

On Sunday, October 11 we will gather after worship for a Chili Luncheon sponsored by the Presbyterian Women. We will also take a few moments to begin our conversation on the finances and responsibilities for the gifts we give back to God. In Deuteronomy 26 Moses tells us of God's desire: "When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all that fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time and say to him, 'Today I declare to the LORD your God that I have come into the land that the LORD swore to our ancestors to give us.' When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before that altar of the LORD your God, you shall make this response before the LORD your God: A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, we cried to the LORD, the God of our ancestors; the LORD heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first fruit of the ground that you, O LORD, have given me. You shall set it down before the LORD your God and bow down before the LORD your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the LORD your God has given to you and to your house. (Deut. 26: 1-11)

My own little garden has been very bountiful with beans and tomatoes that we have canned to enjoy until the next harvest comes in 2016. Each time we open a mason jar filled with tomatoes, we will remember the BLTs that were so amazing that we enjoyed as our dinner. We delight in the taste of green and wax beans that the seeds sown have given for us to share in our meals. While there were the days of weeding, watering, and sweat, we only consider the joy of the harvest around the table. My little garden provides just enough for my house-hold, but the gift is witness to how sufficient is God's care.

The time of harvest includes our financial offerings. We are asked to bring just a basket, **a tenth or TITHE off the top**, and give back to share with others the blessings that have come to each household.

As you consider your financial sharing within the dwelling of God we call Venice Presbyterian, we appreciate the many generous ways of giving within the church family. The realities of an aging congregation also brings us into focus of why it is imperative to tell the Story of Salvation and Grace to our neighbors (aliens among us) and our generations who are growing up within the Christian circle. Our giving is that witness of our complete understanding that in all we are, all we have, and all we strive for, **we belong to God**.

Our current income is \$1,000 to \$2,000 short of monthly projected budget needs. The Session has transferred \$18,000 from investments so far this year to cover and tithe from the funds above principle to sustain the budget. Expenses have been under budget and there is little room to cut except to begin cutting staff and programs.

We actively need your questions and ideas on how we most effectively and efficiently can be obedient to God within our giving of personal harvests. Current pledging units will receive a letter in the mail and pledge cards will be available after the presentation. A pledge is a projection, not a contract, of what you bring within your personal basket. This information is strictly confidential to our Financial Secretary, Kathy Mienheartt. The purpose is to assist the budget team, investment team and ultimately, our Session as we project a 2016 Venice Operating Budget.

We will also be communicating more effectively our financial position and decisions so we can truly celebrate and plant our seeds for 2016 together.

Congregational Survey

There were 41 completed surveys returned, and we have now compiled the results. The first question dealt with the qualities you feel are important in a pastor. There were 21 qualities listed, and we asked that you rate each one based on their importance with #1 being most important, #2 of medium importance and #3 for least important.

The second question dealt with our church's current strengths and weaknesses. 13 areas were listed, and you were asked to rate each one as either a current strength or weakness. While most people feel we have many strengths, there are a few areas that need to be addressed – primarily communication. We will be working on addressing these areas.

The third question was about what makes up a healthy congregation. There were 14 areas, and you were asked to determine whether or not you felt each was important. While many of the areas are seen as highly important, some of the highest ranking deal with youth (youth program, junior church, Vacation Bible School.)

The fourth question asked where you would like to see our church in five years. Outreach to fill membership and outreach/mission work rank the highest.

The following is a summary of all the results. These survey responses will be used by our church leadership and the Mission Study Team to move toward the pastoral nominating process and our church's future.
