A Message from Pastor Matt

In baptism our gracious heavenly Father frees us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Lutheran Baptism Liturgy)

So far this year, Prince of Peace has been blessed to have celebrated five baptisms, and as of the publishing of this month's *Vine* we are scheduled to have five more by the end of June. The baptisms have included children of various ages, as well as adults. Regardless of age, all baptisms are a celebration of a new life begun in Christ, with the promise of the Holy Spirit, forgiveness of sins, and the good news and hope of life eternal. In our understanding of this great moment, it is a gift from God, not determined by human action or decision, but by God's grace which is poured out through God's Son. As Jesus says in John's Gospel, "You did not choose Me, but I chose you" (John 15:16).

And so baptism, which is celebrated as a sacrament in many Christian traditions, including Lutheranism, is the celebration of God's choosing us as God's own. It links us to Christ's death and resurrection, and through that we gain hope of our own resurrection. Made children of God, and members of the Body of Christ (which is the Church), we are called to a new life. A life that not only begins in the world to come (i.e. heaven), but one that begins now as we endeavor to share and provide a glimmer of that world to the world around us. As such, reflecting on the actions of God in Christ, it is a life marked by kindness, compassion, mercy, forgiveness, and inclusivity. All of the miracles and teachings of Jesus point towards the life that we are called to share as we are enabled by God through the Holy Spirit. A tall order considering the width and breadth of God's love and mercy, but one that brings with it the joy in being a bearer of God's hope and peace to a world that very often is in need of healing and restoration.

Every baptism that we celebrate and witness as a Church is the joining of another person into this life and work of God. And it is an invitation for us to remember and reconfirm our own baptismal covenant and commitment to God. As we continue to celebrate and mark this “season of baptisms” at Prince of Peace, may we be mindful of the joy and good news of our own baptisms and our own life with God.

Dear members of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church,

This month, our Shelter Manager Otis Trawally got to do one his favorite things: he helped a client move into his new home. What a time to celebrate! We at Streets of Hope thrive on these moments where a good relationship produces these kinds of results. Our friend found this opportunity because he stayed in our shelter—and during his stay he grew close to our staff and volunteers in what some guests have called an “almost family” environment.

We would like to thank Zion UCC for providing their space for over three years, but sadly, we will likely be unable to open our shelter in their facility for the 2017-18 season. Baltimore County codes require us to search for other options to host us from November through April. To find that space, we need your help.

Our board has several options to investigate, including:

- Sharing the shelter between 3 churches for 2 months each; or 5-6 churches for 1 month each
- Finding a new church/facility that meets code requirements to host for the whole 6 months
- Leasing to buy a facility in the area that meets code requirements

A building must include:

- Space to set up 16 cots
- Bathrooms
- A working kitchen (commercial not required)
- All utility hookups

Any facility with showers is a plus. To host a shelter according to code, the building must have a sprinkler system, have appropriate fire exits, and/or have entryways directly at ground level (no stairs or ramps required to enter). We may as in the past, however, be

able to run the shelter for shorter periods of time in different churches as we are an emergency cold weather shelter.

Would your church be interested in hosting for a short period of time? Do you have information on facilities we could use? In-kind use is preferred, but we are preparing for a lease-to-buy situation should it be necessary. Please contact me with any questions or concerns at director@churchesforsoh.org or at 443-764-4249.

Thank you for all that you do to support this local ministry—your members provide so much time and treasure to care for the men we serve, and we want to make sure they can continue to have that option next season.

We have so much great news for May!!! Our team and Pastor Matt were invited to the Del-Md. Ministry Service Awards Banquet at King Chapel Auditorium, Carroll Lutheran Village in Westminster, Md. 4 pm – 7 pm on April 30th to receive the award. Carolyn Wagner, Rob Wagner, and Pastor Matt attended from Prince of Peace, with Robin Darago from Red House Run. We are truly honored! Please look for this award in our church soon.

Also, more fantastic news!!! Our Food Pantry has started a partnership with the Baltimore County Dept. of Aging. Barbara Wilt, from Dept. of Aging brought the volunteer, Dave Goodwin, to meet the folks associated with our Food Pantry. Prince of Peace Food Pantry will be making bags for Rosedale **seniors**, and Dave will pick up monthly and distribute 4 bags to **senior** residents at Parkview Apartments, all in units on Chesaco Ave. He will come the third Wednesday of each month, so we can have the extra bags made.
