"Steve to Steve"

As I launch into this series of essays related to Steve Harvey's best selling work, "Act Like a Lady; Think Like a Man," I must lay a framework for my motives and objectives. I have yet to write a book, so far be it for me to overly criticize one who has. These series of essays are being submitted merely to assist Believers in interpreting 'popular culture.' Often times, we read material that makes casual references to God or life or relationships, and we embrace it as "Truth." I simply want to help us to examine this work, in hopes of affirming the truths included, while also identifying the untruths. Additionally, I want to help us to develop our 'Christian Worldview.' If we profess and confess to be Believers, we simply cannot lav down our faith in order to remain *current* and/or cool. Our worldview is the lens that we filter all of life through, in order to gain God's perspective. It's both the burden and blessing of our high calling...

In the first section '*The Mind-Set of a Man*,' Mr. Harvey opens with a chapter on '*What Drives Men*.' Ladies, I'm sure as you read this first chapter, you were shocked to discover the simplicity of the male psyche. The chapter opens with the statement, "*Men are simple*." The language shifts to man's priority in establishing his self-worth and life-purpose. Even as I read, I examined my own life and how I relate to the women/woman in my life to discern if I fit this profile. I didn't! Manhood, for Mr. Harvey, includes the understanding of one's purpose, establishing of his title, and the acquisition of money. These issues must be processed before a man can even entertain a healthy relationship with a woman. I couldn't agree more with his assessment that men must discover their purpose; however, additional observations must be made.

Now ladies, this may be a generational issue, or simply a difference in philosophy about men, but most men do not have the luxury to put life on hold until life is figured out! In an effort to prove that men are simple, Mr. Harvey comes close to suggesting that we're slow! The standard for manhood must be raised to eliminate this stigma that a real man's worth/value is somehow connected to his wallet. This is what men are taught. Those who live by this faulty philosophy find that their lives are filled with frustration and emptiness.

Men must work. A man's work often complements the totality of who he is to his family and community. The challenge lies in men defining themselves outside of themselves. A real man understands that his purpose, being, and direction come

first from God. As a man seeks a meaningful relationship with His Creator through Jesus Christ, then he is able to embrace his vocation/profession. The focus must be internally before it can ever be professionally. In other words, what I do is not necessarily who I am. A real man understands the difference. A famous scripture states, "What does it profit a man to gain the whole world, but lose his soul?"

Pray for a man who has placed his soul in God's hands, first, as he discovers his purpose in life!

We will walk in defeat when we press the delete Jesus key and leave the *cursor* of fear (false evidence appearing real) and place human limitations on God. He is a mighty big God..."He's got the whole world in His hands." We need to shrink ourselves and our agendas and expand God in our lives to the big, faithful, powerful, *I am* GOD that He is. John the Baptist said, "He must increase, but I must decrease."

It takes God-sized faith to walk in victory. We will walk in victory when we press the insert Jesus key and leave the *cursor of faith;* the essence of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen," expand God in our lives and walk in the assurance and expectation of God's eternal hope.

"What Does Caring Look Like? Life Lessons from a Breast Cancer Survivor" **Annie Mercer**

The pain was almost unbearable. It seemed that every muscle and joint screamed in protest at what was happening inside my body. On this night, like many others, the discomfort that came as a result of the chemotherapy treatments sometimes felt more devastating than the impact of the disease itself. At one point in the night the pain was so unbearable I felt like giving up.

But by the grace of God, I made it through the night.

The next day brought the opportunity to start fresh. But it also brought words of immeasurable comfort. Rita made one of her routine phone calls to check on me.

Those words brought a deep sense of comfort to my heart. Why? Because the night before had been one of the most difficult nights I had experienced during my previous twelve months of treatment for breast cancer. It was so comforting to know that someone was so connected with my pain and personal struggle.

"Annie, I woke up in the middle of the night praying for you. How are you doing?"

It was clear the grace of God had carried me through the night. But it was equally clear God had heard and answered the prayers of one of His children on my behalf. Rita's prayers had not only gone before the throne of God but they had touched my heart. God had demonstrated His love in a powerful way, through a woman of faith like Rita, that He loved me. I sensed God's love because Rita took time to care.

