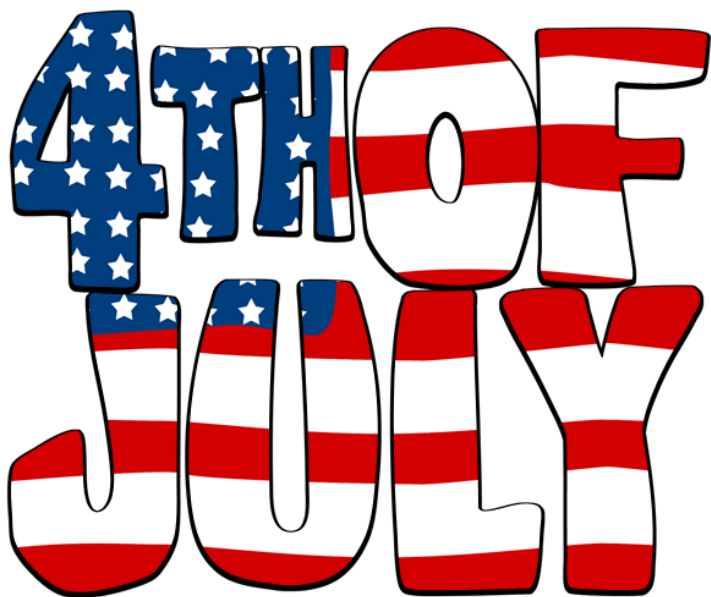

A Message from Pastor Matt

We will work side by side
We will work with each other
We will work side by side*

*And we'll guard each man's dignity and save each man's
pride*

*And they'll know we are Christians by our love, by our love
Yeah, they'll know we are Christians by our love, our love*

As I write this month's *Vine* article, I am serving as "Pastor of the Week" at Mar Lu Ridge (the church camp of the DE-MD & Metro DC Synods). This week the classic Christian song "They'll Know We are Christians By Our Love" has been sung many times by the campers, and for some it has become a favorite to sing. It has always been a favorite of mine both as a camper and as an adult volunteer, and I appreciate the reminder that the fundamental quality of being a follower of Christ is to be loving. As we often note as Christians, not love in a romantic or mushy kind of way, but love as expressed by its rendering in the Greek – *agape* love, which is a selfless, sacrificial love which sees the value and importance of the other person as being higher than oneself, and which is ultimately found in the sacrifice of Christ on the cross for the sake of world.

If love is absent from faith, something is fundamentally missing. As St. Paul writes, "if I have faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:2). St. Paul would also write in Galatians that, "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:28). Reminding us that with God there are not human, but that Christ has brought a level of equality and inclusion that transcends the differences that we know, and

makes us a diverse and wonderful family in Him. This is not a matter of political correctness, but an expression of the Church as it was intended, and can be. Like Prince of Peace's vision statement where "All are welcome", all are welcome in the Kingdom of God.

Because of that, I've always found the verse that sings "we'll guard each man's dignity and save each man's pride" being particularly stirring in "They'll Know We Are Christians by our Love." Particularly in an America and a culture that is so polarized and divisive. In many ways, people have forgotten how to "agree to disagree" and the attacks on others for who they are, or for different opinions, or for having a different conclusion on a difficult and complicated matter is troubling.

Christianity does not mean that everything is permissive, or that anything goes. It is not a "feel good" religion. However, it should never be a religion of hate. As God has loved us, so we should love others.

For as the song goes, that is how they will know we are followers of Christ. By our love.

Remember this my brothers and sisters in Christ. God wants to conform you to

Christ so that you can pass through the gate of the cross and access the “all things” God has determined to bless you with.

Your Social Ministry Committee is deeply and humbly grateful for the huge amount of support that our congregation gives to social causes – especially the issue of hunger right in our neighborhood. We continue to see the Food Pantry being stocked with groceries that you bring in (thanks for taking the “shopping list” with you to the store!) and donations of cash as well as Thrivent gift card money to help fill our shelves so we can provide much needed supplemental food for the people who come to our doors. Please continue to keep the Food Pantry in your thoughts and prayers all through the year. Remember, the Food Pantry is supported by your donations only (in-kind or money) and does not have a line item in our budget. That is why your food and cash or Thrivent gift cards are so important.

We are soon embarking on an extension of the Food Pantry to help five very needy Red House Run students directly every week during the school year. You will hear more at temple talks and in the bulletin, about how you can get involved. There will be a sign-up sheet for the food every month, and there will be a day when the food needs to be in

so the bags can be packed and taken to the school (the first one is August 22nd). People can sign up for as much or as little as you wish to bring in, so that many, even children, can participate. ORGAN RESTORATION UPDATE – as of May 31, we are 76.5% (\$72,863) towards our needed \$95,198. The physical work has been completed on the organ. Thanks to all who have supported the program to date, and for all those who will continue to support and finish the payments needed to retire the cost.
