




How do you hang in there? How do you go on when you feel like giving up? What exactly is the correct measure? What are the appropriate steps that must be taken? We all have days when we would like to dig a hole, climb in, and pull in the dirt. There are times when it seems that all we can do is fall out of bed and lie on the floor until we recuperate. Sometimes our hurt is so bad, our dreams fall apart, and our hope fades. Life becomes a wearisome task of family problems, broken friendships, personal failures, or even health problems. All of these contribute to our discouragement; however, Psalm 46 reminds us that we can still hang in there.

We can hang in there because God is our refuge and our strength. As God shields us from life's turmoil, He renews us to handle the battle that is ahead. He gives us a shelter, not to pamper us, but to prepare us. Psalm 91 teaches that "He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, 'He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust." God is a very present help in the time of trouble. God is accessible to His children during life's agonizing moments. His help is immediately available to us during the many turning points of life.

We do not have to fear, though our personal worlds are shaken. We do not have to fear when we find ourselves seemingly drowning in life's turbulent waters. Although it appears to our eyes that the enemy has focused all his efforts on us, we do not have to fear. When everyone else is jumping out of the boat of life, Christians can remain in the boat because we know that God is in the midst of His people and we shall not be moved. While the world is being turned upside down, the believer is unmoved because God is with us in the midst of life's disruption.

The strength of the saint is rooted in the fact that God is nearer to you than your most trusted friend. He is closer to you than your dearest loved ones. He will come to your aid quicker than your closest ally. Psalm 46 teaches that God will help His children just at the break of dawn. Just maybe we have to go through the long night of sorrow and suffering, but the morning will come and when it does, it will bring help. Psalm 30 teaches that weeping may endure for a night, but joy will come in the morning. If you hold on and don't give up, before you know it and at the time when you least expect it, your morning will come. So hang in there!

For the past several years God has given me the privilege of ministering, serving, teaching, or should I say, speaking in many venues. In the future we will highlight what God is doing as I travel. Although I am invited to serve on a program, I receive so much from the people. Many of the churches and venues I have visited may be well-known and familiar to you, but I have also been blessed to visit many "unsung" places. Have you

visited Hitchcock, Texas? Hitchcock is a city in Galveston County, Texas with a population of just over 7,000 people. My youngest daughter Shenikwa, and I were invited there to be guest speakers at the Matthews Baptist Church where Rev. W.L. Randall, Jr. is the pastor.

As the driver entered the street where the church was located. I noticed a small building that was connected to a larger building that was connected to a beautiful, contemporary worship center. I learned that each of those buildings represented rites of passage for the church. When Rev. Randall became pastor there were 50 members and as the membership grew the facilities grew. The architecture was seamless as you went from one building to another. The oldest building is now renovated into classrooms; the second building is now a beautiful fellowship hall

or multi-purpose building equipped with a commercial kitchen and the present sanctuary seats 900 persons for each of their two services. The conference was well supported by the women's choirs Women's Conference at the Greater St. from the surrounding cities. Several women from area churches taught the Word while the women's choirs united in song to close out the conference.
