased funds available to the cause of world evangelism, we heartily recommend that each church give prayerful consideration to the establishment of Faith Promise giving.

3. We recommend that the churches struggling with their Funding the Mission goals confer with the district superintendent. With concern for local church health and commitment to operating district ministries as efficiently and as economically as possible, the District Assembly Finance Committee recommends that the District Advisory Board review annual church finance reports, and to visit with any church regarding the equanimity of its report.

4. That members of the local church receive, at the discretion of the district superintendent, regular communication regarding the total district program of Funding the Mission.

**Insurance and Properties**

5. That the pastor give special attention to filing (a) the nonprofit corporation registration with the Secretary of State by the last day of your anniversary month (the month in which your church was incorporated), and (b) the tax exemption forms for the church and parsonage properties with the State Department of Revenue by March 31. (Notices are sent to each church by the State of Washington.) That the deadline due dates be printed in pastors' letters. That each new pastor be notified by letter from the district superintendent regarding these requirements. Also, that the district office keep on file (a) the federal ID tax number, (b) state property tax exemption number, and (c) the Labor and Industries account ID number for each church.

6. That each local church carry liability and malpractice insurance and that Labor and Industries insurance, as required by law, be carried for every pastor and paid employee. That each year the local church evaluate the adequacy of its property insurance and, if necessary, adjust to current replacement costs.

**Missional Vision**

7. That the local church consider, at appropriate times, the support the District Missional Vision through Funding the Mission and participation on assigned district Work and Witness projects. District mission's projects may count as 10% giving.

**Education**

8. That every church to pay its Education Share in full. For the 2015-2016 school year, Northwest Nazarene University will match all local church scholarships of \$350 per year as follows:

9. That each church supports the training of Nazarene ministers and missionaries by taking special offerings on:

**October 4, 2015** for Nazarene Bible College

**January 24, 2016** for Nazarene Theological Seminary.

And further, promote the distribution of God's Word through an offering for the American Bible Society on **December 13, 2015**. These funds may be sent through the district office.

**SDMI, NYI, and NMI Ministries**

10. That the financial support of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, Nazarene Youth International and Nazarene Missions International be cared for through district Funding the Mission.

11. Since the district director of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, the district NMI president, and the district NYI president are not salaried positions, we recommend that churches using their services pay their expenses.

**Ministerial Support**

12. That each church support the pastor and family in prayer and have concern for their ministry, and that the pastor's leadership be recognized and followed; that the pastor's salary be a preferred claim on the local church and be reviewed annually. In salary reviews, local professional positions of like responsibility should be considered, taking into account education, tenure and preparation. Further, those other benefits, such as Social Security and adequate health insurance, be provided for both pastor and other staff members and that the local church reimburses their pastor for professional expenses (auto expenses and depreciation, entertainment, conferences, continuing education, etc.).

That each church supports its pastor and pastoral staff in the establishment of tax-sheltered annuities. (Complete information is available from the Board of Pensions & Benefits in Kansas City and at [www.pbusa.org](http://www.pbusa.org).)

13. That the local church board provide for reimbursement of expenses incurred by ministerial staff in attending necessary conventions, district functions, education workshops, etc. That each church be encouraged to provide continuing education for the pastor, including a library allowance where possible. That an amount be set aside regularly, in a separate fund, to send the pastor and spouse to the General Assembly.

14. That each church, and the district, encourage pastoral renewal for its pastoral family through:

- a. regular use of at least one day each week for rest and relaxation;
- b. vacation time, given with full pay and with the church paying for pulpit supply, built around the pattern of:

- (1) two weeks for pastors who have served the denomination up to five years;
- (2) three weeks for pastors serving in the denomination from 6 to 15 years;
- (3) four weeks for pastors serving in the denomination more than 15 years;
- (4) Vacation is to be taken in the year earned unless prior approval is given by the church board.

- c. provisions for study and education of at least one week per year, apart from normal church functions (district assembly, etc.), paid by the local church and subject to prior church board approval with a subsequent report to the church board;
- d. camps, assemblies, conventions, etc. are considered as part of the pastor's responsibilities and not a portion of his vacation.
- e. In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor following each seven consecutive year of service in one congregation. It is strongly urged that the pastor's salary continue in full and that the church board provide for pulpit supply during the sabbatical period. (2013-2017 Manual 129.10).

15. That evangelists be compensated to provide an income adequate to cover the meeting being conducted, as well as consideration for interim periods of time lost due to travel and lags between meetings. In addition, all expenses incurred in holding a meeting (i.e. travel away from home costs) be provided.

16. We believe that adequately supporting ministerial personnel will help build the Kingdom and relieve personal pressures, thereby resulting in more effective leadership and direction. Therefore, it is recommended that a copy of this subsection be provided each church board secretary and read to each local church board early in the assembly year.

**Planned Giving**

17. That we encourage each church to invite a representative of the Church of the Nazarene Foundation for legacy giving resources.

18. That we adopt the giving plan adopted by the Board of General Superintendents and the General Board that asks each local church to give at least the following percentage of their income:

World Evangelism Fund	5.5%
Pensions & Benefits Share	2.25%
Education Share (NNU)	2.25%

19. That each church support the District Budget presented in paragraph No. 1 of this report.