CARING IS A CHOICE

This woman of faith not only prayed for me during a very challenging night in my life, but she also emailed a daily, personalized prayer from the Scripture to encourage me throughout the period of my chemotherapy and radiation treatments. Rita Smith has a special ministry that touches the lives of many people every week.

Who is this lady named Rita? A lady with such a powerful impact must be in full-time ministry. She must be paid to care. No. She is not in full-time vocational ministry. She is an ordinary lady with an incredible heart for God and sensitivity to the needs of people.

But that is what makes Rita's ministry so powerful- she is *just like* so many people who attend church regularly. She is a devoted wife and a mother of two children. She is like you and me. She is someone who has her own personal challenges and responsibilities, yet she has found the time to care for others.

CARING VALIDATES LOVE FOR GOD

Jesus illustrated the importance of showing care and concern for others when He answered the question of the lawyer astonished by His teaching in the 22nd chapter of the gospel of Matthew. The lawyer wanted to get an inside scoop on what God really considered important. So he asked the question-

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law? And He said to him, YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.' THIS IS THE GREAT AND FOREMOST COMMANDMENT. THE SECOND IS LIKE IT, YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF. ON THESE TWO COMMANDMENTS DEPEND THE WHOLE LAW AND THE PROPHETS."

Jesus' statement made it crystal clear- caring for your neighbor validates the sincerity of your love for God.

CARING IS SHOWN THROUGH TANGIBLE ACTION

I am sure you have your own personal testimonies of God's love through people but let me share a few of my personal opportunities to see God work through Christians who took caring seriously. These experiences are not only illustrations of how others have cared for my family; they can be instructive to us as we seek to care for others.



Give the Ministry of Presence. I will never forget the words of one of our dearest friends Vornadette when she learned of the initial surgery I had scheduled related to my breast cancer. Vornadette made a statement, by her actions, which demonstrated incredible love and concern for our family. "I am going to give up my trip to Israel so I can be there if you need me." We were overwhelmed with a sense of love and support.

She was there. Instead of taking a once in a lifetime trip to Israel, she was standing by caring for our children, and running errands. Her words were simple but her actions were profound. I learned from Vornadette's life that the gift of presence says, "I love you enough to give you one of my most precious possessions- my time."

Vornadette didn't have to give up a trip of a lifetime to show her support. She had shown her support over many years in big and small ways. And I am not suggesting that you have to make those kinds of sacrifices to prove your love to anyone.

God may simply want you to give up an evening of free time. Or maybe just an hour of your time to make a phone call expressing love and concern.

Step Outside of Your Comfort Zones. Caring can sometimes cramp your personal lifestyle. So what does it look like when someone steps outside of his or her comfort zone? During the initial months after my breast cancer surgery my husband commuted between Chicago and Dallas on a weekly basis while he served as a Vice President at Moody Bible Institute. During that time God used some very special men to serve my family. Jerry Haynes and Bill Jones demonstrated a willingness to step outside of their comfort zone on a regular basis for my family. For months, Bill consistently made the sacrifice of getting up out of his bed weekly, every Monday, in the early hours of the morning to carry my husband to the airport so I wouldn't have to do that during my chemotherapy sessions. Jerry was often out late every Friday night waiting outside of Terminal B at the airport to carry Larry home. These men left their beds early in the morning or late at night to show concern in a tangible, personal way.

I had the opportunity to watch these men serve the Lord in church for a number of years. But those men made the words of Philippians 2 come off the pages of Scripture and into my life on a regular basis as they placed the needs of my family over their own personal comfort time and time again.

"...Therefore if there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is an fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion, make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose. Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others..." Philippians 2:1-4

When I think of the consistent way these men stepped out of their comfort zone to serve my family, the word bondservants and the image of caring took on a whole new meaning.

Be Sensitive. Look for opportunities to turn ordinary moments into opportunities for ministry. It is easy to let life's challenges and concerns crowd out the time that it takes to make a phone call, write a card or pay a visit. So you have to ask God for eyes to see, ears to hear, and a heart that feels the pain of others.



Since my cancer diagnosis, calls, conversations, cards and visits have taken on new levels of meaning. They are literal lifelines for giving and receiving faith, hope, and love. They are the instruments God allows all of us to use when we take time to care.
