A Message from Pastor Matt

In baptism our graciously heavenly Father frees us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; by water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God and made members of the Church, the body of Christ. Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith, love and obedience to the will of God.

(from Lutheran Baptism Liturgy)

This past month, and for the next couple of months to come, Prince of Peace is blessed to celebrate the baptism of nine individuals. Some are children, some are adults. But all are welcomed into God's family and made part of God's Church through God's grace. As the introduction to the baptism service states, "we are born children of a fallen humanity" (we are not perfect, and we have sinned, and thus are sinners) but "by water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God" (and so by God's choice and love we are made saints and given the promise of life). Using language both of St. Paul and Martin Luther, we are adopted into God's family and made brothers and sisters. Focusing on the nature of God's unconditional grace, this gift is offered to all people regardless of age, nationality, gender, socio-economic group, or whatever human divisions separate us. It is God that baptizes, and it is the human which then receives and lives out that gift in their life.

But as the words of the liturgy remind us, this is best done together in community. "Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith, love and obedience to the will of God." While God meets us wherever God chooses, it is clear from scripture, tradition, and experience, that our spiritual life as Christians (i.e., followers of Christ), is best expressed in community. Another way to think about it is

that Christianity is not a solo sport, but has team dynamics. And so the promises that are made at a traditional baptism service include the promise of God to the baptized, the promise(s) of the baptized or their sponsors to God, and, not unimportant, the promise of the community of faith to the baptized. The promise that the people of God make is to support the baptized and pray for them in their new life in Christ, to which the congregation affirms, “we [will].” This promise is lived out practically in all the ministries and programs that the congregation offers, and the personal connection in the baptized’s life. And as we do so, we live out our own baptismal promise of service to God and to God’s people.

With the opportunity to witness and participate in so many baptisms during the coming months, I encourage all to take the time to think and pray about the promises and words that are shared during the services, and to give thanks to God for what they mean for those being baptized, and for us all. And to think about new ways that we may live out the promises that are made.

There are several stories that he shares with his readers that he has been in the same situation that the people he writes about. Throughout the Christmas season we prepare ourselves for the coming of the Christ child, during the Lenten season we prepare ourselves awaiting the resurrection of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Christmas time we decorate the Church with poinsettia’s that are red in color that beautify the sanctuary. Easter time we decorate the sanctuary with lilies that are pure in white, expressing the holiness of Jesus’s resurrection to all Christians. Do we purchase the first tree we see at Christmas, no and we don’t purchase the first lily we see. God made all of us for a purpose. When we purchase a tree or a lily we make the payment, so did God when He gave us His only Son on the cross. We don’t know why the cross is often called a tree.

Somewhere on the timeline between the Tree of Knowledge in the garden and the Tree of Life in heaven is the Tree of Sacrifice near Jerusalem. Jesus endured what we should have as sinners but He paid the price to save us. In the manger God loves you; through the cross God saves you. He hasn’t called you home yet because, He wants the world to see what God can do with His purchased possession. Just like the Christmas tree, He trims and cleans the branches that produces fruit so that it will produce even more fruit. At Christmas time we receive gifts, at Easter we receive the gift of salvation.

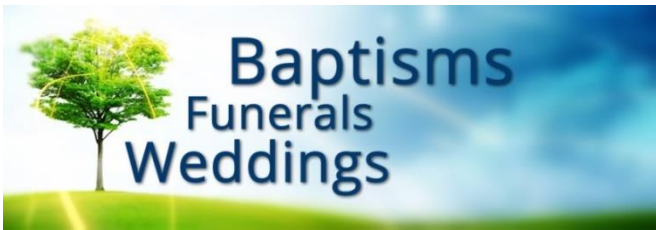
